From the Rector

Dear Friends,

Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II included in her twenty-first birthday message the following promise:

I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong. But I shall not have strength to carry out this resolution alone unless you join in it with me, as I now invite you to do: I know that your support will be unfailingly given. God help me to make good my vow, and God bless all of you who are willing to share in it.

As we come to terms with news of her death, and the Accession of King Charles III, we can do so sounding notes of both sorrow and thanksgiving. It is right and proper that, as a nation and as local communities, we have observed a period of mourning. At the time of writing these notes, Books of Condolences are in each of the five churches in our group of parishes, providing a focus for our villages; a place to be still, pray, and express our sorrow. Queues stretching for over five miles have formed in London as people wish to pay respects as The Queen Lies in State. Plans and rehearsals are underway for Her Late Majesty's State Funeral on Monday 19th September—it promises to be a deeply moving and memorable occasion.

While we take time to mourn, it is equally important that we say Thank You. Those two words have appeared in almost every entry in our Books of Condolences. Thanksgiving seems to be the overarching sentiment which we wish to express to Her Late Majesty for fulfilling the vow she made when she turned 21; for her dedication and example of service; for her strong Christian witness and devotion to Almighty God.

Thanksgiving is a sentiment which sometimes comes easy to us as Christians. It is easy to say Thank You to God when life is going the way we would wish. Of course, it is not so easy to say thanks when life is difficult. These times are a real test of our faith and trust in God.

But the Bible reassures us that there is a time and a season for everything (Ecclesiastes 3: 1–8). Take some time to read these words and be reassured that every changing season in our lives is still under God's control.

May we be inspired and encouraged by our Late Queen to trust in God at all times—to put the example of Jesus Christ at the centre of everything that we do. To trust in him, our Heavenly King, as our source of strength and courage.

The Same Yesterday, Today and Forever

Many of us know well Bob Dylan's song 'The Times They Are A-Changin'. Was it written with us in mind? None of us could have predicted the changes that we have seen in 2022. The death of our beloved Queen Elizabeth, the accession of a new King, a war in Ukraine, a cost-of-living crisis. None of these were on the cards as we made our new year's resolutions on the 1st of January.

Yet happen they have. And whether we like it or not, we're forced to agree with Bob Dylan's lyrics that the times are indeed changing. What can see us though these days?

A phrase that's often used about the period through which we're going is 'unprecedented'. I'm not sure it's entirely valid! Previous generations have faced situations as challenging or more than ours — seasons of plagues, wars, famines and conquest. The times in which the New Testament was written were, for its writers, periods of profound uncertainty. Its writers faced violence and vulnerability, conflict and dispute. Yet into their times they were able to speak words of hope, confidence and assurance.

One such phrase that stands out for me is a line from the letter to the Hebrews. Hebrews was written in response to a time of persecution and the possibility of people falling back from the faith as a result. Into its time and ours, the writer of the letter makes an extraordinary claim: 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever.' (Hebrews 13:8)

Just imagine! The one who walked in Galilee has been there for his people throughout time, is with us now, and will be whatever the future may hold.

So respectfully, I have to disagree with Bob Dylan. In his song he tells us that in the face of times that are 'a-changin', we'd better start 'swimmin'. Much better than hyperactive splashing, I suggest, is to live out our vision to 'live and tell the story of Jesus'. For it's as we do so that we can hold fast to the one who is constant and unchanging, who holds us always in the palm of his hands; Jesus Christ who is 'the same yesterday, today and forever.'

home side in touch and, despite a middle order wobble, after the team had passed 150, it went down to final over and with 4 needed off 2 balls: sadly it proved to be 2 too many.

Barrow's young captain, Frank Forge, having led the side for 4 years decided to resign the captaincy after a season plagued by injury. However, he was able to lead the side to a convincing win over Timsbury in the final league game of the season. His 4/39 was instrumental in reining in the Timsbury score after a good opening stand and, with fellow off spinner Nick Heal taking 4/41, Barrow were left chasing 192 to win.

Kieran Owen made his third successive half century (60) and alongside Jason Cryans (62) put on 120 for the first wicket. Mark Brown (20) and Bernie Forge (22) helped Josh Yelland (19 not out) see the team home to a final victory and third place in Division 5.
