Does the university/college undertake personal safety audits on and around campus?	
How does the university/college vet prospective employees and contractors to ensure that they do not pose a risk to students?	
What procedures does the university/college have for ensuring that students with a history of perpetrating sexual violence are not able to enroll? 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Does the university/college partner local businesses to promote student safety?	e.g. The “Ask for Angela” poster campaign. More information is available here
Does the university/college ensure that personal safety information is provided to both new and returning students?	
Does the university/college provide sexual consent training?	
Does the university/college provide active bystander training	e.g. Alteristic’s Green Dot program.
Is peer-to-peer personal safety mentoring provided to new students?	
Are any special services provided to help students get back to their living accommodation safely at night	e.g. A “safe ride” program that provides students with a free alternative to walking home alone after dark.
