Letter from our Vicar, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

I think one of the reasons so many people look forward to Christmas is the feeling of familiarity which accompanies the season. There is comfort in watching the evenings draw in while being able to predict the traditions that will be played out in schools, our churches, in shops, in our villages and across our tables. In a year which has brought so much change and uncertainty, maybe a predictable, familiar Christmas wouldn't be such a bad idea!

Even those of us who aren't particularly nostalgic hold some fond and warm memories of Christmases past. There are difficult memories mixed among them, of course. I am thinking and praying for the many people in our communities for whom this will be the first Christmas without a loved one, or who find this a lonely and difficult time for whatever reason. But there will also be a sense of joy and wonder shared by families who have welcomed new members this year—you are making new memories which you will hold dear as time passes.

All of us have heard the Christmas Story so many times that there is a risk we have become too familiar with it as well. We see it acted-out so innocently and carefully by our children in their Nativities. We will hear it retold in the words from the gospels at our Carol Services. It's painted on our Christmas cards—Nativity Sets depicting Jesus, Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, wise men and a cast of animals take pride of place in many of our homes.

But the message of this wonderful, life-changing story is still as fresh and as meaningful as it was some 2000 years ago. The reality of the birth of Jesus bears as much significance in our communities today as it did in that foreign land involving people, places and customs that we cannot imagine.

The story of the birth of Jesus is told in two of the four gospels—Matthew and Luke. Most of us are more familiar with Luke's version of events, so I want to set you a challenge. Find a bible and read the first Christmas according to Matthew on your own or with your family this Christmas (beginning at Matthew 1: 18). When you do, you will be surprised at how different it is from the version we have become familiar with.

It's a story of fear, mistrust, jealousy, shame, murder, paranoia; a refugee family forced to flee to a foreign land. In other words, it describes hope being born into a world not at all different from our own. And in the centre of the story—now, as then—a child. A child who carries—now, as then—the 'hopes and fears of all the years'.

Amid the celebration of this wonderful season—amid all the familiar sounds, tastes and sights—may you find the same hope bound up in the baby Jesus this Christmastide. *'And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth'.* John 1:14.

Enthronement of Rt Rev Michael Beasley as Bishop of Bath & Wells

St Katharine's Churchwarden, Jan Longden, represented our group of parishes at this special and historic event. She shares her experience:

I was honoured to represent the Chew Valley West Benefice at this event in Wells Cathedral. The cathedral was full and there were several processions of clergy, former Bishops and local dignitaries.

The new Bishop entered by the Great West Doors and was greeted by a child (representing the children of the Diocese) who asked him who he was and why did he request entry. He was let in and the choir sang to welcome him. Then after various declarations he was anointed and moved into the Quire to be enthroned in his seat, the *cathedra*. Another child reminded him that he should always remember he is first a child of God.

There was a lot of good singing and the new Bishop preached a short sermon based on the Pentecost story but using names of local Somerset places. Afterwards we were all given a hazel tree sapling to plant wherever we saw fit, to help counteract global warming.

Walley Court Road improvements - The audit report looking at concerns about the new road layout across the dam and Walley Court Road has been received. Increased signage and road markings have been implemented. CSPC was asked to continue to send photos of inappropriate parking, and to report dangerous incidents etc.

Hedges - Some properties in the village have hedges that are overhanging pavements or pathways and are causing a hazard, or forcing pedestrians into the road, please can they be cut back as soon as possible.

Highways issues – there are various highways issues that the village is experiencing at present:

Speeding - we are waiting to start the Community Speedwatch Scheme. The PC has requested a new front to the SID machine at the top of Stoke Hill.

An increased number of vans are driving up and down Woodford Lane and there is no warning to pedestrians that vehicles use the narrow lane. The only signage is “unsuitable for vehicles”, pedestrians please be aware, we are requesting additional signs.

Parking on pavements, and on the Bristol Road and Chew Lane at school pick up times is an issue, CSPC have been in contact with the PCSO's again. Please do not park on the pavements.

A 30mph speed limit is to be introduced from Pagans Hill/Winford Rd roundabout in the near future.

Parking on the dam between the chicanes has been observed, please be aware and please do not park in this area.

Garden waste collections – just a reminder that collections will stop between 4th December 22 and 16th January 23.

Avian flu - sadly avian flu has been confirmed in a small number of cases at Chew Valley Lake. Bristol Water are following the DEFRA/Animal and Plant Health Agency guidance and applying a risk assessment approach. The avian flu guidance that we are applying for visitors to the lake is available at: <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/avian-influenza-bird-flu-posters-for-land-managers>

BW have decided to act promptly to reduce the likelihood of visitors feeding birds.

They've installed temporary barriers at the north end of Picnic Area 1. Temporary signage is also being installed, with a particular emphasis on areas that they believe to be popular bird feeding locations.
