

Watermain Replacement under Little Park Driveway Rosehill Reservoir Rehabilitation

Contract #: 17ECS-MI-03WA
 Start Date: January 20, 2020
 End Date: Spring, 2021
**Timeline is weather dependent and subject to change.*

The City's Contractor will be excavating the driveway through Little Park from Summerhill Avenue to the Valve House starting Monday, January 20, 2020 to install a new watermain. The existing watermain has reached the end of its service life and the City is replacing the watermain in parallel with the Rosehill Reservoir Rehabilitation works to minimize disruption in the area.

Most of the perimeter park space will remain open for the community. After the watermain work is completed, this part of the hoarding will continue to stay erected as it would be a significant tripping hazard for pedestrians. Further rehabilitation and park installation activities in Little Park/Summerhill Entrance will be provided in a future notice. Water supply to property owners will not be impacted by this work.

- Tree Removals – See map below and page 2. A total of 5 trees are required for removal:
- Trees #1 and #4 were identified by Parks Urban Forestry staff in late Fall as dead
 - Trees #2 and #3 are in poor condition and will be removed as they would be significantly impacted by hoarding.
 - Tree #5 (page 2) requires removal in advance of constructing a deep underground dechlorination chamber located on the lower perimeter pathway. This chamber construction will begin in February.

WORK DETAILS

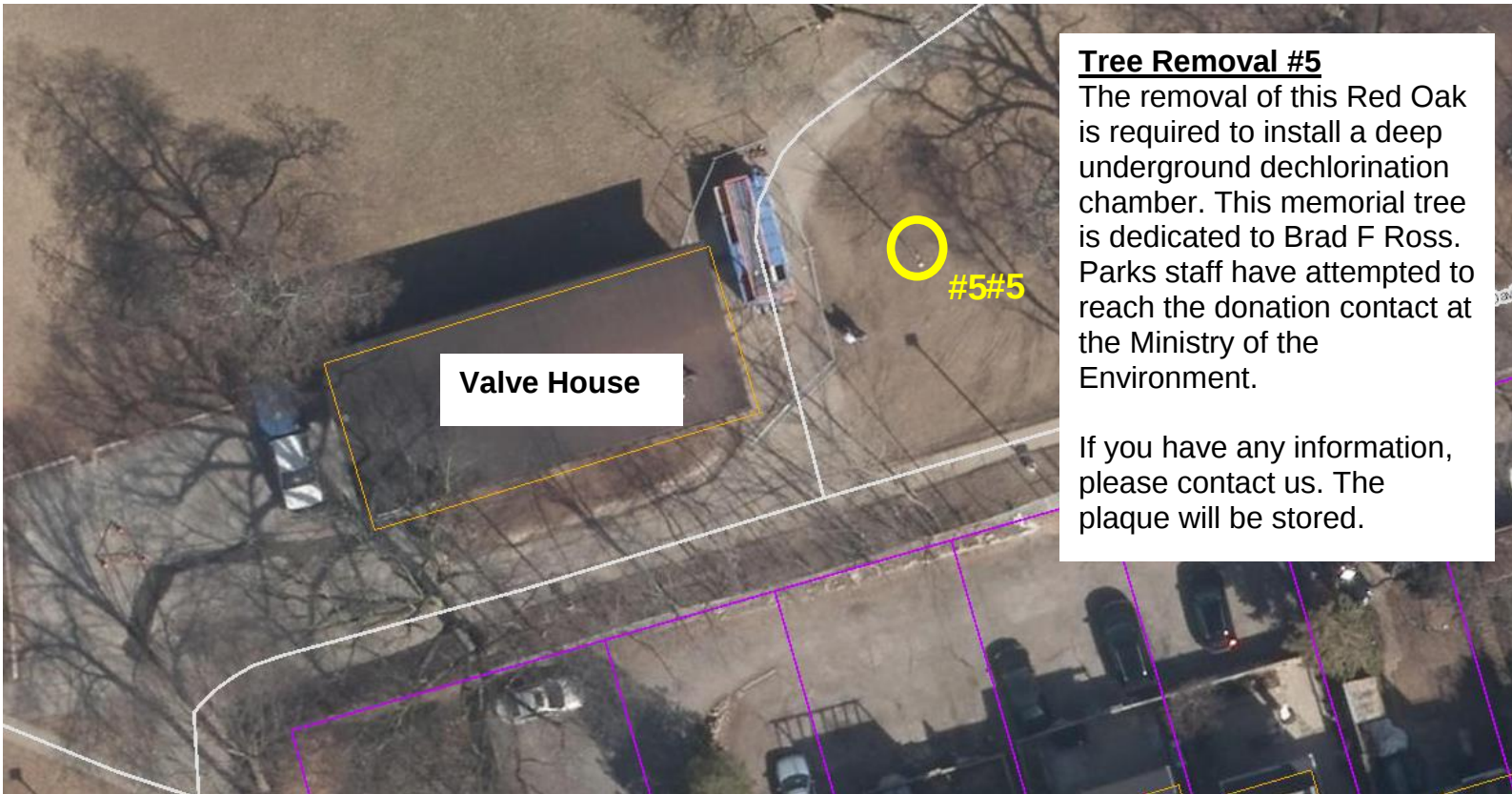
This work will involve:

- Removal of Trees #1-4 prior to installing the watermain hoarding (Tree #5 is already within park hoarding)
- Excavation of an open trench in the existing driveway to access and tie into the existing watermain
- Temporary gravel fill within the excavation. Watermain hoarding will remain until Phase 3 is determined and/or Spring 2021.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Work Hours: These hours are within the City's Noise By-law. Notification will be provided if extended hours are required. • Monday to Friday: 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. • Saturday: 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (if necessary)
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be sidewalk restrictions. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. The gates to this work zone will open onto the sidewalk on Summerhill. These gates will be opened infrequently and for a short period of time, but will impact sidewalk access. A flag person will be on hand to ensure pedestrians are safe during these times.
	Soil Removal: The existing soil adjacent to the driveway will be removed and replaced with new soil.
	Trees: The tree root excavation that took place in 2018 (Construction Update #2) was carried out to coordinate and minimize impacts to trees during the watermain work. Trees that are removed will be provided as part of the tree replacement plan. No memorial trees or benches are affected by the watermain work. Parks have attempted to contact the donation contact for Tree #5 dedicated to "Brad F Ross". Please contact us if you have any information.
	Little Park Features: The fountain and benches will be removed as part of the watermain work. The community bulletin board and library will be rotated away from the hoarding and continue to be accessible. The City's Contractor will determine if it can be protected within the hoarding or if it will require to be safely stored off-site. New benches and bulletin/lending library and the memorial stone will be replaced prior to Spring 2021.
	The contractor will be responsible for ensuring the work area is kept clean with sweeping and wetting of the site and on Rosehill and Avoca Avenues.
