Letter from our Rector, the Rev Dr Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

In the Church Calendar we are about to enter the season of Lent. For some of us that word might stir memories of giving things up—or taking things up—for a season. When I was young, Lent was taken seriously at home, at church and in school. We knew that when the final treats had been consumed on Shrove Tuesday it would be a long forty days until we could unwrap our first Easter Eggs.

It is true that the origins of Lent involve sacrifice and self-denial. The period of forty days and nights recalls the time Jesus chose to spend in the wilderness facing hunger and temptation before he began his ministry. As such, Christians should take Lent seriously as a time of penitence—an opportunity to pause and to put right our relationship with God by seeking his forgiveness for what we have done and left undone.

But we lose something of the meaning of Lent if we focus solely on this aspect. The word Lent itself is derived from the Anglo-Saxon *lencten*, meaning 'Spring'. So, at the heart of Lent isn't gloom and misery, but something to do with new life; the promise of darkness giving way to light, chilly winds to the warmth of summer and barren hedgerows to full bloom.

For this reason Lent became an opportunity for new Christians to prepare for new life through the water of Baptism—or to recall the promises made at their Baptism. In so doing they were seeking new life in Jesus, just as the changing of the seasons revived the world around them.

I hope that these lengthening, warming days of Lent can help us prepare to celebrate that same life which burst from the empty tomb on that first Easter Day.

Community Projects & Initiatives

New Bleed Kit for the Village – CSPC agreed to purchase a second bleed kit , it will be installed at the Village Hall. The Parish Council is exploring a third kit for the north of the village.

Housing Needs Survey – CSPC are considering whether to undertake a survey to assess local housing needs for the village. Awaiting further information.

Community Bloom 2025 – The village is entering again! Deadline: 30th March. Local groups are encouraged to join, and enter the 'In Your Neighbourhood' categories. **BioBlitz Event** – Plans to work with Chew Valley School EcoClub to organise an event focused on local biodiversity.

Road Safety & Traffic Updates

Community Speedwatch – Volunteers are ready to restart the initiative. Looking into acquiring Autospeedwatch cameras.

Vehicle Activated Signs (VAS) – B&NES has new signs available on rotation. Parish Council has requested signs for five key locations, including Stoke Hill and Pagans Hill.

Bristol Road Crossing Improvements – Work is complete. The project enhances pedestrian safety, particularly for schoolchildren. *CSPC are aware that some concerns have been raised within the community. Below is a bit of background and explanation which might help to answer some of the queries raised.*

For some time CSPC have been in dialogue with B&NES about how best to create a safer crossing point for Bristol Road, for school children, shoppers, and all residents walking in the village. CSPC have also been liaising with the Primary School. The PC and the School are encouraging parking for school drop off in Bilbie Road, hence making a crossing around the shop/Quarry Hay area.

B&NES confirmed they had funding available for this and came up with a proposal which they discussed with CSPC.

CSPC also asked for comments from the community and one or two communications were received - all around the theme of not wanting too much built environment / street lighting etc.

A Zebra Crossing was proposed by B&NES, but this would require street lighting in that area, CSPC decided we did not want due to the impact on dark sky policy etc.

A plan was agreed upon which meant a narrower crossing point and a different colour surface on the road, but no street lighting.

The PC requested the lowered kerb to be on the North side of Quarry Hay, but B&NES explained that this was not possible as it was too close to the traffic calming section of road. This is why the dropped kerb is on the South (The Stoke) side of Quarry Hay. B&NES also specified bollards to be included in the plan to prevent pavement parking in key areas that affect sight lines for pedestrians when using the crossing point. The only request that CSPC made was that this should include bollards on the north side of Quarry Hay (opposite the shop) as there has been a persistent problem with parking on this (pedestrian) area. **PTO for further info.** **PC Report Contd**. CSPC were also keen to ensure that any bollards were the same quality and appearance as bollards already around the village (Pilgrims way /School Lane and in the traffic calming zone).

Legal parking in the village has not been affected by this scheme or the bollards. They simply prevent illegal (pavement) parking and parking on junctions. As such they have made use of the crossing point safer (better sight lines) and ensured constant pavement access for buggies, wheelchairs etc.

Overall CSPC understand people's concerns around changes to the environment but feel that the B&NES plan as now implemented has made a positive contribution to safety, particularly for school traffic, at the same time as having the least possible impact on the environment and feel of our rural village.

PCAA Meetings – Cllr Read will attend future meetings as the council representative. **Recreational Trail** – Discussions ongoing with Bristol Water regarding a blocked drain at Woodford Lane.

Village Tidiness – A request to all residents & visitors to help keep the village clean. Community Bloom will take an active role in encouraging tidiness around public areas.






