CARA Business Meeting March 27, 2025

The meeting was called to order by Bud - W1NSK at 7:38pm. There were 7 members present on Teams.

The Secretary report as presented in the CAPERS was accepted.

The Treasurer report as presented in CAPERS was accepted. John - W1JMA mentioned that the \$5k CD had matured and was reinvested at 4.1% for another 5 months. John mentioned that the insurance policies would be paid within a day or so.

Committee Reports:

Steve - W1SMS, repeater chair informed the group that the 220 machine is running at this QTH. A new base antenna for 220 was purchased. This purchase was under \$200 and approved by the

officers and board of directors in accordance with the by-laws.

Steve mentioned that Mark - N1MG, had worked on getting a 6-meter beacon running using one of the club's 756p3 and a voice keyer. Both the 220 and 6m will eventually be tested from the exit 2 site. It was mentioned that the club has a 6m antenna. It was discussed that the current 440 machine would be removed from the current site. The purpose is to retune it for 2M and be used for testing alternative 2M sites so we can vacate the current site as requested by the City of Danbury. This sparked a lengthy discussion on how to deal with the city and its arbitrary and capricious demand that we vacate the current site.

After discussion, it was proposed that Dan - W1QK and John - W1JGM would write a letter within the next 2 weeks for approval by the officers and board of directors to be made public via either newspaper or commercial radio to advocate to the city to allow us to remain at our current site.

Dan - W1QK, mentioned that the deadline for the April CAPERS is 4/3.

John - W1JGM, mentioned that there are 2 club members as students in our General Class along with another ham from Putnam County. The goal is to have the 3 take the General exam by June.

Steve, W1SMS, noted that there was nothing substantially new in relation to the Maker Space at exit 2.

The next club POTA is Saturday 4/19 at Squantz Pond at 10am. The March POTA was also held at Squantz Pond with 3 active stations on the air.

Field Day is June 28/29 this year. John, W1JGM will secure the Ball Pond FD for the site. There was discussion about replacing the 2 laptops we currently use and are Windows 10. It was decided to keep using the laptops for this coming field day and possibly replace with reconditioned laptops later in the year for winter FD once Windows 10 is abandoned by Microsoft. There was another lengthy discussion about moving the logging software to N3FJP and abandon N1MM. Both sides discussed the virtues of both applications and the straw poll had us remaining with N1MM. It was suggested we contact those who operate FD and ask their preference. Dan W1QK suggested that we really focus on sending the 10 traffic messages during FD. We can use SSB and WinLink to accomplish this task.

John, W1JGM mentioned that he needs help at the club table for the Southington Hamfest this Sunday. The club has obtained many donated items for sale and to date has generated over \$800. This will be this year's fund-raising event.

Old Business:

Bud mentioned that he has not received any feedback from the nominating committee. Bud thought all existing officers would run for another 2-year term and only the vacant Director position needed to be filled. John W1JMA, informed the group that he will not be seeking another 2-year term as secretary and treasurer. Nominations need to be completed by the May business meeting so we can put the slate to vote by email in early June. The officer year begins on 7/1.

Bud W1NSK, will again see if there is any interest in going to ARRL to operate W1AW during the NE QSO party first Sunday in May. To date there has been no interest. We did not do this last year due to lack of interest.

John W1JMA, mentioned that Ed KC1URY was going to borrow the other 756p3. Ed is getting his antenna and ground system ready.

New Business:

The April program meeting will be Tom Frenaye K1KI discussing the ARRL and his capacity as New England Director.

The May meeting will be Elmer Night. The June meeting will be Field Day prep. The next program meeting will be on Thursday April 10 at the Stony Hill FD.

The next business meeting will Thursday 4/24 on Teams at 7:30pm.

The meeting was closed at 9:13 pm.



Training may be required or desired to participate fully in ARES. Please inquire at the local level for specific information. Because ARES is an amateur radio program, only licensed radio amateurs are eligible for membership. The possession of emergency-powered equipment is desirable, but is not a requirement for membership.





Good Morning:

It was good to see so many people at the Southington Hamfest last Sunday. We had about thirty people attend the in-person ARES meeting. For those who could not make it I would like to summarize what was discussed.

We have had an active first quarter. At the state level we met with DEMHS Region 1 staff to inventory and test the radio equipment at their office in Bridgeport. Some antenna work had been done last year. Everything is working fine. We will meet again to update programming for their radios. I met with Bill Turner, the State EMD. Plans are being put together for renovations of the SEOC at the Armory in Hartford. Amateur radio will be part of the capabilities. I participated in regular meetings with FEMA Region 1 Comms staff and with the countrywide SEC group. Our SM Douglas, WA1SFH, presented a successful training session on net control operations with 40 people in attendance.

We have 680 people registered in the CT ARES membership database. Please review your record periodically to make sure it is up to date. 530 folks are subscribed to the CT ARES Groups.io Announce group. The weekly calendar message has been revised to better highlight the HF net on the first Sunday of the month. Changes have also been made to control message replies from going out to the entire group. There are only 212 people subscribed to the Alert group. The Alert group is designed for more important messages like those related to deployments. It is a subgroup of Announce. You must be subscribed to Announce to subscribe to Alert. Subscribe by sending an email to Alert+Subscribe@ct-ares.groups.io

ARRL has updated their emergency communications courses. Basic and Intermediate are available online now. Advanced will be released after revisions are made to CISA's AUXCOMM training. Everyone is encouraged to take these courses to update their knowledge base. The ARES Leadership course is in final review. It should be released this summer. This course will be the replacement for EC-016.

We are looking for leaders (DECs) in Region 1 and Region 4. Here is your chance to help CT ARES!

This past year we started a regular HF net, the first Sunday of the month. It takes place on 3965 kHz. We average about 20 check-ins. "When all else fails" HF will still be there. Many of you do not know that we actually test our HF capabilities every day at 1800 hours with the Connecticut Phone Net our section level NTS net. I would encourage all of you with HF privileges to become active on these nets.

Although we have 680 register members only a small number of those are "active". We have about 35 people checking in to the Sunday night nets. About the same number participated in WinLink Wednesday. There were 120 people who participate in the SET last October. I would like to encourage everyone to become more involved. Check in to nets, participate in Field Day and public service events, work on your Task book, take courses. This is how we exercise our capabilities and keep up to date.

Finally, I would like to congratulate the GBARC members for their hard work in getting their repeater linked to the KB1AEV system. We now have a good reach to the southwest. Thank you, folks,! Thanks also to Dana!
