From the Rector

Dear Friends,

Over the next few weeks many of us will begin the dreaded annual chore of Spring Cleaning. The brightness and freshness of this time of year encourages us to sort out the clutter that we have accumulated in the dark corners and cupboards over the past few months—or even longer!—ready for even sunnier seasons ahead.

Deciding what to keep and what to recycle isn't anyone's favourite task, but nonetheless it's an important one.

The same can be said for this time of year in the church: the season of **Lent** which begins on **Ash Wednesday**, 2nd March 2022. During this season we are reminded that it's not just our homes and physical lives that need to be sorted out. Our spiritual lives need attention and refreshment too.

Lent is a season which allows us to pause and take a fresh look at our lives; a time to get rid of the things that are a hindrance to us and spoil our relationship with God, and to make room for what really matters. What are the thoughts and experiences that we are allowing to weigh us down? Do we really need to hold on to them? Are these burdens serving any purpose? What are the bad spiritual habits that are surplus to requirements, cluttering up valuable space in our hearts?

Lent challenges us to make these difficult decisions so we can declutter and make room in our lives for God.

Christians respond to this special season in several ways. Traditionally, Lent was a time for giving things up; a time of penance and self-denial in which we would try to go without our favourite treats, or to cut down on things we really enjoyed.

More recently, Christians have responded positively to the season of Lent by taking something up. You might feel moved to give generously to a good cause during this time, allowing the discipline of regular giving to make a real difference to the lives of others. You might use Lent as an opportunity to deepen your faith by joining a bible study such as our series on St Mark's Gospel (details elsewhere in this Magazine). Likewise, you might make a special effort to be present in church each Sunday, or challenge yourself to pray more regularly.

All these things can make a positive impact on our lives this Lent, preparing our hearts and minds so that we can rejoice with our risen Saviour at the empty tomb on Easter Day.

The Promise of New Life

"Lord, when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you?"

For any would be follower of Jesus, the teaching in Matthew 25 is surely some of the most challenging in the whole of the New Testament. What sort of disciples are we called to be? Will the world recognise Christ in us both in our words and in our actions?

Faced with persecution, with the temptation to instant popularity and self-aggrandisement, Jesus remains true to himself and to his call to be a servant leader. This, he says, is what is required of anyone who would follow me: "to love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself".

While we may talk a great deal about being a welcoming Church, the reality is much harder to achieve. To welcome is not to want the stranger to become just like us. It's about valuing the gifts they bring and about being willing to be changed ourselves by the new life coming among us. It begins, as Jesus began, by seeking to serve the stranger's needs and, to do that, we first have to listen.

Some of the harshest of Jesus' words were directed to the religious people of his day, too occupied with their own agendas, their own self-righteousness, to notice the stranger in their midst. It is only when we are prepared to leave the security of our own home, "launching out into the deep", going onto the other's territory, can we begin to feel just how strange and at times threatening the community of faith can be to the outsider.

Lent, with its invitation to de-clutter our busy lives, brings also the promise of new life. Let's use this God-given time to pray that our hearts and the life of our communities may be opened such that we can truly welcome the stranger as a sister or brother in Christ.

Did you know that if your item is available on Amazon Click & Collect you can select this often free service and have your parcel delivered to your local PO Counter for collection at a time convenient to you whilst the Counter is open:

Mon-Fri 09.00-13.00, 14.00-16.30 Sat 09.00-12.00.

The service is also utilised by other retailers offering the Royal Mail "Local Collect" service.

This can save you time and cost, as some click and collect deliveries are not chargeable. Your delivery goes through the Royal Mail Network, using existing delivery vehicles, reducing the need for additional White Van Man Deliveries and their subsequent congestion and pollution. Importantly, Your Post Office receives a small fee for each transaction, which improves the viability of this essential service. In addition Amazon improves its green credentials and sometimes markets Click & Collect Transactions with special discounts.

You will receive an email from Amazon when your parcel is ready for collection, together with the information required to enable collection, making the whole system seamless and secure. So why not give it a try?

Avon Wildlife Trust - Chew Valley Group: Thursday 24 March

Swifts - A Life On The Wing an illustrated talk by Peter Bright.

Peter is a retired biology school-teacher with a wide interest in wildlife, particularly butterflies, birds and glow-worms. Peter's house has hosted swift nests since 2006 and, using cameras, he has been able to follow their successes and failures over the years. In this talk Peter shares with us what he has discovered about the life-history of these extraordinary birds.

Winford Parish Council Meeting - Monday 17 January 2022

Open Forum: A member of the public raised local residents' objections to planning application 21/P/3412/FUL, which was discussed later in the meeting. A resident explained that she was in the process of obtaining evidence that the Urban Link Footpath had been in continuous use for twenty years, to assist the Parish Council in applying for the route to be added to the definitive map. It was agreed to investigate whether any of the former hospital staff would be able to certify to having used the path in question prior to the estate being built.

Concern was raised about a possible change of use of land at High Winford, and it was agreed to write to the last known landowner seeking further information. The Clerk would seek advice from North Somerset Council (NSC) planners about the difference between farmland and garden, and when permission was needed for a change of use.

A resident informed the Parish Council that she was in talks with North Somerset Council (NSC) about the possibility of diverting or extinguishing footpath LA7/3/10 (off Littleton Lane). The Chair responded that the Parish Council's position remained as agreed at their meeting in October 2021, ie that the path should be reopened. Any alternative proposals would be considered as part of the usual consultation process.

Highways and footpaths: NSC had agreed to look at the condition of the carriageway between Lower Strode and Manor Farms. It was agreed that the Clerk would speak to the Highways Officer about the broken cattle grid on West Lane.

Enforcements: The Parish Council's complaint about a mirror on Elwell Lane had been passed to Highways for consideration. The Clerk would provide NSC with photographs of the late-night lighting at the Cattle market.

Felton Common: The Felton Common Working Party had raised concerns about possible deepening of the depression at the probable bell pit, near the top of Long Lane. It was agreed that a Parish Councillor would take a look and report back. It was agreed that the current bin emptying schedule was appropriate to the level of use, and didn't further require monitoring, for the time being.

Compost site/allotments: A letter had been sent to NSC setting out the expenditure the Parish Council had incurred since the last claim. It was expected that NSC would cover these costs. A decision regarding the future methodology for recycling credits was still awaited. In the meantime, green waste was building up again and needed to be dealt with on an on-going basis. It was agreed that it made financial sense to pay for loads of green waste to be removed from the site, rather than to pay twice, once for it to be stacked and then again for it to be removed.

A member of the Footpaths Working Party had confirmed that the height of the stile at the new steps was within acceptable parameters. NSC had been asked to take the next steps to apply for diversion of the footpath. The proliferation of signage at the compost site would be reviewed once the footpath process was concluded.

Airport parking/airport: A meeting had been programmed with the Airport and NSC to discuss possible solutions to airport related parking issues. At the Airport Consultative Committee, the Parish Council's representative would raise the apparent closure of the shuttle bus stop outside Lulsgate House, because this would mean that the free waiting zone was no longer conveniently serviced by the bus to the terminal. Budget and Precept: The Finance Group had worked on a draft budget for 2022/23 but concluded that, due to ongoing uncertainties about the composting scheme, its finalisation should be deferred until the situation was clearer. A recommendation that a precept of £28,500 (an increase of £1000/3.4%) should be set for 2022/23 was approved. It was also agreed that the council should write to North Somerset about the council's inability to set a budget due to the problems regarding the financing of green waste schemes.

Any other urgent business: A Councillor raised the late hour of the beacon lighting for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee (9.45pm) because this would make it less of a family event. It was noted that the beacons were intended to be lit simultaneously across the country, after sunset. Various other events to mark the occasion were in the early stages of planning and it was agreed to look into the possible purchase of a small souvenir to be distributed to local school children. The hedges at Walton Crescent play area had still not been cut back by the contractor and it was agreed to chase him again. There were two holes in the play surface that needed attention.
