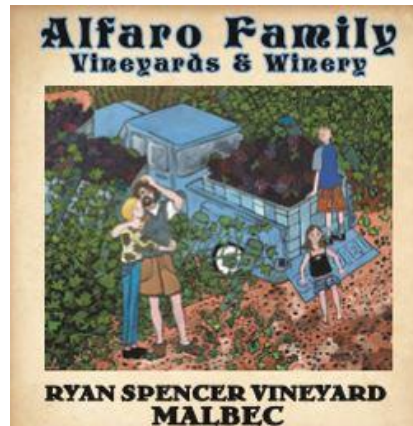


2017 Ryan Spencer Vineyard Estate Malbec



The Vineyard:

Ryan Spencer Vineyard, named after the Alfaro's son, was planted in 2001. It is comprised of seven acres broken into different blocks on a very steep hill between 450 and 800 feet in elevation. This Malbec comes from the tiny one acre “La Escalera” block, which is a terraced hillside area planted half to Malbec, and half to Hermitage clones of Syrah. The grapes were hand-harvested on September 22, 2017.

The Wine:

Malbec – a big, bold red wine grape best known in Argentina and France– is now grown around the world. Full-bodied, and inky purple in color, this wine has concentrated notes of black cherry, blackberry and plum with subtle undertones of fig, pepper and mocha.
