



Letter from our Rector, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

Recently I have been re-reading one of the most famous religious books of recent times. First published over 30 years ago, *The Return of the Prodigal Son* by Henri Nouwen is a reflection on a powerful Gospel story, viewed through a celebrated painting of the same title by Rembrandt.

As well as being a best-selling writer, the author, Henri J. M. Nouwen, was an inspiring pastor of an inter-faith community in Toronto, Canada called L'Arche Daybreak. L'Arche is now a worldwide community, helping adults with disabilities grow in faith surrounded by love and support.



You might be familiar with the Gospel story of The Prodigal Son (Luke 15: 11–32). In brief, a father has two sons. The younger son asks for his inheritance and goes off and squanders it. He must return empty handed and beg his father to take him back as a servant. However, when he was still some distance away his father spots him and runs to him. He is welcomed home with open arms and a lavish celebration. The older son is furious and envious. After all, he has been working diligently with his father the whole time. But the father tells the older son: "you are ever with me, and all that I have is yours, but your younger brother was lost and now he is found".

Nouwen's book invites us to see this rich story from three perspectives: the younger son; the older son, and the father. As such it reveals the heart of this Gospel story—that God our Father is more forgiving and merciful than we can ever comprehend. Offering and receiving forgiveness is never easy, but God sees it as a cause for celebration. What a challenge for us to love in the in the way the father did, and to accept that love like the son.

The themes in this parable will resonate with all of us. We have all felt dejection, jealousy, loneliness and anger. We would not be human if we didn't. Yet Jesus' story of The Prodigal Son reminds us that the love of God brings healing, reconciliation and peace. That forgiveness is ours to receive when we take a few tentative steps towards God. Then he comes to meet us, even when we are 'still far off'.


Sunday First – 2nd June & Sunday 7th July Our popular all-age 'Sunday First' worship



Retiring Donations for Jessie May Trust (Childrens' hospice at home)

Bristol Harmony, a local West Gallery choir, will be visiting churches in the Chew Valley area on Saturday, June 29th. They will be singing and playing at Norton Malreward at 10am, Stanton Drew at 11.30 and **St.Andrews, Chew Stoke at 3pm**. West Gallery music was music played and sung in village churches in the 17th and 18th Century before the return of church organs and the more formal choirs. It is a musical tradition lovingly and amusingly observed by Thomas Hardy in various poems and most notably his early novel "Under The Greenwood Tree". You are welcome to come along and hear the choir perform (for free).

HS Community Bloom (CSCB) update: residents have been working hard tidying up the ford, and other parts of the village, new helpers are very welcome to join, there are regular times when groups are meeting, but residents are very welcome to take ownership of a specific site or project if that is easier. Please liaise with Nicola Ainger micolaainger@chewstoke.org.uk. CSPC have applied for £250 from the Ward Councillors Empowerment Fund for money towards the Community Bloom. Curo have also offered funds to assist with tidying up the area at the top of Bilbie Road. Discussed latest ideas which include planting bulbs in several locations around the village, a planter outside Webbs Mead and wild flowers beside the phone box.

Parking along one side of Chew Lane (near junction with Winford Rd to just north of the Rugby Club) before the end of the Chew Valley School day is causing traffic congestion issues, due to a lack of passing places for long stretches, and coaches driving to the school. A map showing potential areas for double yellow lines or time specific no stopping areas has been shared with CSPC. Councillors agreed further consideration of the areas is needed. Also to ask B&NES to discuss with the local farmer who has issues turning farm machinery into fields on either side of the road due to parked cars outside the school. Highways advice to be sought on best options, and to ask them to liaise with Chew Valley School, the Rugby Club and Chew Medical Practice.

<u>National Grid</u> need to replace a telegraph pole close to the ford/Pilgrims Way. CSPC has objected to the proposed location. This will be a larger steel pole. National Grid are still looking at options including an underground solution, but this is likely to be too costly. Awaiting further details.

The newly formed Chew Valley Flood Group, (part of CV Area Forum), is looking at ways to disseminate information about flooded and blocked roads when there are travel issues. They are also creating a map to show where roads regularly flood and are meeting with Dan Parr from B&NES to highlight areas in the hope some of these are blocked drains and can be resolved over the summer, before the next winter.

Chew Stoke Church School and CSPC are working together and discussing access to the school when the ford is flooded. Various walking route options have been suggested, B&NES Footpath Officer has said the footpath to Stoke Hill could be improved if this option was pursued. Parking solutions would need to be considered. Advised the ford is not flooding any higher than it has in the past, but it is more frequent, causing increased number of school day closures. The frequency is considered to be climate change related, but CSPC are keen to work with the school to see if alternative solutions can be found to prevent closures.

The true story of Sir Nicholas 'Nicky' Winton, a young London broker who, in the months leading up to World War11, rescued 669 predominately Jewish children from the Nazis. Nicky visited Prague in December 1938 and found families who had fled the rise of the Nazis in Germany and Austria living in desperate conditions with little or no shelter or food, and under the threat of Nazi invasion. Fifty years later, it's 1988 and Nicky lives haunted by the fate of the children he wasn't able to bring to safety in England: always blaming himself for not doing more. However, surprise events help him to come to terms with the guilt and grief he had carried for five decades—starring Anthony Hopkins and Johnny Flynn.

In April we enjoyed an informative talk from Charlotte Brockley on her herd of Alpacas.

An amusing detail I learned when I visited her was that when alpacas give birth it is called "unpacking" and she also told us of a current problem which was birds pulling out the precious alpaca fibre for their nests!

May brought us Martin Grass, Chairman of the Mendip Cave Rescue, giving us an insight of the difficulties of rescuing

injured people many miles down a cave structure. By the time the alert has been raised it could take 6 hours to reach the casualty and even more to return to the surface allowing for careful handling through difficult narrow passages. However Mendip have a good record of success and this self-funded voluntary organisation was one of the first to be formed in the country.



In May also, twelve members enjoyed a very interesting visit to the American Museum, where Gill Beard, took us through the centuries from 1600's to 1800's describing the style of quilting and decoration at that time, what people wore, what materials they had to work with, the style of furniture and what they ate — squirrel pie and turtle soup were some of the least appealing! A most enjoyable outing, added to by the bonus of Helen and the Blagdon mini-bus taking any stress out of driving.

We have another outing planned on **Sat. 22nd June 11.a.m. - 4p.m to the Wirth & Hauser Gallery at Bruton.** As well as the modern art gallery there is a large perennial garden, highly recommended. 
