#### Letter from our Rector, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

One of the many privileges of ministering here in the Chew Valley is being able to attend our Church Schools and, in turn, welcome children and staff from our schools into their churches. Recently, children from Winford and Chew Stoke Church Schools attended their parish churches to thank God for the gifts of Harvest and to leave Foodbank donations to be distributed to those in need.

These services are always colourful, vibrant and uplifting occasions. Soon children and staff will be returning for their Christmas services and will be back again on several occasions in spring and summer next year. In the meantime, Revd Fran and I enjoy leading worship in our schools each week and always look forward to welcoming the youngest Reception-class children for a special visit when they get to ask the Rector lots of difficult questions.

In my time here I have been asked lots of questions by our youngest children. One of my favourites followed an explanation of what the Font is, and how we use it to hold water for Holy Baptism. A young boy raised his hand and asked, 'Does it have a plughole?'. Good question (it does!).

Recently I was asked by a five-year-old whether we should pray to God, or Jesus, or both. That's the sort of deep question that really stops me in my tracks. In one of his most profound teachings, Jesus told us that we have no hope of receiving the gift of the Kingdom of God unless we do so like a child (Mark 10:15). What could he mean? Jesus loved children and held them in his arms as examples of humility, love, simple obedience and trust. These are the qualities that Jesus wants to see in those who follow him—young and old.

It also means we shouldn't be afraid to ask lots of good questions about our faith. If you're stuck, ask a child for suggestions! Yours in Christ,

It has been a very busy start to the academic year at Chew Stoke Church School.

Earlier this term Mr Hewett (Headteacher), Miss Hennessy and the PE Council attended the <u>Team Modeshift</u> Stars School of the Region event. We can proudly announce that, for the fourth year running, Chew Stoke Church School has won both the Local Authority and the South West Region School of the Year Awards for our commitment to promoting sustainable and active travel, especially for journeys to and from school. There are over 1,000 schools nationally who hold accreditations with Modeshift Stars and only a handful are put forward for these awards. It is an amazing achievement! We will now



progress to the National Awards which will take place in London in March.



The school had a wonderful start to the academic year with a Harvest Celebration at St Andrews Church. Led by the Reverend Ian and the Reverend Fran, our students took turns sharing readings, poems, and songs, creating a truly special service. **Speeding in the village** At the meeting we concluded that there are 3 main speeding issues: chronic speeding; acute issues of very high speeds; and incidents of the anti-social behaviour such as bikes using the road at Herons Green as a race track and consequent danger and noise disturbance. The latter issue has been reported repeatedly to Avon &Somerset (A&S) Police, and to the local MP Dan Norris.

CSPC discussed the possible options for autospeedwatch cameras/other solutions. CSPC agreed that it was necessary to acquire data from A&S Police to be able to evidence the problem. CSPC are also supportive of a pavement from Stoke Hill to Woodford Lodge, this has been considered before (last time in 2022). Actions agreed:

To Set up a working group to move proposals forward – including one member of CSPC To liaise with Highways at B&NES at an early opportunity, they are responsible for roads and hold the budget.

The working group to consider costings and funding opportunities (crowd funding, increasing precept, grants (eg Bristol Airport due to increase in traffic because of airport expansion).

The working group to devise a method of recording incidents and to ensure these are reported to A&S Police.

To review the Community Speedwatch group being reinstated in the village.

To work with Councillor Harding to acquire speeding data, and consider grant from Ward Councillor Empowerment Fund for technology if that will help.

Bristol Road 'crossing' proposal – CSPC reviewed the latest proposals from B&NES Highways team regarding a modified 'crossing' on Bristol Road. Residents are encouraged to contact CSPC if they have any questions or concerns about the proposals which may be confirmed soon (details are available from the Clerk if needed). Work to be completed this financial year. CSPC noted that a crossing had been requested by residents and supported by the Ward Councillor on their behalf. However, it is not possible to have any type of crossing or raised road surface without street lights and CSPC also received feedback that villagers do not want lighting in the village as it interferes with dark sky policy and impacts our rural setting. The latest proposal from B&NES includes a buff-coloured area of road at the Quarry Hay junction. The corners of Quarry Hay will be built out slightly to make the crossing distance across Bristol Road shorter. Bollards to be installed along the Quarry Hay side of Bristol Road from The Stoke Inn to Rectory Field to prevent pavement parking as it impedes the sight lines for anyone trying to cross the road. B&NES have confirmed it is not possible to have a crossing at the current crossing point of choice (Bilbie Road footpath & shop - to Quarry Hay & Primary School) because it would be too close to the narrow section of road. Finally, the original proposed location by B&NES south of Quarry Hay would have meant it would not be used as it was too far South compared to the natural crossing point to / from the school and the shop by Quarry Hay. Ward Councillors report: NPPF and Local Plan - BANES proposed extra allocation of housing being opposed by Council. 80% of extra housing needed in Bath is affordable homes - therefore needs funding. 




