Carthage - After-Action Report by Captain James Robinson

14 July 2022

Notes on the 160th Anniversary Reenactment of the Battle of Carthage.

Unit sponsor, Robinson's Battery, Captain Jim Robinson commanding.

The reenactment hosted approximately 280 reenactors, plus a few that came too late or failed to register. The artillery was heavier on numbers compared to infantry. Powder bounties were a plus.

On both Union and Confederate sides, cavalry was light with only four Confederate horsemen showing.

Spectator numbers were a little vague though we were told there were approximately 1400

on Saturday and a near equal amount of 1200 on Sunday. The public was charged an entry fee of \$10 by the car load.

We formed the *Battle of Carthage Committee* which consisted of ten individuals. They put together the event in six months. While this was outstanding, having a year to plan would have been much better.

We were able to achieve this largely due to the following thing:

- We had a location that was used for reenactments in the past.
- The City of Carthage provided funding for various needs for the event

- We formed a budget and the funds were procured through tourism grants by the city, state, and a few private donors.

The MCWRA was a little weak on helping with registration, etc., but this was largely because we had only six months to get it together. The registration forms need revising. The people doing the registration had a hard time finding the people's information because the "name" is way down the page, ettc.

In my opinion, the MCWRA needs to be able to collect dues on-line.

The main thing we got from the MCWRA was insurance.

Collins Battery at Tipton, MO

Every year the little town of Tipton, Missouri, hosts an Independence Day event at the historic Maclay Home.

The building is located in the town of Tipton and was built in 1858 as a girls seminary. It closed when its owner left to join the secessionist forces of the Missouri State Guard.

Following these events, the building was used briefly as headquarters by General John Fremont during his preparations for pursuit of Price into southwest Missouri.

On 4 July the preservation group hosted its 40th Annual Ice Cream Social. Grilled hamburger and hot dog lunches were available for purchase along with ice cream and other home made deserts.



They also engaged in a short scenario where a group of Missouri State Guardsmen were hurled back by Union forces who defended the Maclay Home.

Other than the extreme heat, the event was a success. This has become a yearly event for Collins Battery as it is centrally located for our unit members and enables them to show off their gun and still be home in time for local Independence Day celebrations.
