Our 2024 Summerhill Residents' Association Priorities and Results

1. TORONTO TRANSIT COMMISSION (TTC)

The TTC is upgrading Summerhill Station for accessibility, causing ongoing roadblocks and pedestrian safety concerns around the new entrance.

✓**Results:** *The SRA meets with the TTC monthly to address the above issues, minimize disruptions to the neighborhood, and to ensure the project stays on track for completion by the end of 2025.*

2. DEVELOPMENT

With many proposed and active projects in and around our area, we continue to actively monitor development, working closely with city planners to address local concerns.

✓**Results:** *The SRA is meeting with the city every 4–6 weeks, staying ahead of changes and advocating for thoughtful growth. We engage with developers to push for aesthetic improvements, lower heights, and reasonable density. As a founding member of FONTRA, a coalition of 30+ North Toronto residents' associations, we remain a strong voice on planning, the Committee of Adjustment, and transportation.*

3. ENVIRONMENT, GREENSPACE & PARKS

The SRA collaborates with the Midtown Ravines Group and the Vale of Avoca Working Group to enhance ravine quality through stewardship and cleanups.

✓**Results:** *We have been working closely with Parks Toronto, reporting necessary repairs and services to keep our green spaces well-maintained.*

The SRA supported the creation and design of a new public parkette on Jackes Avenue. Additionally, the SRA is advocating with developers for the creation of a park between Woodlawn Avenue and Summerhill Avenue.

4. COMMUNITY SAFETY

The SRA remains committed to working with the City of Toronto, TTC, and Toronto Police to enhance neighborhood safety.

✓**Results:** *Over the past year, we have focussed on educating residents about crime prevention and keeping them informed of local incidents.*

This year, our AGM will feature a Toronto Police Constable and the founder of the Lawrence Park Neighborhood Watch. We also continue to participate in the 53 Division Community Police Liaison Committee. The SRA organized the offering of an in-home assessment by the Toronto Police to assess their home's security.

5. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The SRA is ramping up community initiatives to strengthen Summerhill's signature neighborly spirit!

✓**Results:** *In previous years, and continuing forward, we've hosted park and neighbourhood clean-ups. In 2024, we attended and contributed towards the Summerhill Fair, we treated the neighborhood to a back-to-school ice cream truck, and we took part in unveiling the new Yonge railway bridge mural. – More exciting events to come!*
