Letter from our Rector, the Rev. Dr. Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

In recent School Assemblies, Fran and I have been encouraging our young people to be... encouraging!

The children were able to share with us so many things about their friends, family and teachers that made them special and deserving of support. They told us they knew people who were gifted artists or talented at sport. We also heard about people who were special in other ways—maybe they were caring, or good listeners. We thought about how good it felt to be affirmed by others and ended by praying that God would help us all be encouragers of others this year at school.

Maybe it's easier to be an encourager of others at that young age. As we get older, it can sometimes feel like we need to be in competition with others. Our jobs, and the expectations of society can make us feel like that. Encouraging others can become risky—what if doing so shows a vulnerability or weakness? What if our well-meaning, encouraging words are not well received?

The Bible places a lot of importance on encouraging others—particularly some of the letters in the New Testament which were written to the first Christians around 2000 years ago. In the letter to the Hebrews we read, 'let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another'. In his first letter to the Thessalonians, Saint Paul gives us the simple instruction, '…encourage one another and build each other up'.

That sums up what encouraging others is all about. It's not just about me; rather it is about building each other up. In our communities there are so many people worthy of our encouragement and support. This month, why not think about those Bible verses and offer a word or two to build them up and spur them on? 

- 1.Village Hall lease The Trust Deed and lease agreement had been circulated to all councillors prior to the meeting, ClIr Read asked councillors present for any comments regarding the documents. The council agreed unanimously to proceed to sign the lease and Trust Deed, with a view to formally becoming Custodian Trustees at the beginning of October. The summary of legal fees to date has been received, currently £4450+VAT following a reduction of £300.
- 2.CPSC discussed the ongoing parking issues around the village, at the July meeting it had been agreed to request double yellow lines (DYL) at the entrance to Home Orchard. The issues here are primarily caused for 2 short periods of the day during school drop-off and pick-up. Since the July meeting CSPC was advised to submit an application for all DYLs within the parish at one time. Previous discussions about other locations had been discussed but not pursued. Agreed that DYLs are ineffective if there is no enforcement. Agreed to the following action points: to make contact with the school to discuss improving traffic/parking etc; to review the map of the village used previously to mark-up potential sites for DYLs; to consider issues with displacement if DYLs are introduced, liaise further with the schools.
- 3.The phone line to report airport noise has been discontinued, any incidents now need to be reported via the airport's website. Posters with this information are on the parish noticeboards. Reasons for deviation and noise over Chew Stoke is normally due to congestion or weather.
- 4. Update on the shop rental Cllr Baker spoke to the rental management company again recently and the rental agreement is still progressing.
- 5.Update on Rectory Field Cllr Baker met with Matt Bennett recently and noted that the ash trees that they had concerns about are looking healthy and better than expected. There are a small number that still need to be cut down, Cllr Baker to ask for specific action plan, and then clerk to source quotes from 3 suppliers for the work.
- 6.Update on the Recreational Trail Kirsty Dunford from Bristol Water (BW) attended the meeting and gave a brief update about the Trail. She is responsible for public access to BW lakes. B&NES is responsible for the trail which is on BW land. The plan was for the trail to be run by a Trust after the first 12 months of it opening, this is still in progress. B&NES are looking at plans to extend the Recreational Trail to the south of the lake, and some ecological surveys are currently being undertaken. CSPC thanked Kirsty Dunford for attending the meeting and are keen to cultivate closer working relationships with BW. Also noted that there are grants available from BW for up to £250 for projects in the area.

A few months ago, we asked for more volunteers to help keep our lovely churchyard tidy and welcoming to all.

Sadly, there was no response. We are all busy people, but the grass doesn't stop growing! For some time, we have had just a few hardworking helpers. The Tovey family from the Clutton area, and Chris and Linda Pillinger from Keynsham.

I try to keep the area around the entrances looking tidy, together with Keith living just opposite. Finally we have Peter Caple and Nigel Roberts, absolute stalwarts. A splendid great duo, they cleared a long neglected area and now maintain the vast majority of the churchyard. Recently they inveigled the Stoke Inn maintenance team into clearing an uncontrolled area of brambles, thorns, ant hills. We are so grateful to Lee Laskenko for funding that essential work.

Now, as we come to the end of the season, at least one of the team has to retire. Without some younger helpers, we shall have to employ a contractor. Expensive!

Personally I find it very rewarding: clearing a small patch, and often chatting to folk visiting relatives graves, always expressing their appreciation of the efforts made. All it takes is a little time, about an hour a week in the summer, fine weather, and a bit of energy – lucky if they all coincide!




