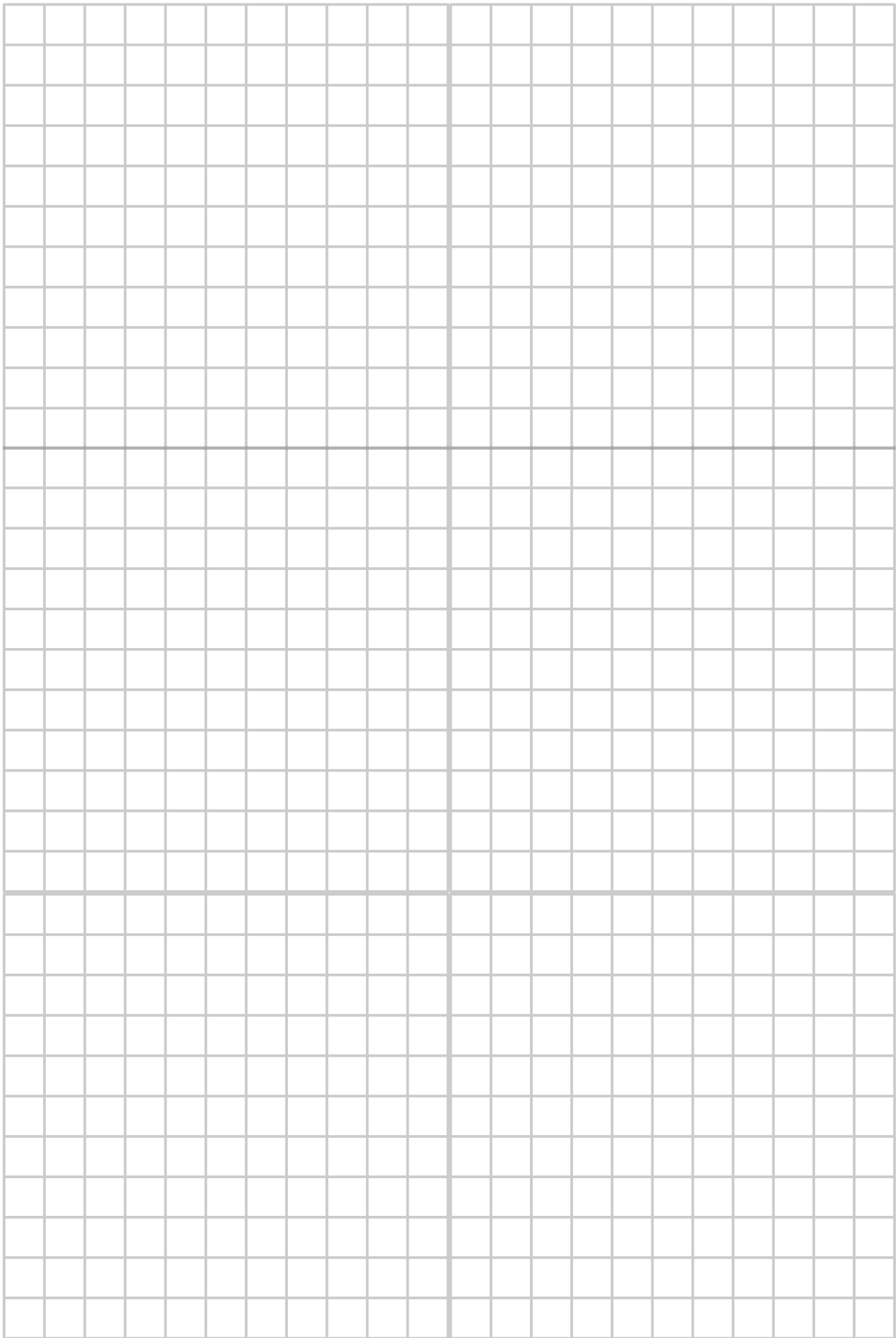


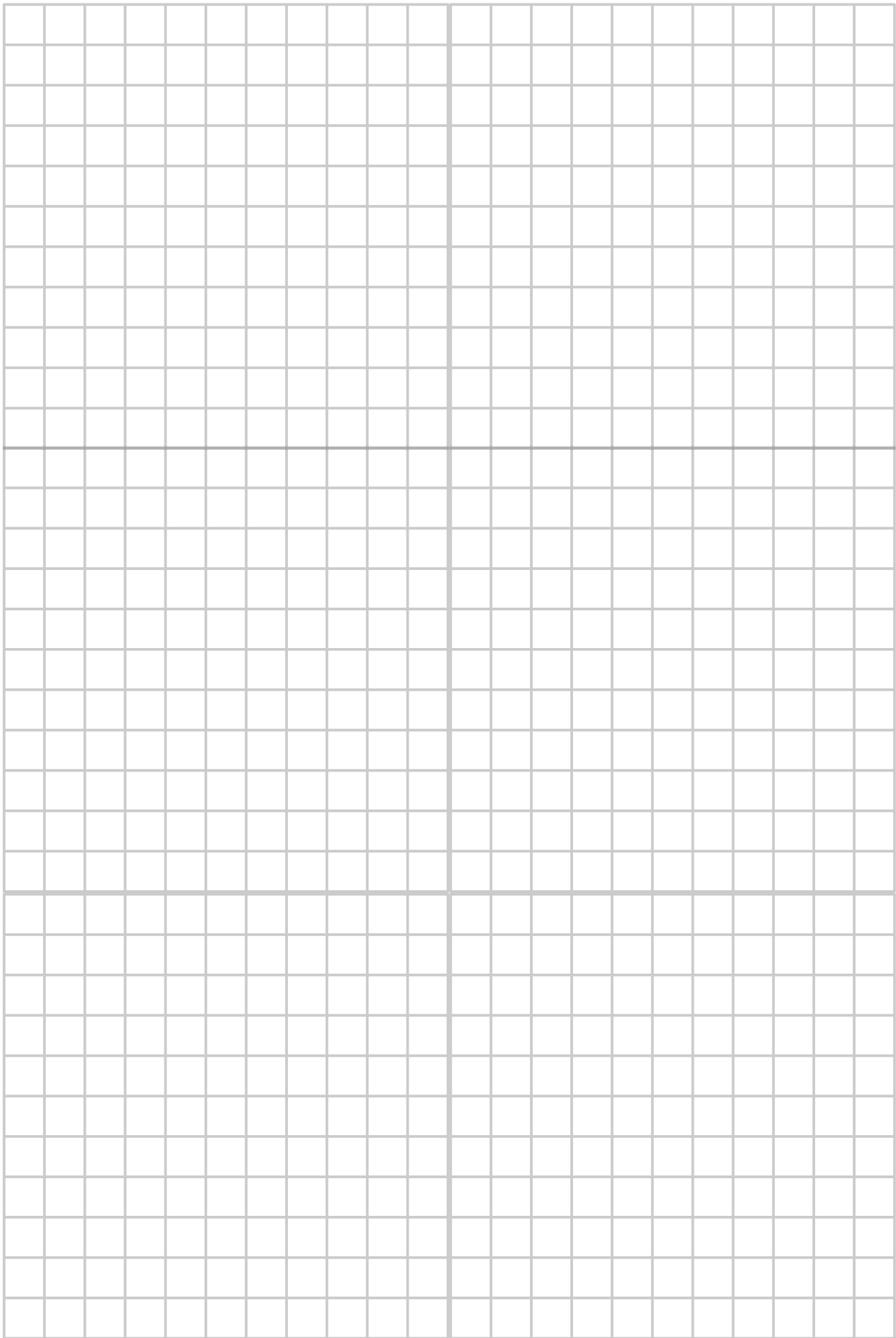
Interiors | The Rough Sketch
