The City's contractor, **Kenco Construction Ltd**, will be working on the water services and/or watermain in your area, which will require the **water supply to be shut-off to your property**. The water will be shut-off during the time noted above to complete the work.

WHAT TO DO DURING AND AFTER WATER SHUT



Water Service Disruption: Please make sure that all taps are closed, or in the off position, to avoid any flooding when your water supply is turned back on.

When your water supply is turned back on before you start using water, we recommend that you:

- Remove the aerator (screen) from your taps.
- Turn on your laundry tub tap (or the tap located nearest to your property's water meter/shut-off) and let the tap run for a minimum of 10 minutes.
- Turn on each cold water tap and let the water run for 5 minutes.
- Replace the aerator (screen) on your tap.

Temporary Water Shut-off

Contract # 19ECS-TI-102LR

Due to the watermain construction on your street, the City will need to temporarily shut-off the water service to your home. During the shut-off there will be no running water to your property / home.

Day: Sunday - Monday

Date: March 22, 2020 - March 23, 2020

Time: 8:00pm to 5:00am.

What to do before your water supply is shut-off:

1. Make sure all taps are closed or in the 'off' position and ensure that appliances that draw water (washers, dishwashers, etc.) are also turned off to avoid any flooding when your water supply is turned back on.
2. We recommend that you store some tap water in large containers (e.g. bathtub, buckets, jugs, pots) at least two hours before the shut-off time.
3. With pre-filled buckets, during the shut-off period you can flush a toilet and refill the toilet tank manually using one of the buckets.

What to do after your water supply is turned back on:

1. Turn on your laundry tub tap (or the tap located nearest to your property's water meter/shut-off) and let the tap run for a minimum of 10 minutes.
2. Turn on each cold-water tap and let the water run for 5 minutes.
