### A Richness of Ministry

If we are all alike we tend to think the same. This can be comfortable and reassuring - 'Everyone around here sees things just like I do'. But it doesn't help us think out of the box or worse, spot risks and dangers of which we are unaware - 'Crumbs we never saw that one coming!'. For this reason, companies and all kinds of organisations are seeking to become more diverse. Having differing viewpoints, skills and abilities is increasingly recognised to grow ability to think not only more widely but more effectively too.

Recognising diversity has been very much part of our life here in our Diocese of Bath & Wells during recent weeks. Back in May we acclaimed the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ordination of women to the priesthood. It's almost impossible now to imagine what our Church would be like without the contribution of women throughout the ordained ministry. At the end of June the 'Celebration of Lay Ministries' held at St Paul's, Weston-super-Mare, saw us affirm, thank and bless the many different roles and responsibilities that lay people are undertaking across our churches and in local communities – from leading worship to pastoral care, ministry with children and young people, to preaching and teaching the faith. Again, it's almost impossible to imagine what our churches would be like without such richness.

Our hope is that the diversity we've been honouring will only flourish and grow. For it's essential if we are to bring the light of the Gospel to everyone in our communities — and especially those we find hard to connect with. For none of us alone, either individually or as a group, has the ability to reach everyone. All of us are needed. It's for this reason that one of the priorities we are commending across our diocese is 'shared local ministry'. This recognises that everyone, everywhere, has a contribution to make. Now surely that is something to celebrate!

On **Sunday 21**st **July, from 2 pm to 6 pm, 4 gardens in Stowey** will be opening under the National Garden Scheme. The gardens at Dormers, Stowey Mead, Vicarage Cottage and Manor Farm will open their gates, enabling you to enjoy the beauty and peacefulness of the gardens and the wonderful surrounding countryside. ### Winford Parish Council Meeting - Wednesday 22 May 2024

**Election of Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Council for the next year:** It was unanimously agreed to re-elect Paul Hatherell as Chair of the Parish Council, and Karen Bye as Vice Chair. Margaret Webster had tendered her resignation and it was noted that Jayne Thompson would put herself forward at the next meeting, for co-option to fill the consequent vacancy in Winford ward.

**Open Forum:** Four members of the public attended. One person raised objections to the Parish Council's comments at the previous meeting, regarding the prominence of church related matters in the village magazine. The Chair apologised for any offence caused, and explained that this was to reflect the move to a community magazine with Parish Council financial support.

**Highways and footpaths:** It was agreed to form a Task and Finish Group to discuss road safety improvements in Winford village. The Clerk would arrange a meeting with North Somerset Council's (NSC's) Principal Sustainable Travel and Road Safety Officer and Highways. A complaint had been raised regarding airport parking in Hillview Gardens. It was noted that, if vehicles were parked legally, nothing could be done about them. Following discussion about other problem parking, including vehicles ignoring the red lining near the airport, it was agreed to ask NSC for the job description for the enforcement officer to be funded by the airport as a planning requirement.

There was little movement on the repair of the numerous potholes in the area: whilst West Lane had been closed for repairs, only half of them had been completed during the closure. It was agreed to write to a senior officer in NSC Highways, chasing a response to the Parish Council's request for a site meeting to inspect the condition of Kingdown Road/New Road.

District Councillor Waite outlined her plans to attract two years' of West of England Combined Authority funding for a community bus service to Bristol, potentially to service Felton, Winford and Dundry. Depending on logistics, it might also include a school run to Backwell. She had been working with The Big Lemon, a Community Interest Company already running similar services elsewhere. The deadline for applications for services to start in September was 31 May 2024, so it was too late for the Parish Council to discuss being the lead applicant.

**Felton Common:** Griffiths Contractors had made improvements to the road surface on the lane leading to St Katherine's Church from West Lane. This was at no cost to the Parish Council, as part of Griffiths' work in the community whilst they built the new airport multi story car park. It was agreed to write thanking both them and the airport, for arranging this. More rocks had been placed alongside the track from Church Trees and it was hoped to source more. People were using the Common litter bins to dispose of dead flowers from the churchyard. The bins were already being filled with a variety of domestic and commercial waste, which the Parish Council had to pay to be disposed of. It was agreed to ask the church warden to ensure that there were clear directions to the church's compost heap.

**Compost site and allotments:** Some green waste had been removed, and there was a lot more still to be taken away. There was still no indication of any progress on NSC's plan to introduce a new scheme for reimbursing local composting schemes, and Councillor Waite was asked to look into this. The Clerk would ask NSC what was happening with the diversion of the footpath running across the compost site.

**Airport:** The Parish Council's representative on the Airport Consultative Committee had raised the lack of enforcement of the red lining on the A38 and the access road to Felton Allotments. The police had indicated that they thought the red route was working well and that the A38 was much safer as a result. It was agreed to write to NSC asking for the red lining to be redone, since it had already started to fade and had disappeared in places.

Next Meeting: Monday 15 July. As usual, there will be no meeting in August.
