From the Rector

Amid the arrival of January and thoughts of new beginnings, the church is still celebrating the joy and wonder of Christmas. For Christians, Christmas is not just a single day, but a season of forty days—a reminder that the Christ came to be with us not as a temporary guest, but to be Emmanuel—'God with us'—for ever.

On the 6th January we celebrate a feast called The Epiphany when our thoughts turn to the Maji—the mysterious kings or wisemen who travelled from Persia to Bethlehem to worship Jesus. Tradition tells us that there were three kings, but there may have been many more in their royal entourage. I like to imagine a caravan stretching for miles across the desert!

The kings were following a star, desperately searching for the new-born King in Bethlehem. So, their story becomes our story too. We are all desperately searching for something—for satisfaction, for happiness, for peace, for a return to good health; for whatever is missing in our lives.

One of the great Christian thinkers, Saint Augustine, wrote in one of his prayers, 'Almighty God, in whom we live and move and have our being ... our hearts are restless till they find their rest in you'.

It's one of my favourite prayers because it recognises that we can only find true satisfaction and peace with God. It is only through knowing God that we find true purpose and meaning in our lives and can rest from our endless searching.

You might find some words from the book of Psalms helpful if, like St Augustine, your heart is restless:

'Be still then, and know that I am God'. (Psalm 46: 10).

It's a reminder that if we spend too much of our time in ceaseless activity – always on the go – we will miss the opportunity to really know God.

So, may that be our prayer for this New Year. While we desperately search for meaning and purpose, we might also discover that our restlessness will be replaced by a quiet confidence as we become still in the presence of the Lord.

Are you looking out for Jesus?

In January, our churches enter the season of Epiphany, which my dictionary defines as 'a moment of sudden and great revelation or realisation'. I wonder what your epiphanies have been? When have you seen things for the first time? Experienced the penny dropping? Understood things in a new way?

In our churches, the readings for the Sundays of January are all about moments that revealed who Jesus is. The arrival of the wise men showed that Jesus is for everyone, not just the people of Israel. Jesus's baptism revealed his relationship with his Father and the Holy Spirit. The production at Cana of enough top-quality red plonk to take several baths in made clear the abundance of God's love for us. The end of the Epiphany season, the feast of Candlemas (actually 2 February), marks the moment when Jesus was seen as 'God's salvation for all peoples' (Luke 2: 31).

The challenge with epiphanies is whether we're looking out for them. If our eyes are wide shut, we don't see an awful lot. Sometimes we need to stand in a different place to spot things we haven't perceived before. So the question I'd like to ask you as our new year begins is 'Where and when are you looking out for the Jesus who has been revealed to us?'

A practical step you might take to help you on your way is to sign up to be part of the **'Everyday Faith' events** that will be happening around our diocese from 29 January until 4 February. (https://www.bathandwells.org.uk/faith/everyday-faith/everyday-faith-event/) The aim of these events is to help us look at our faith afresh and see things anew from some different perspectives.

I'm going to be taking part in the Everyday Faith events and they're going to be great. As we enter a new year, why not come and join me? After all, an invitation to an epiphany isn't something that comes your way every day!

As always, we only expect you to email us if you want to express concerns but if you need to report a crime then it still needs to be 999 or 101. - **Suspicious Vehicles? - Suspicious Behaviour? - Drug use or supply**? These are a few examples of things that may be useful to us if you have concerns surrounding them, we are here to develop it so the more the merrier!

There are so many risks involved with these types of incidents, sending them over social media platforms such as Snapchat or Whatsapp gives those platforms the rights to those images or videos. Young people all have mobile phones but whose name is on the contract? The risks of an adult having those images on a device that is registered to them may have detrimental effects. If these incidents start to become frequent with an individual it could potentially lead to that person being put onto the Sex Offenders Register which can impact their entire lives, from holidays to future relationships or future employment all because of a very mindless decision. Please be aware of these risks and should you wish to have us visit your school to discuss these matters we are more than happy to; just send us an email and we can organise a visit and lesson plan.

Accessing North Somerset Council Officers Face to Face in Local Libraries

We have launched this service specifically to help those who cannot access services online or on the phone. It takes place in libraries across the area and people are seen on a first come first served basis. If the officer does not have an immediate answer to the enquiry, an appointment could be made for a later date or a call back arranged. Officers will be in the following locations from 10.00 am to 2.00 pm:

Winford Parish Council Meeting – Monday 21 November 2022

Matters arising: The Clerk reported that she was still in discussions with the owner of Winford Manor about his offer to provide minibus lifts to elderly residents.

Policing issues – Airport Parking: APS Paul Lewis spoke to the meeting about vandalism of parked vehicles, particularly in Felton. He appealed for any information residents could provide about who might be responsible. He understood the problems that airport parking was causing to residents and advised that if vehicles were parked on private land the police might be able to help the landowner. He agreed to send details of Community SpeedWatch.

Open Forum: Five members of the public attended. A resident raised his concerns regarding planning application 22/P/2102/OUT, Land South West of Court Farm, Chew Road, Winford. He expressed concerns about the accuracy of the application, and the lack of timely and adequate consultation by North Somerset Council (NSC). It was noted that, following his complaints to NSC, consultation letters were now being sent out to more householders and the deadline for comments was being extended.

Highways and footpaths: A blocked drain at the bottom of Lye Mead would be reported to NSC. At least two new kissing gates had now been installed and NSC had offered to replace a bridge on the footpath leading from Winford Church to Monarch's Way. Several other improvements had also been agreed. Discussions were ongoing with the Church and the owner of the adjacent field on how to address the damage vandals had caused to the traditional stone and metal bar stile in the churchyard. Despite writing to the Chief Executive of NSC, there had been no apparent progress on the diversion of the footpath running across the compost site. District Councillor Hugh Gregor agreed to chase action on this.

Planning: The Clerk had asked NSC for an update on application 21/P/2605/FUL: Lulsgate Quarry West Lane Felton BS40 9UF, since it was now almost a year since the expiry of the planning deadline for restoration of the quarry. NSC were awaiting further information, so were not yet able to determine it. It was agreed to inform NSC that the previously reported airport parking on a field off West Lane had continued for considerably longer than the 28 days allowed under permitted development, and that the number of cars parked was increasing. The Clerk would also write to the landowner, reminding them of assurances they had offered in the past that the land would not be used for parking.

Felton Common: The Working Group was continuing to consider the feasibility of reintroducing grazing on the Common. An airport representative had expressed concern that grazing cattle would increase the chance of bird-strike. It was agreed that, if the airport didn't want the Parish Council to use this method of land management, they would have to fund the mechanical alternative. A tractor had been seen driving across the Common to deliver a load of hay to a farm. It was agreed to write to the occupant of the property, reminding them that vehicles were not allowed to drive across the Common, except by using the route of a legal easement.

Airport: The meeting heard a report on the Passengers with Reduced Mobility Forum. Members of the Forum with a variety of different disabilities had tested the journey from car park to plane for accessibility, and had identified many areas where improvement was needed. The Chair has asked for an update on the actions agreed at the last meeting with NSC and the airport to discuss parking issues. NSC had approached the airport for a contribution towards the cost of £10,000 for the proposed red lining on the A38 and the access to Felton Allotments. The requested improvements to the signage for the free one-hour parking area were to be included in this. Since the airport had stated that there was no alternative way for them to fund this, it was reluctantly agreed that the Parish Council would apply for funding from the Environmental Improvement Fund. This was subject to the agreement of Wrington Parish Council to Winford making the application, since the lining of the A38 fell almost entirely in their Parish.

Compost site & allotments: NSC had still to confirm the new system of payments for recycling credits, and a response was still awaited to the Parish Council's request for reimbursement of the latest costs incurred in running the compost site.

Cricket Club: The Cricket Club had requested the transfer of the lease for the sports pavilion from Winford/Old Cathedralians to a new organisation, Winford Bishop Sutton. It was agreed that, subject to clarification of the legal constitution of the new organisation, this was an acceptable way to ensure the continued maintenance and use of the building. The Parish Council agreed to meet the legal cost of transferring the existing lease, up to a maximum of £500.
