

Letter from our Rector, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

During these early days of 2024 I have been reflecting on some words from a much-loved hymn. It's a favourite of mine which we sing regularly—as often at weddings as we do at funerals.

Lord of all hopefulness, Lord of all joy, whose trust, ever childlike, no cares could destroy, be there at our waking, and give us, we pray, your bliss in our hearts, Lord, at the break of the day.

The hymn is a simple prayer which recognises our dependence on God at every time of day and in every season of our lives. It asks God to be present with us as we go about our everyday tasks at work and at home.

I have been thinking about the opening line, especially those words 'hopefulness' and 'joy'. We can all recognise that joy and hope are often in short supply in our world. Perhaps they are also lacking in your own life, or in the lives of those dearest to you for any number of good reasons. Joy and hope can seem like things we might only glimpse in passing—if we are fortunate enough.

Yet this hymn reminds us that hope and joy are not just qualities which are part of God, they are *all* of God. God is *all* hopefulness and *all* joy. It is through his presence in our lives that we find bliss and peace in our hearts.

May God be present with you and those you love at the beginning of this New Year, and may you continue to know his loving, hopeful, joyful presence through every day and every season.

Church Electoral Roll for St Andrews Church, Chew Stoke

In accordance with the Church Representation Rules, we are revising our Church Electoral Roll, in preparation for our Annual Parochial Church (APC) meeting.

Every Anglican Church maintains a Church electoral roll on which names of voting church members are recorded. Being on this roll is an important way of confirming your commitment to our church community and to the vision of the church and allows voting at APC. To be added to the roll, a member needs to be baptised, aged 16 or over, a church member resident in the parish or regularly attending church service though not resident in the parish.

The roll is fully revised every 6 years. Forms for application can be found in the porch of St Andrews. These should be returned to the electoral roll officer.

The Acts of the Apostles

The Acts of the Apostles is a fascinating book. The longest of the New Testament, it tells the story of what God did to take the message of the Risen Jesus into all the then-known world. It begins where St Luke's Gospel ends with the Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus. From there it records the growth of the church as it expands geographically from Jerusalem to Rome, and both culturally and ethnically as the Good News of Jesus spreads from Jews to Gentiles.

Over six weeks we will spend time studying the early chapters of Acts in detail (probably Chapters 1–3) finding much to inspire and challenge us as the same Church of God in our time and place.

School News

Chew Stoke Church School held their annual Christingle service at St Andrews Church in the village in December.

The service was led by Angela Fraser who is the schools Youth Chaplain and our local vicar, Rev Ian with the help of Rev Fran, school staff and pupils. The school's Worship, Ethos and Equality Team told the Christmas story and also led the prayers.

Ben Hewett, headteacher, said 'It was lovely to see the church full with parents, children and other family members, this is always a very magical way to begin our Christmas festivities'.

A collection was held for the Children's Society and our partner school in Uganda, who are raising money to build new classrooms.





Towards the end of last term, the school had a visit from Dan Norris, the Metro Mayor. The visit coincided with Road Safety Week and Mr Norris came along to see some of the initiatives that the school has been working on.

Mr Norris met with the PE council who shared the work they have been doing in this area, observed road safety training and spent some time with the pupils monitoring the speed of traffic through the village.

Two Hundred Years of Saving Lives at Sea

In 2024 the RNLI will celebrate 200 years of service dedicated to the preservation of those who work or play at sea or on our inland waters. The RNLI was founded by Sir William Hillary on the Isle of Man, where he observed at first hand the perils of seafaring. He personally took part in many

incidents to help save lives and as a result, resolved to set up a rescue service which subsequently became the RNLI in Great Britain and Ireland.

Since its establishment, the RNLI has saved more than 144,000 lives but this has come at the high cost of losing 600 volunteer crew members in the process. The work continues today with a wider remit, as our beaches swell with holiday makers in the summer. In 2022 there were 9312 lifeboat launches with 389 lives saved and beach lifeguards saving 117 lives.

Here in the Chew Valley we try and do our bit to raise funds to keep this crucial service going and it is thanks to our loyal supporters that we are able to do this. We recently held our Curry Lunch which raised £2,300 and thanks go to all who contributed. In fact, 94% of RNLI income is derived solely from public donations.

We are a small, inland branch of the RNLI, but we do as much as we can to help our charity achieve its objective of 'Saving Lives at Sea' - which we intend, with the help of our loyal supporters and the general public, to continue for the next 200 years!

In May 2024 we are planning to celebrate our bicentenary with an outdoor event at Lady Farm, Chelwood to which all family members will be welcome. Make a note of the timing and keep an eye open for further information. We also hope to repeat our Curry Lunch in the Autumn. Our small committee is now in desperate need of new members to help plan our fund raising activities. 
