

Letter from our Rector, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

One of the privileges of being a priest is being recognised. This takes a bit of getting used to, but throughout my ministry I have been blessed by so many interesting conversations in the most unexpected places—all thanks to the piece of white plastic I wear as a collar. Whether in our hospitals, our schools, the pub, or the petrol station, it seems we still want to talk about faith. People have shared with me their fears, vulnerabilities, and concerns as well as their stories of answered prayer.

It is sad that we have fewer priests serving our villages than we once did. Our Diocese is under severe financial strain and, to quote Bishop Michael, we have had to find ways to cover many more slices of toast with the same amount of butter! But it is worth remembering that ministry is something that we can and should all be part of. Our churches are full of hardworking and hard-pressed volunteers who serve God and their communities not because they wear a collar, but because they carry a much more important sign—the sign of the cross which they received at their baptism.

As our group expands to welcome the parishes of Bishop Sutton and Stowey over the coming months, it is a good opportunity to thank God for those who carry that sign of ministry into their communities in gentle, every-day, unassuming ways.

Soon we will celebrate Christmas in our homes, churches and schools. At its heart, Christmas is about being able to recognise someone in the most unexpected of places. Jesus, the Son of God, came to earth, not wearing distinctive robes or even a collar — he came as a vulnerable child, born in the squalor of a cattle shed.

I pray that amid the busyness of the season we will be able to recognise the Christ Child and take time to join the shepherds, wise men and angels in worshipping him.

I wish you God's richest blessing for a peaceful Christmas.

Ward Councillors report: Bristol Airport have made changes to waiting areas along the A38 restricting waiting times.

Fly-tipping on private land on Walley Court Road. CSPC to contact B&NES again to ask about enforcement, and the landowner to enquire about removal of waste.

Parking and traffic issues in the village – feedback about the Autospeedwatch cameras is very positive, and shows they help to decrease traffic speeds in rural villages. Agreed to look into funding help from B&NES initially, Also, members of the parish council to meet representatives from Chew Stoke Church School on Monday 4th December. The police have been posting notices on cars parked on the pavements, this has been circulated on Facebook to raise awareness to residents. Clerk to contact Rugby Club re signage at the entrance.

Rectory Field and tree planting: A meeting took place with residents, members of the WI, Chew Valley Plants Trees and the Parish Council in Rectory Field on Sunday 29th October to discuss recent plans to improve the field. The WI will choose a tree to be added to mark their centenary, this will be discreet and towards the top left corner. Agreed the need for openness to be maintained, with good sightlines, as mentioned by neighbours. Agreed to contact the manager of the Forest Club for input, agreed to a mixed orchard in the top right corner which will be a community asset, a more detailed design will be provided for that corner. Also discussed the areas that have been allowed to grow long grass over the last couple of years, this has not been popular especially with dog owners, agreed to cut these areas shorter again in future. The wildflower meadow has not flowered satisfactorily for the last few years, agreed to remove this and replace with more trees that would create a barrier between the road and field. To also plant a low mixed hedge near the gate. Plan to put stakes in the ground to review layout of new trees and to keep the parish updated, and to engage with neighbours again and at key times.

Village Hall: All forms are back with the solicitors, and we are awaiting details of the completion date.

Village upkeep: discussed previous plans to create a cage to cover the ends of the pipes under the ford to keep them clear and free flowing. Recent high rainfall has evidenced that the pipes remained clear and the river level dropped to below the road very quickly, suggesting keeping the pipes clear is very important. The resident who designed the cage to look at prices of materials and construction.

The pavement on Stoke Hill has recently been swept of leaves but it remains dangerous with overhanging hedges and the falling bank making the pavement very narrow. CSPC to contact relevant landowners.

Village shop – the lettings agent website states the shop is now let, but no change within the premises. *Since the meeting, activity has been noted in the shop, information received that a convenience shop to open shortly. This was warmly welcomed.*

Chew Stoke Film Film Club Celebrates 10 Years

Nationwide many of the large cinemas are closing but grass roots cinema is thriving. The charity Cinema for All estimates that there are 1500 independent cinemas staffed by volunteers, one of which is The Majestic operated by the Chew Stoke Film Club now celebrating its tenth season.

A conversation over a charity soup lunch in 2013 led a small team to set up the film club to share the delights of the cinema with a local audience. Advice and generous support from the British Film Institute (BFI) and help from the National Lottery helped to get the club on a sound footing and to become an official Neighbourhood Cinema.

Once a month in little over an hour the church hall is transformed into an Art Deco cinema. 'We are open to all' says John Bone, one of the founding members and committee member. 'We pride ourselves in showing a wide range of films and have now screened 100 films ranging from current blockbusters to all time classics.'

Operating as a charity the film club also seeks to make regular donations to local people and causes and to date has donated over £7000.

'We've come back strongly after the pandemic' adds membership secretary Shirley Marsh, 'we are open to all, it's great to see a steady stream of new members and an increased number of visitors.' 
