

Letter from our Vicar, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

I want to share some thoughts about daffodils. At this time of year, they are abundant. They brighten our gardens, fields and hedgerows in this beautiful part of the world. For many of us, they signal that winter is coming to an end, and sunnier, more colour-filled days lie ahead.

Seen against a clear, blue spring sky, the bright yellow of the daffodil looks striking. Of course, we have seen these colours—yellow and blue—in the news recently as we have tried to come to terms with the horrific events in Ukraine. They are the colours of the Ukrainian flag—colours which have become a symbol of courage in the face of terror, and hope in the face of uncertainty.

We have seen an amazing, heart-warming local response to the war in Ukraine. As well as praying for the people of Ukraine and for peace during our services in church, we have seen a tremendous outpouring of community spirit in the lorry-loads of essential supplies which have been collected at St Katharine's, Felton and St Andrew's, Chew Stoke. An incredible quantity of medicines, toiletries, clothing and bedding was donated, and is now being distributed to those in need thanks to the efforts of our communities.

Here you will find helpful ideas about how to get involved in helping with the unfolding humanitarian crisis, including information on how you might participate in welcoming a Ukrainian family to live in your community if you feel able to do so.

Daffodils remind me of something else, too. In church, we are coming to the end of our journey through the season known as Lent. It is a solemn time when we try to be disciplined so we might grow in faith. It is a season which prepares us for the great festival of Faster in a few weeks' time.

When you next see a daffodil, look behind the bright yellow flower in search of a brown leaf attached to the stem. This part of the flower is dead. During the winter, this part of the flower has pushed its way through the dark, frozen soil so that it might bloom in due course. This outer part of the flower has sacrificed itself by allowing the flower to survive through the darkness of winter so that the brightness of the flower might blossom in spring.

Jesus has done the same for us by sacrificing himself on the cross. Good Friday reminds us of the darkness of this world, with all its injustice and violence. But Easter reminds us of the hope of new life that we have through Jesus.

May the brightness of the daffodil remind you of that new life and hope which Jesus won for us.





<u>Village Hall lease</u>— the PC is awaiting confirmation from the solicitors as to whether it is required to make the hall a Charitable Trust prior to taking on the lease.

<u>Westaway field update</u> — following the results that the soil quality is 3a, the PC discussed whether the use of the fields for a solar farm should still be considered. Bath and West Community Energy (BWCE) are still keen to hold an open day to discuss with residents. CSPC had resolved not to pursue this option at the December meeting, and whilst councillors are very keen to see an increase in solar farms, they agreed that this field is not appropriate at this time, and it should continue to be used for agricultural use. Agreed to revisit the decision in a years time when the subject of food vs energy security will be clearer. The PC remain very keen to find another site within the parish for solar power if possible and talks are ongoing with Bristol Water and BWCE.

Following the results of the <u>Bristol Airport expansion appeal</u>, the Parish Councils Airport Association (PCAA) have confirmed that they won't challenge the decision alone. Bristol Airport Action Network (BAAN) however have decided they will challenge the decision and are seeking a Judicial Review on a number of points of law. The estimated cost of this is approximately £50K. The PC agreed to let residents know that the BAAN are looking for help with funding should residents wish to contribute.

<u>Complaints of speeding in Bilbie Road</u> – residents have reported incidents of speeding along the road, despite it being a no though route. As children play and ride bikes in the area, there is concern about their safety. Agreed to contact the local PCSO for advice.

<u>Jubilee celebrations</u> – a local resident has offered the use of his land above the lake for a village party on June 4th during the afternoon and evening. The teepees and all other facilities are in situ, there is capacity for up to about 500 people. Cllr Baker is pursuing this option with other groups in the village.

<u>Chew Valley Recreational Trail</u> – The intention is that the trail will open in April with a formal opening in mid May. The overseeing organisation are keen to see how well the trail is used before the busy Easter period. Regarding the access to the trail from Woodford lane, Bristol Water have informed us that they won't oppose access. The large mound of mud would need to be resolved by it being removed from the top of the path. The management group are also looking for village reps from Chew Stoke, Bishop Sutton and Chew Magna.

<u>Rectory Field update</u> – the trees with ash dieback are currently being felled, some trunks and branches are to be left for natural play equipment. A replanting plan is being drawn up with a small orchard towards the top of the field and a tree nursery down at the bottom in the corner beside the stream and the gate to Bristol Rd, this would be run by a small organisation, only requiring 4 by 6 metres of space.

<u>The Speed Indicator Device</u> on Stoke Hill has been reported to B&NES via Fixmystreet. It was turned off by B&NES when the speed limit was reduced to 20mph, a request has been sent asking for a new 20mph indicator be installed.
