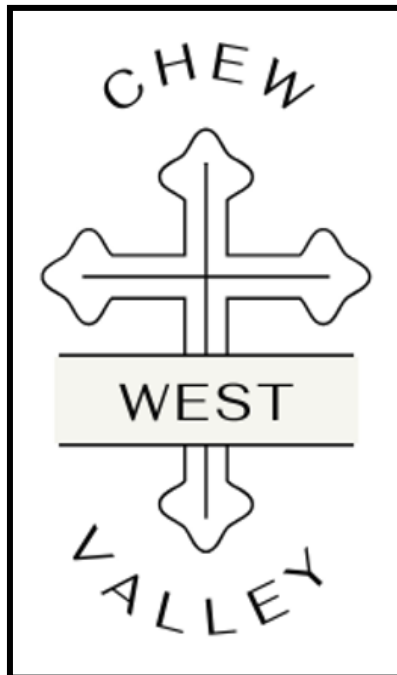

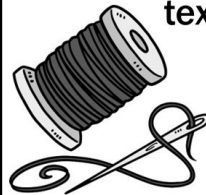

Letter from our Rector, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

After what has seemed like an endless winter, can we finally say that spring has arrived? I love the Valley at this time of year and have yet to meet anyone who doesn't look forward to the bursts of colour along the hedgerows and in our gardens. Last year turned out to be a bumper year for daffodils. Will they put on such a good show this year? All this spring colour, accompanied by longer and—hopefully—warmer days can really lift our spirits.

The month of April is a celebration of 'new life' in our churches and schools too. Easter Day announces that Jesus is alive and that his love for us bursts out of the darkness of despair and death.

There is a lovely detail in the Resurrection Story in St John's Gospel which I think about when I see spring flowers at Easter (John 20: 11–15). In John's telling of Jesus being raised from the dead, the setting is a garden. Jesus, who was crucified three days before, has been placed in a cold, dark tomb—a place of death in the middle of a place of new life.

Mary Magdalen, who had been a devoted follower of Jesus, goes to the garden early in the morning to tend the grave of her friend. When she sees that the tomb has been disturbed and the body of Jesus taken, she is distraught. She turns to talk to someone who she supposes to be 'the gardener'. Of course, she does not realise that this 'gardener' is Jesus until he speaks her name. She has made a mistake. Or has she?

The Risen Jesus is indeed 'the gardener'! The one who lovingly cares and nurtures us. The one who sees the potential in our dry seeds and waits patiently for us to burst into life, tending us every day.

Could we allow Jesus The Gardener to help us grow in faith this spring?

Wells Cathedral is to change its admission guidelines with free passes for parishioners in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and local people, and a new entry charge for tourists (£14).

Wells Cathedral will remain free to enter for worship, prayer, and to light a candle. Free passes are available for parishioners in the diocese. Anyone who is on the parish electoral roll (or Cathedral Community Roll) is eligible to apply for a Wells Cathedral Parish Pass. The Parish Passes will be issued to parishioners listed on a Parish's Electoral Roll or Cathedral Community Roll, living in the Diocese of Bath and Wells.

Each parishioner needs to apply for an individual pass.

The changes will be introduced from 22 April 2024. The monies will go towards the care and mission of the Grade 1 cathedral and to keep its doors open for future generations. [Find more details of the changes on the Wells Cathedral website.](#)

School News

World Book Day Extravaganza - On March 6th, the school transformed into a literary wonderland for World Book Day. Students dressed up as their favourite characters and classrooms buzzed with book-themed activities. The school held a book swap during the afternoon with all the pupils bringing in a book or two to swap.

Walk to School Day Steps it Up - Encouraging sustainable travel is a priority at Chew Stoke Church School. On February 26th, the school community participated in Walk to School Day, promoting healthy habits and environmental awareness. It was fantastic to see the school community coming together for such a positive initiative.

A group of pupils and teachers are off to London next week for the national sustainable schools final. The school has already been awarded the accolade of 'South West School of the Year' and we are one of a handful of schools in the national final looking to become 'School of the Year'. Good luck Chew Stoke Church School!

Mothering Sunday - To mark Mothering Sunday our Mini Melodies and Jubilee choirs sang in St Andrews Church during the Sunday morning service. Both choirs received lovely feedback from the congregation. The choirs were led by Reverend Fran, Mrs Hope and Mrs Dagger.



Rectory Field. Agreed to postpone plans to plant an orchard in the top corner until discussed further and to consider planting an orchard where the wild flower meadow has previously been situated. Also discussed the hedging plans at the bottom of the field near Bristol Road, agreed that thick hedging can be off-putting (security and visibility) so to plant clumps of bushes instead. Hedging to be planted further up the post and rail fencing as planned this weekend. To place posts in ground to show where specimen trees to be planted, to continue discussions with residents.

The hedging in Cooks Meadow to be planted this Sunday. Trees to be supplied by the Woodland Trust.

RHS 'Village in Bloom'. A well-attended meeting was held on 25th Feb, reps from the RHS came to discuss with residents. To enter by 31st March, this is free. Aim to improve the environment within the parish boundaries. Agreed to set up fortnightly working parties, to contact key groups in the area. A portfolio needs to be created to show the village during all seasons of the year. Discussed applying for funding from the Ward Councillors Fund for equipment. To approach Bristol Wood Recycling to enquire about wooden planters. To agree locations for these at next meeting.

CSPC to purchase anti-slip strips for the **footbridge in Rectory Field** which is slippery, quote for materials would be £141.36 for every other slat.

New bus service to Bristol - A CIL application was received from the CV Sustainability Transport Group for funding for bike hangers, which will be situated at Chew Medical Practice. Councillors agreed that as there is already a bike rack for up to 8 bikes at the medical practice and commuters have been offered the use of these, to monitor their usage prior to agreeing to fund additional racks.

Village Hall update- noted that some regular bookings have stopped, so emphasis now on promoting and improving the hall. Committee to apply for charitable status. A new booking app from Hallmaster is being tested during a 3 month trial.

To note that a consultation period on the new **Local Plan Option Consultation** is now open and runs until Monday 8th April. This Plan is likely to have a minimal effect to Chew Stoke which is within the Greenbelt. A draft response to be brought back to the PC April meeting for agreement prior to submission to B&NES by 8th April. Keen to highlight farming and diversification needs in our response.

Shop rental - no further update. The parish council is keen to make contact with the new tenants, asked them to contact us.

The Recreational Trail- the junction with Woodford Lane and the trail continues to flood and becomes impassable as the drain is constantly blocked. Cllr Baker to propose a boardwalk above the muddy area. **Continued overleaf**

Parish Council news continued:

To note that the **land below Dairy Way**, owned and managed by Greenbelt has been put up for auction in Feb, but there has been no sale to date. CSPC has also contacted them to ask them to clear the path and cut back brambles, and take action to resolve the slippery footbridge.

Parking on pavements has generally improved, the rugby club sent out a notice to players and members requesting they park on the road. Police to continue to monitor and act where necessary. Requested the police speed camera to be situated on Bristol Road if possible, to monitor speeding through the centre of the village which is excessive.

From 8th April 2024 the Chew Valley will have a brand new fixed bus service to Bristol. Transpora Group will be the bus service provider.

The destinations and timings are based on survey data about highest demand.

It will stop at Chew Stoke Medical Centre at 7.40am and then Battle Lane at Chew Magna at 7.45am, Hengrove Park Hospital 8.00am arriving Temple Meads 8.15am, Haymarket 8.20am and Centre (Broad Quay) at 8.25am.

It will leave the Centre at 17.40pm, Haymarket at 17.43pm, Temple Meads at 17.50, Hengrove park Hospital 18.05pm, arriving Chew Magna Battle Lane at 18.15pm and Chew Stoke Medical centre at 18.20pm.

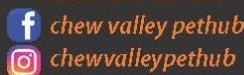
