

Letter from our Vicar, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

One of the greatest joys and privileges of being a priest is getting to know those who are preparing for **Holy Baptism** or a **Christening** (two different words for the same thing!). Within our tradition in the Church of England, most candidates for baptism—but by no means all!—are babies or infants. This means there is a huge responsibility placed on the parents and Godparents of the person being baptised to ensure that they are brought up in the Christian faith. Babies cannot speak for themselves, feed themselves or defend themselves, so they need the love, nurture and protection of their family to ensure their physical wellbeing. The same can be said for their spiritual welfare—they need the prayers and guidance of their parents and Godparents to lead them along the right path until they can make their own decisions. They need their family to read the bible to them, to pray with them and for them, and to lead them by example.

The church recognises this responsibility at Holy Baptism by asking serious questions of the parents and Godparents. Three times they are asked to turn away from what is wrong, and three times they are asked to turn towards Jesus, to accept him and follow him. It is a powerful moment which signifies the beginning of new life in Jesus. Our old life of sin has been washed away, and we are born again to live for God.

There are many baptisms planned across the churches in Chew Valley West over the coming months, so please do pray for those who are preparing for this important, life-changing event. Perhaps you are already a Godparent. If so, take time to pray for the person entrusted into your spiritual care, whatever age they may be now! And remember that no one makes this spiritual journey alone, but with the support and love of the church.

After his Resurrection, Jesus instructs his apostles to 'go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit' (Matthew 28: 19–20). Notice what Jesus says. He does not say to his apostles, 'go and make **converts** of all [people]', but to go and make **disciples**. There is an important difference, here. A disciple is someone who journeys alongside you; someone who walks **with** you and supports you, not someone who confronts you with religion until you surrender!

One of those apostles whose Feast Day we celebrate at the very end of November is Saint Andrew. Apart from what we are told in Scripture we know very little about Andrew's life or ministry. His name has been associated with Scythia, Thrace and Greece, and it has been said that he suffered martyrdom at Patros in Achaia on a diagonally shaped cross. According to one legend his bones were finally laid to rest at Fife, thus his recognition as Scotland's Patron Saint since 1320.

Holy Scripture gives us three important facts about Andrew: 1. He brought his brother, Peter, to Jesus (Saint John 1: 40-42). Continued overleaf;

2. In the story of the feeding of the 5,000 (Saint John 6: 8-9) Andrew brought the young boy to Jesus. 3. In Saint John 12: 20-22 we read that Andrew brought the Greeks to Jesus.

What do you notice? On each of these occasions Andrew is introducing someone else *to* Jesus. This is our duty as Christians, to be true disciples of Jesus by bringing others to him. We do this not by standing in front of others, but by walking alongside them; by journeying with them.

If you feel your journey is leading you to consider Holy Baptism, I would be delighted to talk to you at any time.



Meeting on 7th October:

Village shop: (public participation) 18 members of the public attended this month's Parish Council meeting to discuss the absence of the village shop. There is a strong feeling amongst the residents that the village needs a shop, and many would benefit from it, from school age children to the elderly, who can't drive to other villages. It would be the focal meeting point of the village.

The Parish Council was presented with a petition containing 178 signatures from a group of parishioners, which asks the Parish Council to ensure B&NES enforce the planning permission to provide a shop on the site.

The shop is currently not being marketed, the current shop front does not conform to planning permission and needs to be corrected. A new frontage is on order.

Another group of residents have approached the owners to express an interest in renting the premises for a community shop enterprise.

The Parish Council is very keen to see a shop back in the village.

The owners have stated that there is a waiting list of interest to rent the shop.

Parish Council plans to investigate applying to register the shop as a Community Asset. **Addressing flooding issues:** Bristol & Avon River Trust (BART) are working locally to prevent flooding from agricultural land onto highways. They are building bunds to manage this, which will also help to prevent loss of valuable minerals being washed off the fields. If anyone knows of an area that would benefit from this, to contact Cllr Warrington.

Westaway fields & solar farm proposal -

PC currently awaiting feasibility study for solar option on part of the land.

Confirmed councillors able to attend an EGM on Thursday 21st Oct at 7pm which will enable Bath & West Community Energy (BWCE) to update councillors and the Westaway Field Working Group of their findings. PC keen to look at use of fields in the whole, so resolved not to arrange the public consultation until the Working Group are able to present their findings to the councillors at the December PC meeting on 2nd December.

Bristol Airport Expansion Inquiry – no update at present. The Inquiry is due to close in mid Oct with a decision likely in the New Year.

The Chew Valley Recreational Tail – work has started on the section from Woodford Lodge to the dam. Cllr Baker is in communication with representatives from B&NES and Bristol Water concerning the omission of an access point on Woodford Lane for residents of Chew Stoke. Cllr Warrington to forward concerns to B&NES.

The Queen's Green Canopy – marking the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in June 2022. – agreed to take part in this scheme. Cllr to liaise with "Chew Valley Needs Trees' group about what type of trees to source and where to plant them. PC to encourage residents to take part. Scheme is in conjunction with the Woodland Trust.




