From the Rector

Dear Friends,

In the Church Calendar we are about to enter the season of Lent. For some of us that word might stir memories of giving things up—or taking things up—for a season. When I was young, Lent was taken seriously at home, at church and in school. We knew that when the final treats had been consumed on Shrove Tuesday it would be a long forty days until we could unwrap our first Easter Eggs.

It is true that the origins of Lent involve sacrifice and self-denial. The period of forty days and nights recalls the time Jesus chose to spend in the wilderness facing hunger and temptation before he began his ministry. As such, Christians should take Lent seriously as a time of penitence—an opportunity to pause and to put right our relationship with God by seeking his forgiveness for what we have done and left undone.

But we lose something of the meaning of Lent if we focus solely on this aspect. The word Lent itself is derived from the Anglo-Saxon *lencten*, meaning 'Spring'. So, at the heart of Lent isn't gloom and misery, but something to do with new life; the promise of darkness giving way to light, chilly winds to the warmth of summer and barren hedgerows to full bloom.

For this reason Lent became an opportunity for new Christians to prepare for new life through the water of Baptism—or to recall the promises made at their Baptism. In so doing they were seeking new life in Jesus, just as the changing of the seasons revived the world around them.

I hope that these lengthening, warming days of Lent can help us prepare to celebrate that same life which burst from the empty tomb on that first Easter Day.

A season of renewal, and transformation

Lent is a time to draw closer to God and prepare us for the joy of Easter. As we fast, pray, and seek God's presence, we are reminded that true discipleship extends beyond ourselves. This year people across Bath and Wells are taking part in the Lent Cross Challenge, a simple daily focus in the 40 days leading up to Easter which aims to keep the Cross at the heart of Lent.

The Revd Bruce Faulkner says, "It gives us the opportunity for personal reflection. A chance to think more about the Cross, our Christian symbol, and to think of it not just as a symbol, but something that we're called to in deeper ways. We are not called to climb up onto a cross and be a martyr, but we are able to offer of ourselves in love to the Gospel.

Taking part in the Lent Cross Challenge gives us the opportunity to ask ourselves what the shape of our own cross might be. What 'shape' might it be for each of us, as we offer our souls and bodies as a living sacrifice sent in the power of the Spirit to live and work to the praise and glory of God."

There's so much we can do to bring this season home into our hearts. Read one of the Lent books available, take something up, commit to a regular time of prayer, find out about getting confirmed. Lent is a rich gift to us to go deeper into our Christian life, deepen our commitment to His work, and become vessels of His grace in the world around us.

As the days lengthen and the light comes, I encourage you to use this time to open yourself afresh to the One who comes to us afresh with new life at Easter - the risen Lord, Jesus Christ Himself.

Q. "Why are they called apartments when they are all stuck together?"

Winford Parish Council Meeting Date held: Monday 20th January 2025

Open Forum. One member of the public wished to raise concerns regarding the long standing issue of volume of traffic on Currells Lane, Felton. The chair acknowledged their concerns and the Parish Council supported proposals to resolve the issue.

Highways and Footpaths. A member of the public had queried logistics regarding the request for support to empty litter bins that had been earmarked for removal by NSC. It was noted that NSC were considering reducing the frequency of household waste collection. The Parish Council shared these concerns and noted that only one person had volunteered to assist with this task. The Clerk would write to NSC to ask if they would consider replacing the bins with dog bins, given that the majority contained dog waste.

Road Safety Improvements. A Community Engagement Evening that had been arranged by NSC on 14th January 2025 did not take place and was due to be re-scheduled. It was noted that inconsiderate and dangerous parking continued to be an issue outside Winford Primary School. The Clerk would ask local Police Community Support Officers to provide a visible presence outside the school at drop-off and pick-up times. The Parish Council shared concerns regarding speeding on Barrow Lane, the Clerk would write to NSC to ask them to review the matter.

Flooding, Winford A member of the public had raised questions regarding the request for volunteers to support with drain clearance. The Parish Council had anticipated volunteers would help to clear leaf debris from the drains and only basic equipment such as a shovel and bucket would be required. This was only to be completed if it was safe to do so. The Clerk had recently reported a number of blocked drains in the Parish. The Clerk would write to NSC for an update on their progress with this matter and report additional blocked drains at Barrow Lane.

Kingdown/New Road, Traffic and Speeding Concerns. A site meeting with residents of Kingdown, members of the Parish Council, and District Cllr Waite was still in the process of being arranged.

Community Speed Watch. It was noted that a mobile speed camera unit was frequently in position in nearby Parishes. The Clerk would write to the respective Clerks for advice on the application process.

Kingston Mead Footway. It was noted that NSC council have now consulted residents of Kingston Mead and will be excavating the paving slabs in the concerned areas, and replacing them with tarmac.

Felton Common. A neighbouring land owner was suspected to have been driving onto the Common to access their land. The Clerk would make enquires as to the owner and write to them requesting they cease doing so.

Airport. The Clerk would submit the Parish Council's response to the Airport Masterplan and a copy of this would be available on the Parish Council's website. It was noted that the smell of aviation fuel had been apparent in recent days and NSC had requested to be informed of its occurrence. The Clerk would ask residents to report this to both the Airport and NSC when the issue occurs. [see p13]

Compost Site & Allotments. A meeting had been held with the Probation Service who offered to provide a team of individuals, at no cost to the Parish Council, for one day every other week to assist with general maintenance and cultivation at Felton allotments, provided a toilet facility was available to them. It was agreed that this would take place on a two month trial basis.

Finance. The proposal to set a precept of £36,000 for 2025/26 was agreed unanimously.

This represents an increase of £4000 from the 2024/25 precept. The meeting was reminded that the council's precept is one of the lowest in North Somerset and will remain so even with the increase proposed.

Any other business. The Clerk would write to Bristol Airport reminding them of their promise to remove litter in and around Felton. The Clerk would write to NSC asking for an update on timescales for replenishment of grit bins and would request a delivery update for Old Hill. The red lines surrounding the airport were now fading. The Clerk would write to NSC requesting that this be rectified. The pavement along West Lane was unpassable in places due to mud, water and broken tarmac, and this presented a risk to pedestrians. The Clerk would report the matter to NSC to rectify the issue.

Parish Council News from Annemieke Waite, District Councillor

Dear All.

A few months ago, I shared my thoughts on our **draft Local Plan** and the **significant increase in housing numbers** that the government has set for us. As part of this, North Somerset Council needs to find space for nearly **9,000 extra new homes**.

After reviewing available land, planners have identified several key areas for development, including:

- Weston-super-Mare approx. 3,500 homes
- South West Bristol approx. 4,500 homes
- Nailsea and Backwell approx. 4,700 homes

Other areas are also being considered, and now the council wants to hear from you!

Why does this matter?

If you live in **Winford, Regil, or Felton**, you might think these plans don't directly affect you—but they do! Thousands of new homes mean **thousands more cars** on our roads, which are already under huge pressure, particularly on the **A370**, **A38** and all this traffic comes together at the **Gurney Roundabout** heading for the **Cumberland Basin** in Bristol. Add to that Bristol Airport's planned expansion to 15 million passengers, and we could be facing major gridlock, with even more drivers cutting through rural lanes.

Do we need more homes?

Absolutely. There's a real housing shortage, and new homes must be built. But this **must** go hand-in-hand with **better roads and public transport**, making it easier for everyone to travel in and out of Bristol. This isn't about wishful thinking – it's about smart, long-term planning. That means working closely with **Bristol City Council**, the **West of England Combined Authority**, and the **Airport**, to tackle these challenges together.

Have your say!

I know many of you care about protecting the **Green Belt**, and so do I. While we will do our best to do that, we also need creative solutions to build homes in the most **sensible and sustainable** locations.
