From the Rector

Dear Friends,

Sunday 28th November is a special date in the church calendar; the beginning of the season we call Advent. It marks the beginning of a new year in the Church, and the beginning of a season of preparation.

For all of us, I suspect the month of December will involve some sort of preparation. Those of you with young families will find many events to attend—too many, perhaps! After being forced to spend last Christmas in lockdown, many will look forward to the return of Nativity Plays in our schools, to Christmas Markets, to the community events in our villages and to the excitement of getting ready for Christmas in the company of others.

For some it will be a time of being with friends and family. Perhaps you will be making plans to travel to be with someone at Christmas, or your family and friends will be travelling to visit you. For others in our communities, Advent will be a difficult time in which emotions are stirred, and memories of past Decembers are brought to the fore.

Whatever your circumstances, I hope that amidst the busyness of the run-up to Christmas you can find time to stop, be still, and to prepare.

Preparation is an important task, and it's an important part of the Christian life as well. In St Mark's gospel, the first voice we hear is not that of Jesus, but of his forerunner and cousin, John. John the Baptist was the preparer of the gospel; he paved the way for Jesus and a new way of living, which he called the Kingdom of God. Jesus was bringing this Kingdom—this new way of being—into the world, and John's message was simple: be ready for it!

Be ready for a way of life in which the least in our society are celebrated! Be ready for a way of life in which those who are lonely and bereaved are comforted!

These things are often hard for us to imagine, but they were and are bound up in the child born in the manger. Jesus, the light of this dark world, came to change your life and mine. More than ever, we need to learn to be still and prepare our hearts for this new way of being that God sent into the world. To be still in the middle of all the activity of our daily lives and prepare our hearts to meet with Jesus.

In what practical ways can we prepare? Why not in making time to read about Jesus' extraordinary life and ministry on earth for which John the Baptist prepared the way. Read about how the child in the manger grew up and healed those who were broken hearted; how he gave hope and dignity to those on the margins; read about how he gave his life willingly that we could share in that extraordinary way of life, by allowing that same transformation into our lives through prayer.

My prayer for each of you this Advent and Christmastide is that you will find time to be still, and in that stillness, you will come to know the child in the manger. May the wonder of Jesus' birth inspire you to know more about his life on earth, and may that kindle in you a faith that he lives for you today.

Winford Parish Council Meeting - Monday 18 October 2021

Highways and Footpaths: It was noted that the stones on the verges on Kingdown Road were becoming more dangerous because they were now concealed in long grass. This had been raised with the highways officer responsible.

The mobile library had asked for suggestions for alternative parking places in Winford. It was agreed to suggest to the area of public highway outside the Prince of Waterloo, and to let the pub know as a courtesy. It was agreed to request that North Somerset Council take action to reopen the right of way LA7/3/10, off Littleton Lane, as this was the only unwalkable footpath in the whole of Winford Parish.

Enforcements: District Councillor Hugh Gregor agreed to look into a possible case of unauthorised airport parking in Felton.

Felton Common: It was agreed to accept a quote of £2,360 plus VAT for scrub clearance at Felton Common. Due to the high cost, arising from the need for heavy machinery, it was agreed to finance the work from the Parish Council's general funds, rather than from the Felton Common budget. Following the successful issuing of a fixed penalty notice by the police, the Felton Common Working Party had agreed to additional signage at the entrances to the Common. These would make drivers aware that it was an offence under the Road Traffic Act to drive on Common land. The Clerk would commission the signs and liaise with members of the Working Party to determine the best positioning. The Airport would be approached for help with funding.

Councillors would monitor whether the bins were filling up between the current twice weekly visits.

Play Areas: Touchwood had been asked to repair the zipwire and quote for addressing the rot. It was agreed to pay for a weekly emptying of the litter bin at Vee Lane. The Parish Council's contractor would be chased about cutting back the hedges at the Walton Crescent play area; particularly on the path by the gate and those that were encroaching on a neighbouring garage.

Compost Site: A meeting had been held with NSC to discuss future arrangements for the payment of community composting credits. A commitment had been made by NSC to pay the outstanding claim from the start of the year, but this had not yet been received. There had also been no clear information about the formula on which future payments would be based. There was a very large accumulation of green waste at the site, exacerbated by the introduction of charges for the kerbside collection of green waste and the suspension of that service due to lack of drivers. It was agreed that one load would be taken away by Green Waste and three loads taken to Penny's. NSC would be informed that the Parish Council had agreed to this in the expectation that they would be reimbursed for these costs, which would be in the region of £5,000. It would be made clear to NSC that, without prompt payment of the outstanding claim and agreement of the new financial arrangements within a reasonable timescale, the future of the compost site was in serious doubt.

It was agreed to write to the occupant and the owner of a neighbouring property informing them that a fence would be erected between the property and the public open space adjacent to the compost site. They would be consulted about their preferences regarding the type and height of fence.

Airport: The Winford Parish Councillor had been the only non-airport official attendee at the Environmental Effects meeting on 13 October. It was agreed to write to the Chair of the Consultative Committee raising the Parish Council's concern that remote meetings were preventing community representatives from attending due to technical difficulties. It would be requested that in future meetings were held in person again. Airport parking businesses were still using the Church Trees carpark. It was agreed to raise with the Consultative Committee the need for additional signage on the A38, directing drivers to the Airport free waiting area.

Future of Felton Village Hall: The Committee of Felton Village Hall was looking at succession planning and was concerned that there might be a problem finding future managers and trustees. It was agreed that the Committee should investigate the legal requirements, in order that the Parish Council could have an informed discussion about becoming a last resort future owner or manager of the Hall.

Any other urgent business: It was agreed that the Parish Council would light a beacon on Felton Common on the Queen's Platinum Jubilee – 2 June 2022. Due to concerns that a rough sleeper was preventing school children from using the bus stop on West Lane, District Councillor Hugh Gregor would approach NSC's dedicated team for further advice.
