Some of you will recall the controversy around the Andrew Lloyd-Webber and Tim Rice musical *Jesus Christ Superstar* when it was first staged in the early 1970s. Productions in the West End, Broadway and around the world attracted protests from religious groups, who felt the portrayal of the final days of Jesus as a rock opera was blasphemous, and some of the content too loosely based on the Passion Story as found in the Gospels. When I was a student in Belfast in the early 2000s a touring production of *Superstar* still managed to attract some protesters some 30 years after its first run—that's the sort of publicity you can't buy!

I have seen *Superstar* and have concluded that for all the negative attention it might have attracted over the years, it does remind us of one important aspect of the Holy Week story which we might otherwise lose—that Jesus Christ would not allow Himself to be a 'superstar' despite the efforts of the powerful religious and political systems which closed-in on Him during the last week of His life.

We forget how tempted Jesus must have been to display His true power—to end the argument over who He was once and for all. We forget how tempted Jesus must have been to take on the mantle of a 'superstar', with all the trappings of celebrity that the Son of God might have deserved. But we don't have to look far in our world to see this sort of 'easy' power and its rewards—the sort of power which deceives, bullies and corrupts.

Easter reminds us of the true nature of God's power. It reminds us that the same God who created the universe entered Jerusalem on a humble donkey. Easter reminds us that same all-powerful Son of God wept in the Garden of Gethsemane as His friends betrayed and deserted Him. Easter reminds us that power doesn't come with wearing a golden crown, but a crown of thorns.

At Easter, the power of love and hope took on death and won. That same all-powerful, living Jesus calls us into ever-deeper relationship with Him, not because of who He is, but because of what He has done for us.

Electoral Roll Revision

This is the church's register of electors which enables you to vote on church matters, to attend the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, and to stand for election to the PCC. You can be a full and active member of our churches without joining the Roll, but becoming a member does help the church to show its strength, enables you to be in touch with the church, to play your part in decision making, and enables you to apply for a Parish Card to give you free access to Wells Cathedral outside service times.

To join you need to be 16 or over, baptised, and living in one of the parishes.

Bishop's Letter

'God is good...all the time!'

When I was a priest in Nottingham, I remember thinking that as a parish we seemed to reflect more on the story of the crucifixion of Christ rather than His resurrection. Ours was a parish which had many personal stories of loss and suffering, of challenge and trial, and sometimes this made it difficult to lift our faces to the horizon to see the triumph and glory beyond the grave.

As we approach Easter, I want to encourage us to take time to 'walk the way of the cross', to notice God's grace as we do so, even in the painful moments as well as keeping our eyes fixed on the coming glory.

As I write this, I am catching glimpses of the kingfisher on its perch outside my study window. Always a delight! It sits on the branch across the moat in stillness, watching for the sign of a fish before it suddenly dives and then crests the water with its prize. A splash of colour rarely seen by many. It fills me with hope and joy, two gifts which I think Easter inspires.

Walking through Lent we are continually called to become conscious of our mortality and are reminded of the price Jesus paid on our behalf. Giving Himself in death that we might have life. And we have that life because His death was not the end but the beginning of a new chapter, of life in all its fulness.

So, whatever the circumstances of your life this Easter, allow yourself to fully recognise and experience the challenges but never lose the prospect of the glory to come!

Bristol Airport Expansion Plan *Will Affect You – Have Your Say*

Bristol Airport has plans to once again increase passenger numbers, this time to **15m** a year, adding 14,000 flights per annum. It will mean 1000's of extra night flights, more traffic and more pollution. Proposals for a longer runway will also mean larger and louder planes.

If you live in the vicinity of the airport, under the flight path, or on or near any routes to-and-from the airport, then these plans **will** affect you!

You can quickly and easily have your say by completing the BAAN (Bristol Airport Action Network) survey. BAAN are opposed to airport expansion but they would be grateful for your opinions, regardless of whether they are pro or anti expansion.

Parish Council News from Annemieke Waite, District Councillor

Big Changes Coming to Recycling & Waste Collections!

In this month's update I'd like to share with you some exciting updates which are on the way to make recycling easier and reduce black bin waste!

Did you know 45% of black bin waste could be recycled—much of it food waste? The Council earns money from recycling, including food waste. By recycling more, and keeping food waste out of our black bin, we reduce costs and increase income for our community, which can help the Council pay for vital services.

Introducing the Red Recycling Bag

In the next few weeks, you'll receive a new red recycling bag—bigger than the usual boxes and weighted to stay put on windy days. It secures with a Velcro strip to keep everything tidy. These bags have been a hit in other councils, and our trial showed residents love them!

A New 'Home' for Hard Plastic & Cans

The red bag is for hard plastics (like food trays) and cans. This means your two green recycling bins will now have clear roles—one for paper & cardboard, the other for glass. Sorting like this makes collection quicker and more efficient.

You can start using your red bag as soon as you get it! A leaflet inside will explain everything.

Coming Soon: The North Somerset Council App

Launching in April, our new North Somerset Council app will let you:

- Track waste & recycling collections
- Check what can/can't be recycled
- Get collection day reminders

At first, the app will focus on waste and recycling, but soon, you'll be able to report potholes, fly-tipping, and more!

Three-Weekly Black Bin Collections & Soft Plastics Recycling

Later this summer, black bin collections will move to **every three weeks**, and at the same time, we will also introduce **soft plastics recycling**, including plastic bags and wrapping such as crisp packets, film lids, pet food pouches and vegetable wrapping.

Winford Parish Council Meeting Date held: Monday 24th February 2025

Highways and Footpaths – Road Safety Improvements. It was noted that a community engagement event, organised by North Somerset Council (NSC) regarding road safety improvements in Winford, was due to take place on 25th February 2025. The Parish Council did not agree to purchase a mobile speed indicator device for Barrow Lane – given that NSC had stated the device would only be permitted to be in situ for a maximum of 2 weeks and it would not be able to return to the same location for 3 months.

Flooding, Winford. The Clerk had recently reported a number of blocked drains in the Parish, however, the drains remained blocked. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to NSC requesting an update on their progress with this matter, and would report the additional blocked drains on Old Hill.

Kingdown/New Road, Traffic and Speeding Concerns. A positive site meeting had taken place with representatives from the Parish Council, District Councillor Waite, and NSC's Executive Member for Highways. NSC will now be developing ideas on how they can improve the situation.

Other. It was noted that NSC would replenish grit bins at 40% capacity or less.

It was noted that a small number of residents had been emptying household waste into public litter bins. As a result of NSC's decision to remove the litter bins at Kingston Mead, High Street/Parsonage Lane and Upper Town Lane, and following recent adverts by the Parish Council seeking volunteers to empty them, a sufficient number of volunteers were not forthcoming. Due to limited funding, the Parish Council did not agree to fund this task. It was agreed that the Clerk would inform NSC that the Parish Council reluctantly agreed to their removal. The Parish Council would monitor the effect this would have on littering and review accordingly. It was agreed that the Clerk would notify residents of this decision via social media.

Planning. Three potential breaches of planning regulations in Felton had been brought to the attention of the Parish Council. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to NSC to report the potential breaches. A potential breach of planning regulations in Regil had been brought to the attention of the Parish Council. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to NSC to report the potential breach.

Felton Common. Concerns were raised that the Common continued to be used by a handful of businesses associated with airport parking. The Parish Council would remain vigilant and report any sightings of concern. A neighbouring landowner had notified the Parish Council that they had access rights over the Common. It was agreed that the Clerk would make further enquiries into this matter. It was noted that despite the placement of additional boulders, cars were still being parked on the grass. It was agreed that the placement of additional boulders would assist with this issue and the Parish Council would seek to source more for the location. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to the airport's contractors thanking them for the recent donation of boulders.

Airport. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to the airport to establish how they intended to respond to the comments they received from their recent 'Masterplan' consultation.

Following a meeting held in September 2024 with representatives of the Parish Council, senior members of NSC Highways Department, Avon and Somerset Police and Bristol Airport, to seek resolution to a number of problems raised, it was agreed that the Clerk would request a further meeting with all parties to seek an update. This had previously been arranged for January 2025 but due to key staff changes at the airport, the meeting had been postponed.

Compost Site and Allotments. It was noted that a fencing contractor was due to commence work at the compost site mid-late March. It was agreed that the Parish Council consented to Avon Probation Service publicising the work of the Community Payback scheme at Felton Allotments. It was agreed that smoking was permitted at the allotments provided any associated litter was removed from the site.

Parish Property. A member of the public had raised a number of queries regarding Parish owned trees at Winford Heights. It was noted that the Parish Council had recently commissioned a tree survey and this had identified remedial action. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to the member of public explaining that due to limited funding, priority had to be given to trees that required remedial action within 12 months. It was noted that the contractors instructed by the Parish Council had not yet finished their tree work. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to the contractors to establish what was outstanding. It was agreed that the wooden tunnel at Vee Lane Play Park would not be taken out of use, however this would continue to be monitored. It was agreed to investigate whether the gym equipment (rower) required maintenance and to instruct a contractor to resolve it if needed.

Any other business. A request had been made to pollard the willow tree on Winford village green, and outside Winford Church. The trees had not been included in the recent Tree Survey commissioned by the Parish Council. It was agreed that the Clerk would make enquiries to establish the ownership of the trees. It was noted that a hedge within the boundary of a property in Winford, which was believed to be empty and had recently been put up for sale, was causing an obstruction on the footpath. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to the Estate Agents to request that the hedge be appropriately maintained. It was brought to the attention of the Parish Council that an ash tree had started growing in Winford Brook. It was agreed that the Parish Council would investigate the matter. Concerns were raised regarding parking on the junction of Regil Lane/Chew Lane which was presenting a hazard to pedestrians and road users. The owners had not been identified. It was therefore agreed that the Clerk would write to the nearby property owners highlighting the Parish Council's concerns. Concerns were raised regarding brambles on the bend of Chew Lane, Winford, which presented a hazard to road users. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to the owner to request they be appropriately maintained. It was brought to the attention of the Parish Council that due to overgrown hedgerows, footpath LA3/24/10 was now impassible. It was agreed that the Clerk would bring this to the attention of NSC to seek a resolution. It was noted that NSC had commenced a Community Governance Review. More details would be released by NSC in the coming weeks.

Due to NSC pausing monthly notification updates of the electoral register, the distribution of Community Welcome packs was on hold. This was due to resume on 25th February 2025. It was agreed that the Clerk would review the process and resume distribution.
