

Letter from our Vicar, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

How do you define 'strength'? For some, having strength is about overcoming physical challenges—training to run a marathon, or pushing yourself to lift heavier weights in the gym, for example. For others, strength is something both emotional and mental—taking on the many challenges which life seems to throw at us.

Sometimes we surprise ourselves by showing just how strong we are in these moments. I am continually blessed by conversations with those of you who are living with an illness, or who have been bereaved, or shaken by some other circumstance, but who still find enormous reserves of strength to keep going. Our communities full of strong people who carry the weight of others, often in gentle unassuming ways and without thanks or acknowledgement. Family members, carers, those who work in our Health Service and for charities who serve our communities by giving strength to others. We should be grateful for them—the unsung strongmen & strongwomen in our communities!

With so much uncertainty in our world, it is easy to feel overwhelmed and weakened by fear. We have all been shocked by the recent escalation in the war in Ukraine, both in the dangerous rhetoric and the indiscriminate attacks on civilians. Many people are concerned about their finances this winter. Our national economy has been shaken recently, as have markets around the world as we face the reality of higher borrowing and higher prices.

To face the future without fear requires a source of strength. As Christians, we believe that source of strength is God. Let me share with you some powerful and reassuring verses from Isaiah 35:3 and 41:10.

Strengthen the weak hands and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, 'Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God'.

God says, 'fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand'.

God strengthens us by his presence—he is always with us. God encourages us by his own strength—he is stronger than any situation we might face. God calls us to have faith in him—when we do, we never walk alone.

I pray that you will find the strength to put your faith in God and allow him, in turn, to be your source of strength.



Bristol Road Shop Premises

You may have seen that the shop premises on Bristol Road are available to rent.

The results of the survey carried out last year suggested that there would be strong support for a well stocked village shop, to meet residents' needs without having to drive elsewhere. There is the hopeful possibility now that such a suitable shop business might take on the lease. In the event that this doesn't happen though, or that a different type of retail business takes on the lease, this could be a missed opportunity for our village. The survey carried out last year also showed strong support for a community shop which would stock a good range of everyday groceries and household items, using local produce where possible. There are many benefits of a community shop to a village like ours, not least in helping to look out for everyone in our community, benefiting all ages. As it is now a year since we ran the survey, we need to again get a good sense of how many people would be willing to help make a community shop a viable proposition. This will include setting it up, volunteer staffing, looking after the ongoing administration, providing funding, etc.

If we (as a community) want to make this happen, now is our opportunity to do so. Unless we are comfortable that there is sufficient support in the village, we will not be able to put forward a financially viable proposal.

Hedges - Chew Stoke Parish Council have received comments that there are hedges in the village that are overhanging pavements or walking routes and creating a hazard by forcing walkers into the road. It is specifically a problem in Pilgrims Way, Church Lane, Bristol Road and School Lane. If you have a hedge on the border of your property that is impacting on a pavement, path or road, please can you arrange for it to be cut back as soon as possible.

Road across the dam - CSPC have now received a report about the road layout across the dam and B&NES have arranged to improve the signage and road markings. CSPC to feedback their views about the report following the next meeting.

St Andrew's churchyard – a request has been received from the PCC to transfer the maintenance of St Andrew's churchyard pursuant to S215 of the Local Government Act to the Parish Council. The PC is permitted to ask that B&NES undertake the maintenance, and this course of action has been requested.

Church Hall - The hall lease process remains with the Charities Commission. In the meantime, the current Management Committee have met to ensure that everything else will be in place for the Parish Council to take over the Hall management when the time comes.

Parking issues in the village – Cllrs have met with Stefan Chiffers from B&NES to discuss various highway issues. Drivers are asked <u>not</u> to park opposite the Walley Court Lane junction by The Stoke, or on pavements, this is causing a hazard to road users and pedestrians. More '20' and '30' markings are to be added to the roads.

Cost of living crisis - Various grants and means of help are available to residents of B&NES to help with home improvements etc, specifically during the cost-of-living crisis. The PC is sharing the information as widely as possible, please use this service as a first point of contact if you need help: https://communitywellbeinghub.co.uk

Happy Box – the electricity supply from the solar arrangement is not sufficient to light the old phone box, a new supply from WPD has been agreed and will be installed soon.

A Community Speedwatch application has been submitted. We have 6 residents who have kindly agreed to volunteer, but more are very welcome, please contact the clerk if interested: clerk@chewstoke.org.uk

Bus services - WECA recently held a meeting for residents to discuss the opportunities for bus services in the area, a well-attended meeting on the 31st August. Now considering the option for an orbital route around the valley linking up to the more frequent bus routes on the A37 and A38.
