From the Rector

Dear Friends,

I want to share some thoughts about daffodils. At this time of year, they are abundant. They brighten our gardens, fields and hedgerows in this beautiful part of the world. For many of us, they signal that winter is coming to an end, and sunnier, more colour-filled days lie ahead.

Seen against a clear, blue spring sky, the bright yellow of the daffodil looks striking. Of course, we have seen these colours—yellow and blue—in the news recently as we have tried to come to terms with the horrific events in Ukraine. They are the colours of the Ukrainian flag—colours which have become a symbol of courage in the face of terror, and hope in the face of uncertainty.

We have seen an amazing, heart-warming local response to the war in Ukraine. As well as praying for the people of Ukraine and for peace during our services in church, we have seen a tremendous outpouring of community spirit in the lorry-loads of essential supplies which have been collected at St Katharine's, Felton and St Andrew's, Chew Stoke. An incredible quantity of medicines, toiletries, clothing and bedding was donated, and is now being distributed to those in need thanks to the efforts of our communities.

Here you will find helpful ideas about how to get involved in helping with the unfolding humanitarian crisis, including information on how you might participate in welcoming a Ukrainian family to live in your community if you feel able to do so.

Daffodils remind me of something else, too. In church, we are coming to the end of our journey through the season known as Lent. It is a solemn time when we try to be disciplined so we might grow in faith. It is a season which prepares us for the great festival of Easter in a few weeks' time.

When you next see a daffodil, look behind the bright yellow flower in search of a brown leaf attached to the stem. This part of the flower is dead. During the winter, this part of the flower has pushed its way through the dark, frozen soil so that it might bloom in due course. This outer part of the flower has sacrificed itself by allowing the flower to survive through the darkness of winter so that the brightness of the flower might blossom in spring.

Jesus has done the same for us by sacrificing himself on the cross. Good Friday reminds us of the darkness of this world, with all its injustice and violence. But Easter reminds us of the hope of new life that we have through Jesus.

May the brightness of the daffodil remind you of that new life and hope which Jesus won for us.

Hope in a Turbulent World

I write this on Ash Wednesday, a day when we begin a period of reflection and penitence, and remember our mortality.

Those of us receiving the ash crosses on our foreheads today will hear these words: 'Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return...'

Faced with our death we consider how we might live. Are there things we need to change? What might we need to seek forgiveness for and from whom? '...Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ' are the words which follow the ash.

Our Archbishops and the Pope have invited us to set this particular Ash Wednesday aside to pray for peace in Ukraine. It would be easy for us to point the finger at those we hold responsible for such atrocity against brothers and sisters. And yet we need to recognise that all of us carry responsibility for our own failures to live as peacemakers and reconcilers. Not one of us is perfect and Lent offers us an opportunity for honest realism and a chance to repent and seek forgiveness.

As you read this letter we will be approaching the end of Lent, and Easter will be in sight. Much will have happened in the world since I wrote it. Two years ago, I was praying for the world caught up in the early throes of a pandemic and lockdown. Who could have known that we would still be living with the virus and how much life would have changed for us? Today I am joining in the prayer and fasting for countries at war. Where will we be as we enter Holy week and approach Easter? What might be the outcome for Ukraine, Russia, ourselves?

And yet, that is the very heart of faith. We do not know what the future holds but we do know the One who holds us. The fact is that God so loved the world that when He sees us in our greatest need, at our most threatened, fragile, He comes to be with us. To share the pain and give Himself fully, even to the point of death. And the story of Easter tells us that death is not the end. That life is found through the death of the Saviour.

I don't know what your experience of these last couple of years has been. What deaths you might have faced. I expect many of us carry the scars and wounds of loss. Pain and death are not things we can avoid. And neither did Christ. The hope He offers us is that they are not the end of the story but rather the beginning. Hope can be ignited and life restored through the faithful following in the footsteps of the One who loves us.

It does not mean that all will be wonderful and our journey smooth. It won't stop wars from taking place or people from hurting one another. But it does mean that hope, forgiveness and new starts can be found as we look to follow Christ's example.

Winford Community Shop

The shop continues to be busy with the Royal Mail "Local Collect" service for internet shopping becoming more popular. This provides income for our post office, cuts down pollution and congestion and can save you time and money, so why not give it a try! We also have our locally sourced spring bedding plants now in stock and our greetings card range continually changes to reflect the seasons, such as Easter.

The shop recently became an ad hoc collection point for the Church's great donations to Ukraine and shop volunteers and others transported collected items down to St Katharine's, Felton.

Recently we have suffered crime. In December the front door, windows and defibrillator box were damaged in an abortive burglary with repairs costing around £60. The culprits going on to demolish the hairdresser's front doors at the same time.

On Sunday 27/02, at approx. 22.30, thieves gained access to the shop by damaging a side door, stole less than £100, but caused about £500 worth of damage in the process. Due to the high level of Post Office Security and the tenant living above the shop, the police and our Chairman arrived in minutes, but to date the crime is unsolved and we are working with our Landlady to increase our already high levels of security.

Despite these setbacks we are committed to continue providing these vital local services and welcome any volunteers or help in any areas. On behalf of the shop committee. **Simon Martin**

Winford Parish Council Meeting - Monday 21 February 2022

Open Forum: Two members of the public raised further objections to planning application 21/P/3412/FUL, 3 Dial Lane, Felton, BS40 9YD. Later on the agenda, the Parish Council agreed to object to this application. The residents were advised that any concerns about existing developments should be directed to planning enforcements at North Somerset Council (NSC). Three residents attended to make representations regarding a consultation about the possible future development of a field adjacent to the B3130, Winford. The Chair explained that this had been arranged by the developer, had no formal standing and that the Parish Council had had no involvement. Should a planning application eventually come forward, the Parish Council would seek residents' views at a public meeting.

Highways and Footpaths: It was agreed to contact Highways Officers to discuss the condition of the carriageway between Lower Strode and Manor Farms and to complain again about stones on the verge on Kingdown Road. Potholes on West Lane/Felton Lane had already been reported and marked by NSC.

Enforcements: NSC had provided guidance on change of use from agricultural land into garden. It was agreed that NSC would be asked to investigate should planning requirements appear to have been breached.

Felton Common: The NSC Archaeology Unit had agreed to look at the probable bell pit near the top of Long Lane. Local stones would shortly be placed alongside the track running from Church Trees to Church View, to prevent the track being used for unauthorised access. Freemans Quarry had kindly agreed to donate any stone that was needed to complete the job. Relevant householders had been informed. A complaint had been received regarding dog fouling on the Common. It was agreed that more signage was unlikely to be effective and that the issuing of fines was likely to be the best deterrent. The Clerk had contacted the Environmental Health Service Manager re enforcement of the existing Public Space Protection Order.

Compost site/allotments: A response had been received from the Chief Executive of NSC regarding the outstanding payment of costs and future reimbursement, but no actual progress had been made. In the meantime, it was agreed that, since NSC had committed to meet the cost, two or three further loads of green waste would be removed. An article would be placed in the Parish Magazine seeking volunteers to help with the running of the compost site.

Airport: A number of actions had been agreed with the Airport and NSC to help mitigate airport related parking issues, and a further meeting was planned in April. The Chair of the Airport Consultative Committee had needed to be reminded that the Parish Councillors on the Committee were democratically elected representatives of local residents, and that feedback on airport related matters was given and publicly minuted at every Winford Parish Council meeting. The Parish Council agreed that the approval at inquiry of the airport's expansion proposals was deeply disappointing. It was agreed that local people would want the fight to continue and for the Parish Council to continue to contribute financially towards any legal challenge. Should Parish Councils' Airport Association choose to pursue further action it was agreed that the Parish Council would be willing to provide some financial assistance. It was also agreed to write to Michael Gove, Secretary of State, expressing the Parish Council's disappointment with the decision, and to Liam Fox MP asking him to raise a question in Parliament about the disconnect between Government policies on the climate emergency and airport expansion.

Any other business: It was agreed to accept a quote of £275 to repair the wet pour surfacing at Walton Crescent play area. The basket swing at Vee Lane play area had been temporarily suspended from use by the Play Area Inspector. MJ Patch would be asked to quote for repairing it. It was agreed to remind local litter picking volunteers that the Parish Council could help with the provision of bags, litter pickers etc.

It was agreed to purchase commemorative mugs for local children to mark the Platinum Jubilee. Further efforts would be made to identify a good quality but affordable product. Any further financial contribution towards the celebrations would need to be requested by contacting the Parish Clerk in the first instance.

At the close of the meeting, Councillor Peter Longden tendered his resignation from the Parish Council and was wholeheartedly thanked for all his contributions. Since he had a great deal of knowledge about issues relating to the airport, he agreed to continue to attend the Parish Councils' Airport Association meetings for a year or so.
