From the Rector



There is an old Jewish proverb about a man who drew water every day from a well and carried it home in two buckets slung on a bamboo pole across his shoulders. One of the buckets was brand new, while the other was an old, leaky thing with several holes.

Every day the man would fill both buckets to the brim and set off home. When he reached home the new bucket would still be full, but the old bucket would have lost most of its contents

This made the old bucket sad, so it plucked up the courage and said to the man, 'Sir, I'm so sorry that I'm old, full of holes, and I can't keep water from sprinkling out on to the ground'. The old man smiled, nodded his head, but said nothing.

Winford Community Orchard Action Group

Special Village Meeting at Winford Village Hall on Wednesday 5 July at 19.30

An informal group of Winford Residents have organised this meeting to see if there is enough enthusiasm to purchase an important organic field that forms one of the boundaries to the village and turn it into a community asset.

The field opposite the junction of Regil Lane and Chew Rd, on the road in from Chew Magna, was used as an orchard according to the 1885 ordnance survey and probably for many hundreds of years before that. For the last 40+ years it has been used for grazing and a hay/silage crop until late 2022. In that time there have been 3 attempts by the various owners to seek planning permission for building that have been refused, not completed after planning advice, or latterly withdrawn.

The Last application NSC 22/P/2102/OUT was for 18 self-build houses (some 3 storey) a communal office building and a mini roundabout to give site access. This was highly controversial and had almost 90 objections on the NSC planning website. At a WPC special parish meeting 40 residents voted against the application with one in favour. We now know that the application was withdrawn on 20th April.

As a result, the field has just been put up for sale by Killen's by informal tender on August 4th midday at a guide price of £75,000.

To protect this field, we hope to organise its purchase by crowd funding, subscription or by obtaining grants and turn it into a community asset, such as an orchard to increase biodiversity and increase wellbeing, perhaps with some seating and perhaps a small children's area.

We realise this is a huge task that needs to be undertaken very quickly, with the planned meeting being an important start. If you wish to help or become involved, please attend the meeting or contact Simon Martin. tachoremovalman@gmail.com

Report of Winford Parish Council Meeting – Monday 12 June 2023

Co-option of new Councillor: Holly Salmon was formally co-opted to the seat in Regil Ward left vacant after the May election.

Open Forum: Four members of the public attended. Two attendees raised issues with airport users blocking access to Felton allotments. The Chair explained that at the request of the police, North Somerset Council (NSC) would be red lining a stretch of the A38, including the access road to the allotments. Once the lines were in place, the police would have the power to fine anyone stopping on the road.

Two members of the public raised objections to the proposed Greggs Drive Through at the former Wagon and Horses site, in particular the dangerous access to the site from the busy A38 and potential noise, litter and smell. The application was discussed under the relevant agenda item.

Potential new community asset, land off Chew Road, Winford: The Parish Council had been asked whether they would support the purchase of land on the outskirts of Winford, for the development of a community orchard or similar. It was agreed that, because they already had responsibility for over 100 acres of land, trees etc and limited capacity for management, the Parish Council was not prepared to commit to future responsibility for the land in question. However, should the group decide to take this forward and was in need of funding, the Parish Council would be willing to consider a grant to assist with the cost.

Highways and footpaths: A number of defects on Whitling Street had been reported to NSC and were now marked up for remedial action. Highways would be asked to inspect the extremely poor state of repair Hen Lane between Kingdown Road and Benches Lane and to take remedial action.

It was agreed to write thanking the landlord of the George and Dragon for his initiative in first establishing that the speed signs on West Lane were beyond repair, and then cutting back hedges so that a mobile speed patrol had sufficient visibility to operate in that location.

NSC had responded with suggestions regarding the issue of problem parking outside the Prince of Waterloo. It was agreed to ask them to approach the landlady to discuss the proposals as part of the District Council's Active Travel Strategy.

It was agreed to chase NSC about the lack of any progress with the Parish Council's request for urgent safety improvements at the dangerous junction of the B3130 with Regil Lane.

Following a complaint from a young user, it was agreed to ask for a quote to cut back the overgrowth on the Urban Link footpath and eradicate the ornamental garlic which had invaded the path and the steps at Marketplace.

A number of stiles had been replaced with new kissing gates and a very heavy gate at Kentshare Lane had been replaced with a Bristol gate. Further footpaths improvements were planned.

Planning Enforcements:

It was agreed to write asking NSC how they proposed to enforce the regulations with the many unofficial car parking operations currently operating in the fields and other areas in the vicinity of the airport.

Felton Common: A resident had volunteered to become a member of the Felton Common Working Party and had been invited to their next meeting. The Working Party was continuing their search for free or reasonably priced stones to place alongside the track leading from Church Trees. Some stones had been placed by the boundary of the Roundhouse to prevent vehicles from driving onto the Common that way. Following a request to park at Church Trees whilst catching the U2 to Langford, it was agreed to reply explaining that spaces were provided for churchgoers and users of the Common only. It was agreed to take further solicitor's advice regarding a potential issue of the Common being used to access adjacent land.

Airport: The Clerk would ask NSC whether the red lining on the A38 and the access to Felton Allotments could be expedited as the problem parking had escalated and there was also a danger to pedestrians trying to cross at the roundabout.

Compost site & allotments: In response to a complaint about neglect of some of the Felton allotment plots and the conservation area, it was agreed to ask the Chair of the Compost and Allotments Working Party to hold a meeting to discuss this and other allotment and compost site issues.

Finance: It was agreed to make a £1,000 grant to each of the village halls, subject to RFO confirmation that this was within budget.

Any other business: It was noted that now that the WESTlink on demand service was running, the Manor minibus appeared to have stopped. However, no complaints had been received about this.
