Letter from our Rector, the Rev Dr Ian Mills

Dear Friends,

June is the month in which the Church celebrates its 'birthday'. In the New Testament we read that fifty days after Easter, the Apostles had gathered in Jerusalem when suddenly they experienced the Holy Spirit among them in the form of a violent wind and tongues of fire. Everyone present was filled with the power of this mysterious Holy Spirit. They found they could speak in new languages and felt compelled to go out into the world and share the good news of the risen Jesus (you can read the full account in Acts 2: 1–13).

As we approach the Feast of Pentecost 2025 on Sunday 8th June, we might be encouraged by new church attendance figures which have just been released. According to the Church of England's latest Statistics for Mission (its annual census), regular worshippers have increased to over 1.02 million, marking the fourth consecutive year of growth.

I am pleased that we are seeing some of this encouraging trend reflected locally in our churches here in the Chew Valley. Each of our six parishes have welcomed new members this year. There are times during the year, like Christmas, when we are exceptionally busy; but the overall trend is one of new people of all ages seeking to come and worship as part of a congregation. On Easter Day 2025, some 180 people were present at our services.

Of course, church attendance on Sundays is only part of the picture. We are blessed with a strong Christian presence in our two Church of England Primary Schools. In January we welcomed Verity Eastwood Dewing as our Flourish Chaplain working two days per week with the students at Chew Valley School. We offer choirs, concerts, space for prayer; a Christian presence in life events such as baptism, weddings and funerals; hospitality; this (free) magazine! Being part of that same Church, which the Holy Spirit inspired on the Day of Pentecost two thousand years ago, now involves relationship, partnership and community—so much more than what happens inside our church buildings.

There are challenges too, of course. The expense of maintaining historic church buildings is enormous. Our PCCs are charities run by a small number of local volunteers who carry a considerable burden on a few shoulders. But Pentecost serves as a timely reminder of our calling to mission and evangelism. As the disciples were empowered by the Holy Spirit to spread the Gospel, so too are we invited to share the love and message of Jesus Christ with those around us. The growth in church attendance is not merely a statistic but a testament to the transformative power of faith and community.

We should be inspired by the Pentecost story to continue our mission with renewed vigour. So, let us pray for the continued growth of our congregations and for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in all our endeavours.

The Bells at Nempnett

As most of you will be aware, the bells in Nempnett Church were removed last year by Matthew Higby and Co., to be re-tuned and for a new frame to be made in the tower to hang them.

Work on them is progressing and we are looking forward to their return to the tower shortly.

Meanwhile we have had this encouraging report from Martin Brian Hough:

"The end of another week working at Matthew Higby and Co, and the new frame for Nempnett Thrubwell, Somerset, is complete, along with the headstocks for the front five bells, as we are still waiting for the hollow section for the tenor's headstock to arrive.



We can say that this "grillage and pedestal" frame was a lot easier and quicker to build than the last frame we had set up in the workshop."

Ben has worked his magic on the bells, transforming them from a poor sounding ring into a melodious six, using the latest soundbow reprofiling technique, which are sure to become popular with peal ringers given the remote location of the church! Rosemary Porter

Two Parish Councillor vacancies - Carol Dyer and Ali Cunningham have both recently resigned from the Parish Council creating 2 vacancies. CSPC wish to thank them both for all their help and hard work during their time as Councillors and wish them well in the future. If any resident or eligible person is interested in becoming a councillor, please contact the Clerk for more information.

Housing Needs Survey - CSPC are considering undertaking a Housing Needs Survey in Chew Stoke. B&NES will investigate what practical and financial help they can provide us with. Chew Stoke is classified as a "sustainable village" which means it has enough key amenities available and could be put forward for housing development. The Local Plan currently suggests a 5% increase which would equate to another 20 houses over the lifetime of the plan. This could be in the form of a new development and infill. A housing needs survey would provide valuable information about what the village would like, (eg: more smaller properties), and enable the Parish Council to influence decisions on behalf of residents.

Community Bloom 2025 – thank you to Cllr Ainger for arranging a very successful Bioblitz event in Rectory Field recently, it was attended by Primary School children and residents. 356 observations were noted and 198 different species recorded. The village will be judged in July.

Community Speedwatch initiative is due to restart in the parish. If you'd like to volunteer, please contact the Clerk. Issues continue with bikes speeding around Herons Green area, residents advised to log with A&S Police using the 101 service. CSPC to look at purchasing cameras to address persistent speeding in the village and surrounding roads. **Please turn over**

list of important artists is long, extending to post WWII "moderns".




