She enlisted in the Florida National Guard in January 1989 and was commissioned as a second lieutenant in December 1992. having completed her requirements from the Florida A&M University (FAMU) Army ROTC program and receiving a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from FAMU. Her assignments included 1035th Medical Detachment. Tallahassee, Florida: 708th Maintenance Company, Quincy, Florida: State

Headquarter, St. Augustine, Florida; 257th Transportation Battalion, Gainesville, Florida: and 387th TTOE, Tampa, Florida. brother was remembered in a ceremony in Monticello. (See below) She joined the American Legion Auxiliary in 2010 and gained an acute awareness of the unmet needs of female veterans. She began keeping a record of female veterans she'd meet and would send cards with lotterv tickets on the major holidays. Seeking ways to help women come together and socialize to share their common experiences she began hosting, "Female Veterans Reunions:" the first one held on November 19, 2019. The second reunion was held on Nov. 19. 2020. From these gatherings the group of women veterans grew and began meeting on a regular basis. In April 2021 the group voted on the name, "Women Veterans Unite," and in September 2021 the Articles of Incorporation formalized the organization. Muriel is excited to be an "honorary woman veteran," and remains

committed to watching her brainchild blossom. In her role as President of the 2nd district American Legion Auxiliary, she continues to recruit new members and educate the public that women are veterans too.

To qualify: A consult for community care **massage** is from the primary care provider who needs to document 2 active therapies completed in the past 18 months or 1 active therapy and 3 Whole Health visits in the last 18 mos.

What are the active therapies at NF/SG VA:

Art Therapy, Battlefield acupuncture, cognitive behavior therapy for insomnia, exercise in the community, intervention pain clinic, meditation, Tele Move or nutritional referral, pain school, primary care pain clinic, PT/OT (not just one visit for equipment) Pool therapy, recreational therapy, smoking cessation, Tai Chi, Whole health coaching, yoga.

The focus of this program is for the veteran to take a proactive approach to augmenting the medical care with interventions that complement their care.
