Jason DeSousa from the CT National Guard gave a 60-minute presentation on the CT National Guard, including communications processes.

The CARA meeting minutes from May, printed in CAPERS, were accepted.

The CARA Treasurer's report as printed in CAPERS was accepted.

There were no nominations from the floor. A motion was made, seconded and approved for the secretary to cast the vote. Congratulations to the continuing leadership team.

Repeater Committee: Steve-W1SMS, informed the group that the repeaters are functioning properly. He requested an allocation of \$1000 for the purchase of a new 2m repeater antenna. A motion was made and seconded to allocate \$1000 for a 2m repeater antenna. Given there was not a proper quorum to vote on this expenditure over the \$500 threshold, a vote will be called by email to the membership by the secretary. The membership voted 30 to 1 for approval of the motion on June 17th.)

IT/Website Committee: Stephanie Fuda-KC1UCZ, reported that both the website and reflector are working well.

Jason DeSousa – Speaker Bio

I retired from the Connecticut State Police in 2018, after nearly 21 years of service. I've been a member of the Connecticut National Guard (CTNG) for 22 years, enlisting shortly after 9/11. I served two combat deployments to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom in learning experience for both new and 2006-2007 and again 2009-2010. I have also supported several stateside missions to include CTNG's Covid-19 response. I have held numerous assignments within the CTNG and am currently assigned as the J 5/7 (Plans, Training and Exercises) of the CTNG Joint Staff. We work with members of the CTNG (Army and Air National Guard) as well as local, state, federal, Non-Governmental Agencies and other service components. Our focus in the Joint Staff is to develop plans, training, and exercises in support of National Guard Civil Support Operations.

YOTA Camp Ham Shack Renamed for Bob Heil, K9EID, (SK)

The Youth on the Air
(YOTA) Camp "ham
shack" has been renamed
the Bob Heil, K9EID,
Memorial YOTA Camp
Amateur Radio Shack.



Heil, 83, passed away on February 28, 2024. He was considered the man who defined the sound of live rock 'n roll music and brought audio engineering principles into mainstream amateur radio use. He founded Heil Sound in 1966, through which he created the template for modern concert sound systems for musicians like the Grateful Dead, The Who, Joe Walsh, and Peter Frampton.

Heil was also known as a mentor and generous donor to amateur radio organizations who enjoyed helping others find success in ham radio and supported Youth on the Air from the very beginning.

Camp Director Neil Rapp, WB9VPG, said that when the camp first started, he asked Heil for Special QSL cards will be available for some equipment. "Bob sent us the radios we needed right away," said Rapp. "And when I asked for some additional radios with noise cancelling capability Heil responded '...have I ever told you no before?' and sent six more noise cancelling radios."

Rapp said he got the idea to rename the shack at the Dayton Hamvention® but left the final decision up to the YOTA kids. "It didn't take long, and there was never any question, that it was the right thing to do, "Rapp added.

Call for Nominations for ARRL Director and Vice Director

Attention: Full ARRL members in the Central, Hudson, New England, Northwestern, and Roanoke Divisions. You have the opportunity to choose a Director and Vice Director to represent you for a 3-year term beginning January 1, 2025.

ARRL is governed by its Board of Directors. A voting Director is chosen by ballot by the full (licensed) ARRL members in each of its 15 Divisions. Vice

Directors who serve in the absence of the Director at a Board meeting and succeed to the position of Director should a vacancy occur are chosen at the same time. Elections are held in five Divisions per year. It takes only 10 full members in a Division to nominate a candidate for either office.

Qualifications

The eligibility of nominees for the positions of ARRL Director and Vice Director will be reviewed by the Ethics & Elections Committee, composed of three Directors not subject to election this year: Mickey Baker, N4MB; Jeff Ryan, KØRM, and Scott Yonally, N8SY. A nominee must be at least 21 years old and must have been licensed and a full member of ARRL for a continuous term of at least 4 years immediately preceding nomination. Each nominee must provide information concerning their employment, ownership, investment interests, and other financial arrangements to ensure compliance the candidate and must bear the signatures with the Conflict of Interest Policy (see Article of 10 full members of the Division. 12 of the ARRL Articles of Association and Bylaws 18 - 24), available at www.arrl.org/general-information. The qualifications for Director and Vice Director are identical. All the powers of the Director are transferred to the Vice Director in the event of the Director's resignation, recall, removal outside the Division, inability to serve, or death.

Nomination Procedure

Step 1: Obtain official nominating petition forms. Starting July 1, any full member residing in a Division where there is an election may request an official nominating petition package in writing, either by letter or via email, to execadmin@arrl.org. The request must reach the ARRL Secretary no later than noon EDT on Friday, August 9, 2024. If you are seriously considering running or nominating someone to run, please don't wait until the last minute to request the forms; the deadline for submitting a completed petition form is just 1 week later.

Step 2: Complete the questionnaire and obtain signatures. Only the official form may be used. The candidate must complete page one, providing the information required to determine eligibility, certifying its accuracy, and agreeing to assume the office if elected. To be valid, a nominating petition must name

Step 3: Submit the petition form. The completed form must reach the Secretary no later than noon EDT on Friday, August 16, 2024. The submission may be made by electronic transmission of images (i.e., a PDF or JPEG attachment to an email) or facsimile provided that upon request, the original documents are received by the Secretary within 7 days of the request. A person who is nominated for both Director and Vice
Director may choose to decline the
nomination for Director; otherwise, the
nomination for Director will stand and that
for Vice Director will be void.

On Monday, August 19, 2024, the Secretary will notify each candidate of the name and call sign of each other candidate for the same office. Candidates will then have until Friday, August 30, 2024, to submit a 300-word statement and a photograph if they desire those to be made available to voters in accordance with instructions that will be supplied.

Balloting

If there is only one eligible candidate for an office, he or she will be declared elected by the Ethics & Elections Committee. If there is more than one eligible candidate for an office, the full members in that Division who are in good standing as of September 10, 2024, will have the opportunity to cast ballots. Official voting documents will be mailed to members who are eligible to vote no later than October 1, 2024. Votes must be electronically cast, or completed paper ballots must be received at the designated PO Box in the envelope provided, by noon Eastern Time on Friday, November 15, 2024. The candidate receiving the most votes will be declared the winner that day.

Absentee Ballots

A full member who is residing temporarily outside his or her home Division, including overseas, may arrange to vote in the home Division by notifying the Secretary before September 6, 2024, giving their current mailing address as reflected in the ARRL membership records (i.e., *QST* mailing address) and the reason that another Division is considered home. Members with overseas military addresses should take special note of this provision; in the absence of information received to the contrary, ballots will be sent to them based on their postal addresses.

stations will send their member-society abbreviations.

ARRL is taking steps to help manage what will likely be a huge influx of logs. We are requesting that if you have large uploads, perhaps from contests or from a DX-pedition, please wait a week or two before uploading to give LoTW® a chance to catch up. A process was implemented to reject logs with excessive duplicates. Please do not upload your entire log to "ensure" your contacts are in LoTW® as they will be rejected. Despite this request, we have seen several recent DXpeditions upload large log files and many

amateurs have uploaded logs with excessive duplicates. This negatively impacts the backlog time. Lastly, please do not call ARRL Headquarters to report issues you are having with LoTW®. 



PURPOSE

Members from North America and from Europe (starting in 2022) need 120 points for gold, 80 points for silver and 50 points for bronze. Members from other continents need 60 points for gold, 40 points for silver and 24 points for bronze. Policy and Procedure

Policy: CARA through generous donations of HF transceivers from members past and present, has several HF transceivers to lend to qualifying club members in good standing.

Procedure: The lend/lease program shall be adjudicated by the CARA Officers. Interested members please email your request to: Treasurer@w1qi.org.

- 1. Qualifying members may apply for an initial lease of 6 months.
 - a. Qualifying member definition
 - i. Current in Dues Payment
 - ii. General Class license or higher
 - iii. Member has ability and adequate real estate to install an HF antenna and proper ground system.
 - b. Members may apply for a second and final 3-month term.
 - i. No member shall have use of the transceiver for more than 9 consecutive months.
- 2. Prioritization Criteria for selection should we have multiple interested members:
 - a. First come first sever basis or
 - b. Member employed in Middle or High School Teaching setting.

i. Encouraged to start or help with an existing school club.

- 3. CARA will supply:
 - a. HF Transceiver
 - b. Power cord
 - c. PDF instruction Manual
- 4. Member will supply:
 - a. Power Supply- minimum 30amp
 - b. Microphone/Headset
 - c. Key/Keyer paddles.
 - d. Necessary cables to interface with member's computerized logbook/computer.
- 5. Members agree to send an ADIF log file or copy of paper log to the club secretary on the first day of each month for the previous month to prove the rig is being used. CARA secretary will confirm receipt of and report on the activity of the transceivers in lend/lease program.
 - a. CARA may ask for the return of the transceiver should it be determined it is not being used on a frequent basis.

ARRL and Momobeam Introduce Dual-band Beam Antenna for 6- and 10-Meters

ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® has a new product to help radio amateurs get active and on the air.

As Solar Cycle 25 continues to increase HF radio propagation on the upper bands, ARRL has partnered with the Italian antenna manufacturer Momobeam to design a dual band beam antenna to help take full advantage of the



exciting opportunities for distant contacts. The ARRL Dual-band Momobeam 6/10 Antenna is an easy-to-use antenna with a small footprint and a big reach. The beam features a 10-meter Moxon (28 MHz) and 6-meter Yagi (50 MHz).

At just over 10 pounds and with a turning radius of approximately 6.5 feet, the design is compact enough to fit places that otherwise wouldn't have space for a beam antenna. It comes with two sets of hardware for both permanent installation and portable use for temporary deployments such as 2024 ARRL Field Day or park activations.

The ARRL Dual-band Momobeam 6/10 Antenna is ideal for Technician-class operators to be able to work DX. "This is a great 'first' beam antenna for every ham," said ARRL Director of Marketing and Innovation Bob Inderbitzen, NQ1R. "If you've ever been intimidated by the prospect of owning a beam antenna, this one will allay your fears and give you a whole lot of fun. Radio clubs will want to add this beam to their deployment gear, as it's a great fit for field operating and special event stations. College radio clubs that don't have room for a large beam, or another beam, will enjoy adding this antenna for some gain on 6- and 10-meters. It is lightweight and can be turned with a simple TV rotator."



The 10-meter Moxon is an effective design for this dualband antenna, as it's around 30% smaller than a traditional Yagi and uses no traps or other shortening techniques that reduce performance. A Moxon antenna includes a number of antenna configurations that were referred to by Les Moxon, G6XN (SK), and have received attention over the years in *QST* and editions of *The ARRL Antenna Book*.

The feed system uses an open sleeve feed method, coupling the driven element of the 50 MHz section by proximity and length to the 10-meter driven element with minimal loss. "Just attach a single coaxial cable to included SO-239 equipped coaxial pigtail, and you're

ready to go on two bands!" said Inderbitzen.

The antenna debuted at the 2024 ARRL National Convention hosted at Dayton Hamvention® in May. The first run sold out at the show, but ARRL has taken delivery of more units, available now.

"It's surprising how few amateurs have experience with antennas beyond basic wire designs," said Inderbitzen. "Our interest in introducing this antenna is to increase the depth and breadth of knowledge and experience among our members." Inderbitzen added that members should watch for more content, including video tutorials, coming from ARRL about the antenna. More information about the antenna can be found



Interested in Amateur Radio? Being prepared in an emergency? Looking for and exciting hobby? Come visit the Candlewood Amateur Radio Association (CARA) t June 22-23 at the Ball Pond Vol Fire Co., in New Fairfield.

During the forth weekend of June every year, more than 40,000 hams throughout North America set up temporary transmitting stations in public places to demonstrate ham radio's science, skill and service to our nation. It combines public service, emergency preparedness, com-munity outreach, and technical skills all in a single event. Amateur Radio Field Day has been an annual event since 1933, and remains the

most popular event in amateur radio.

Despite the Internet, cell phones, email and modern communications, every year whole regions find themselves in the dark. Torna college. fires, storms, ice and even the occasional cutting of fiber optic cables leave people without the means to communicate. In these cases, the one consistent service that has never failed has been Amateur Radio. On the fourth weekend of June of each year, thousands of radio amateurs gather with their clubs, groups or simply with friends to operate from remote locations. Field Day ismany things; a picnic, a campout, practice for emergencies, an informal contest and, most of all, FUN! It is a time where many aspects of Amateur Radio come together to highlight our many roles. While some will treat it as a contest, other groups use the opportunity to practice their emergency response capabilities. It is an excellent opportunity to demonstrate Amateur Radio to the organizations that we might serve in an emergency, as well as the general public.

Field Day is the single most popular on-the-air event held annually in the US and Canada for amateur radio.

The contest part is simply to contact as many other stations as possible, the stations can be across town or anywhere in the world. We learn and practice operating our radio gear in abnormal situations and less than

optimal conditions. We use these same skills when we help with events such as marathons and bike-a-thons; fund-raisers such as walka-thons; celebrations such as parades; and exhibits at fairs, malls and museums — these are all large, preplanned, non-emergency activities. But despite the development of very complex, modern communications systems — or maybe because they ARE so complex — ham radio has been called into action again and again to provide communications in crises when it really matters. Amateur Radio people (also called "hams") are well known for our communications support in real disaster and post-disaster situations.

We will be available to demonstrate our skills and equipment Saturday June 22 from 2-6PM and from 10-2 on Sunday. No appointment needed; all are welcomed.

The Candlewood Amateur Radio Association is the Greater Danbury area's general interest amateur radio club. We focus on advancing technical knowledge, operating skills, fraternalism, and public service.
