## From the Rector

Dear Friends,

The events over the Platinum Jubilee weekend gave us much to be thankful for. We were blessed with glorious weather which only gave way to a downpour at the very end of our Winford Street Party. Our Community Choir concert in St Mary & St Peter's Church, Winford was 'standing room only'. Likewise, the church was full for our Service of Thanksgiving.

It was certainly a busy few days, not least for those who organised these events and to whom we extend our sincere thanks.

I remarked in my sermon at the Service of Thanksgiving that the pace of life has returned to normal. The Jubilee celebrations seemed like our first opportunity to meet again, as HM The Queen promised we would in her broadcast at the beginning of the pandemic.

With community and family events running again at full stride, it can feel a little overwhelming. We had forgotten what it was like to be so busy!

There is an intriguing episode in the gospels concerning two women called Martha and Mary (Luke 10: 38). Jesus visits their home and receives hospitality as he travels through their village. Martha, we are told, is distracted by all the necessary preparations she has to make for the meal—she is rushing around, cleaning, cooking and arranging. Mary, on the other hand, simply sits at the feet of Jesus and listens to what he has to say. There is such a contrast in their behaviour. One is distracted by business of everyday life; the other stays still and listens to Jesus.

Eventually Martha complains that she is having to cope on her own, to which Jesus replies, 'Martha, Martha. You are worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her'.

Which woman can you identify with? Those words, 'but only one thing is needed' are as much a correction to us as they are to Martha. They remind us of what is important, amid the ceaseless activity of daily life, is to find time to be with Jesus.

I hope you find refreshment and relaxation during these summer months. And I hope you also find time to be with Jesus—to sit at his feet and listen to him in the stillness. That is the only thing that is needed.

We have now had Bishop Michael's election as our new Diocesan Bishop confirmed and we have joined together in a Day of Prayer to mark this new chapter in the life of the Diocese of Bath and Wells. # Chew Valley Ukrainian Support Network

Are you sponsoring a Ukrainian family under the government's Homes for Ukraine scheme, or do you know someone who is, or would like to?

The Chew Valley Ukrainian Support Network was formed in mid March with the goal: 'We want to make sure Ukrainians coming to our beautiful Chew Valley flourish and are not isolated when they get here, so we have to build a really supportive community network'. Since then 56 Sponsors have joined the Network which stretches from Marksbury to Cleeve, from Dundry to Litton and Shipham. 18 Ukrainian families have already arrived and 10 more families are in the visa application pipeline, leaving 28 would be sponsors still looking for Ukrainian families to sponsor.

As the name suggests, it is all about building connections, firstly between Sponsors and then between Ukrainians in the Valley. We have a Sponsors WhatsApp group and the Ukrainians who have arrived have developed their own. There is a Ukrainian Community Hub based in Bishop Sutton where Ukrainians can meet every week. And, in addition, we have developed a private website, known as the Information Hub, which is full of useful information about Sponsorship at all stages of the process, a map showing where everybody is, the practical things each Sponsor needs to help their guests with and the huge array of services and activities that have been developed/negotiated by our Helpers Network to support and enrich our Ukrainian guests during their time with us.

#### **Drink Driving**

The weather has improved and what we all do when the sun comes out is go to the pub and beer gardens. This results in an increase in drink drivers that we have to deal with. You could be imprisoned, banned from driving and face a fine if you are found guilty of drink-driving. The actual penalty you get is up to the magistrates who hear your case, and depends on your offence. There are strict alcohol limits for drivers,

but it is impossible to say exactly how many drinks this equals - it's different for each person. 35 Micrograms per 100 millilitres of breath is the current England, Wales and Northern Ireland limit.

The vehicle that had been identified as of considerable interest to our investigation has now also been seized as part of this arrest. Enquiries are ongoing but this is a hugely positive step as a result of a lot of work by a number of departments across the organisation.

#### Winford Parish Council Meeting - Monday 9 May 2022

**Election of Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Council for the next year:** It was unanimously agreed to re-elect Paul Hatherell as Chair of the Parish Council, and to re-elect Glenis Shiner as Vice Chair.

**Minutes of previous meeting:** District Councillor Hugh Gregor had spoken to the area officer about the blocked drains on the High Street and Regil Lane. Some on Regil Lane had subsequently been cleared, but it was agreed that Councillor Gregor would speak to them again about the ones that had been missed on the High Street and outside MJPatch.

**Open Forum:** Five members of the public attended. Issues were raised about illegal airport parking. One site had already been raised as a case for investigation in 2019, and it was agreed to contact the investigating officer for an update, and to take photos of the other, since it was not immediately visible from the road. The outstanding planning application for self-build houses at Bird's Farm was also raised, but the Chair explained that the Parish Council had no information on the progress of applications through North Somerset Council's (NSC's) system. District Councillor Hugh Gregor was asked to raise the parking and planning issues with the relevant NSC officers. Three members of the public had attended to raise the very dangerous corner at the junction of the High Street with Regil Lane, and to request a crossing and/or speed limit reduction. It was agreed to raise this matter again with NSC, and it was suggested that residents compile a petition to NSC.

**Highways and footpaths:** NSC had asked for a decision about whether the parking/loading bay outside the community shop should be for loading only or a time limited parking space. It was agreed that Councillor Phil Febrey would be asked to make a decision based on what was best for the shop and its users. A pothole on Redding Pit Lane and a blocked drain on Parsonage Close would be reported. It was agreed that, since NSC appeared to have been unsuccessful in asking householders to remove stones placed illegally on the highway, the Parish Council would write to those concerned, asking that the stones be removed for

safety reasons. Highways had asked for jet patching of Lower Strode, Watery Lane, Spring Lane and Gravel Hill, but had agreed to revisit the problem areas in the meantime, and to raise orders for emergency pothole repairs if any of the defects were deemed to be dangerous.

**Enforcements:** The possible construction of a dwelling house on land near to Winford Lane, without planning permission, would be reported to NSC. An anonymous complaint had been received about the environmental impact of various activities being undertaken at properties around the Regil area and it was agreed to pass the letter to NSC.

**Felton Common:** The placing of stones alongside the track running from Church Trees to Church View had yet to be completed. A successful litter pick had been held. In general, despite a noticeable increase in use of the Common over the past two years, littering was less of a problem than in the past.

**Play areas:** It was agreed to seek quotes for the replacement of the basket swing at Vee Lane and to apply for grant funding towards the cost. A Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) payment of £231.80 for 2021/22 had been received, and could be used as part funding. A request for more frequent cuts of the hedges at Vee Lane Play Area had been received by a Parish Councillor. It was however agreed that once yearly cutting was adequate.

**Compost site/allotments:** Loads of green waste continued to be removed from the site, and a load of compost for distribution had been delivered. A figure for reimbursement had been received from NSC, but was disappointingly low, calling into question the future viability of the site. It was agreed to arrange a meeting with the relevant NSC officers to explain the Parish Council's difficulties should this amount not be increased, and to discuss the way forward. The future of the compost site was inextricably linked to the proposal to divert the footpath running across it, particularly as this made it difficult to close the site completely. It was agreed that a Parish Councillor would attempt to get an update from NSC on the application to divert the path.

**Airport:** The Bristol Airport Consultative Committee was in the process of reviewing its membership and it was agreed that the Parish Council wished to remain a member.

Annual Parish Meeting: It was agreed that in future years the Annual Parish Meeting would be held at the same venue as and immediately before the Annual Parish Council Meeting, and not on a separate day. This might help to address the low turnout and save everyone's time. The venue of the Annual Parish Meeting would however continue to rotate between the three villages.

**Any other business:** Attempts to find a contractor to treat the Angel were continuing. It was agreed to ask NSC to provide timetables at each of the stops for the 55 bus. The Clerk was asked to chase Bristol Water about cutting the hedge and repairing the fencing at Rocks Lane Reservoir.
