An Update From Our Village Church, St. Thomas'...

Since the Easter Service in April 2026 St Thomas' Church has been relatively quiet preparing for the Services in the latter part of 2026.

Throckmorton Update

5000 houses at Throckmorton rejected, but the saga continues!

The Parish Council worked with a number of other local parish councils to oppose the proposed new town at Throckmorton. This would have had a devastating impact on the village and surrounding area. After over 3 years of work behind the scenes, we were delighted when the planning inspectors rejected Throckmorton in the local plan review.

This is not the end of the story unfortunately. The process of getting the South Worcestershire Development Plan approved took so long that it's up for renewal again. The South Worcestershire councils (including Wychavon) seem determined to allocate Throckmorton for mass development.

The major consultations are going to begin at some point, and the Parish Council will be ready to once again engage on your behalf. We would invite members of the Parish who have experience in matters such as planning to come forward when the time comes.

The Field

Fight back against dog poo!

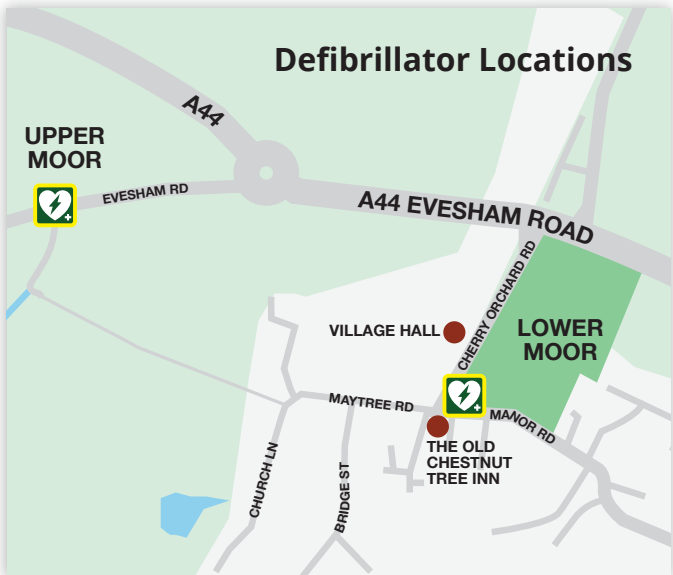
Our village is extremely fortunate to have a large, freely accessible village green and play area. However, at Parish Council meetings someone usually, and rightly, raises the issue of dog mess on the field. Wychavon are now running a public consultation on putting in place a Public Space Protection Order in respect of dog fouling – in simple terms, this would make it a criminal offence if someone failed to clear up after their dog, with a simplified enforcement process. The Parish Council hugely supports this plan. In order to make sure Hill & Moor is included in this, we need you to fill in the survey which can be found here:

Please provide as much detail as possible, to make it clear that dog mess is a particular problem in our village. We will be discussing our response to the survey at the next meeting.

In other news

- Worcestershire is being split into two unitary authorities, North and South Worcestershire. Your local county and district councils will therefore soon not exist;
- There are now two defibrillators in the parish, one in Lower Moor and one in Upper Moor, please see the map below;
- We are in the process of developing a biodiversity policy and would welcome your comments as to what steps we, as a Parish Council, can take to increase biodiversity. If you have any experience in the field of ecology, and would like to help us create this policy, please get in touch;



Grant Funding

A new process for applying for grants!

The Parish Council has adopted a new grant funding policy. This will allow the Parish Council to provide grants of money to appropriate causes. We will be accepting applications for grant funding in the new year. The application form is available on our website.

- We have commissioned a tree survey and we are pleased to say the trees are in fairly good condition. On the advice of the surveyor we will have a further survey in 28 months time. In the meantime, if you have any concerns about the trees or the field in general please email our clerk Carole.
