

BCWS S100 Basic Fire Suppression and Fire Line Safety Course Syllabus

Overview

This course contains approximately 16 hours of in-person skills-based. The course prepares the student to become certified as a BC Type III Firefighter.

The fees for this program are payable in one singular tuition payment for the initial S100 training program, which includes the S185 module on fireline safety. There is a separate offering for the S100a annual refresher training, which is only 8 hours in duration. The pricing is as follows:

- S100 and S185: \$325.00
- S100a Annual Refresher: \$160.00

Prices do not include taxes

Course Prerequisites

- Legal Right to work in Canada
- Physical ability to perform firefighting duties (in accordance to the Doctors Physical Requirement Policy)
- English Language Proficiency (in accordance to the CFRC Language Proficiency Policy)
- Proof of age (minimum 18 years of age or parental consent)
- Standard First Aid and CPR Level C (or equivalent)

Outcome Objectives

After completing this course, the student will have met the British Columbia Wildfire Services (BCWS) minimum requirements for wildland fire suppression personnel. Topics covered include basic wildland fire organizational structure, wildfire behavior, fire suppression, and safety. Students who successfully complete the certification process will receive a BCWS S100 "Red Card".
