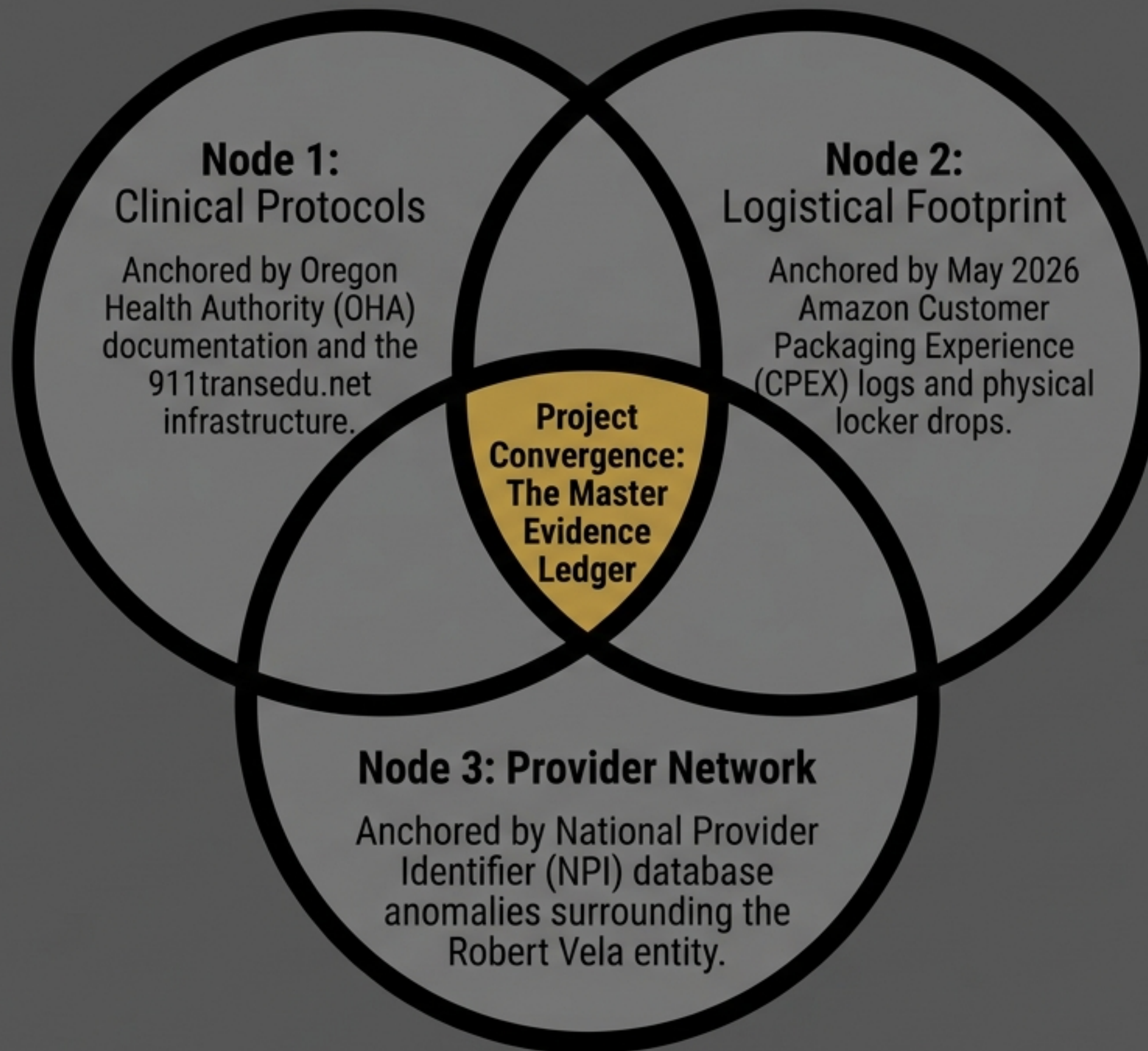

GENERAL APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:
Colleges, universities, and other educational institutions are not eligible to apply as a CE provider, CE community based organization, CE small business, or CE activity applicant type. (See OHA DEFINITIONS below).
CE provider, CE community based organization, and CE email business applicants must address all 4 domains and must receive OHA approval.
CE applicants must specify which domain(s) will be addressed, within a minimum of 2 criteria per domain for OHA approval.
Please make sure program information is relevant to Oregon's laws and administrative rules. For example, OARs related to: Health Care Interpreters (HCI), Traditional Health Workers (THWs)- which include: community health workers, doula, peer support specialist, etc.
Please confirm any necessary permissions when training includes videos, books, etc.
The completed application and all supporting documents must be submitted through the survey link.
The completed application must include Sections 1 through 6, with all necessary attachments. Every question in the application must be answered.
For attachments, there is a maximum 20-page limit: Applications exceeding 20 pages of attachments will NOT be reviewed. List any curriculum, outline, and handouts you would like reviewed by using the "Attachment Cover Page" on page 10. Attachments can include instructors' guides, student handbooks, lists of textbooks, evaluation form, and other instructional materials used.
Reference links can be included as supplemental information, but the committee will not automatically review the content in your reference links. If you use reference links and want the committee to review what is in the link, you must include this information within the 20 pages of attachments.

The 4-Domain Clinical Framework (T.T.P.A.)

DOMAIN I: Participant Self-Awareness

- Eliminating subconscious biases toward patients.
- Ruling out conditions based on assigned sex at birth rather than gender expression to prevent 'calling out'.

DOMAIN II: Participant Knowledge

- Recognizing cultural competence as a developmental, lifelong process.
- Identifying destination hospitals for specific surgical interventions (e.g., OHSU, Good Samaritan).

DOMAIN III: Participant Skills

- Utilizing targeted patient assessment tools.
- Adjusting diagnostic criteria based on intersex or assigned-at-birth status.

DOMAIN IV: Educational Approaches

- Self-directed learning utilizing trauma and medical slide decks.
- Provision of an in-field reference guide.
- 23-question terminal test requiring a 100% pass rate.

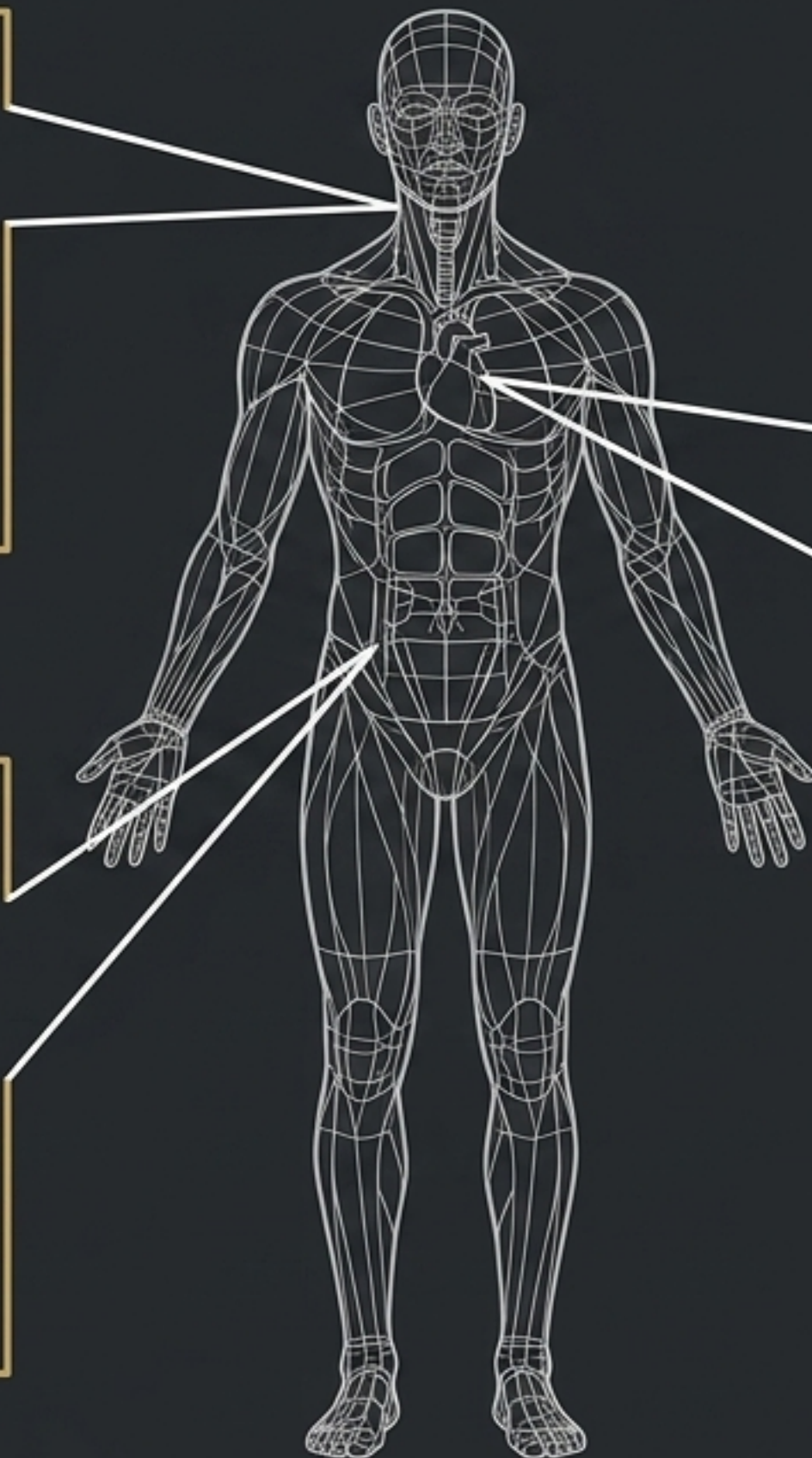
Targeted Medical Scenarios: Enforced Interventions

AIRWAY & CRANIAL PROTOCOLS

- **Tracheal Shave Complications:** Check for anterior commissure detachment/scar tissue. Mandates backup airway adjuncts.
- **Jaw Recontouring:** Requires pre-surgery NPA/OPA size knowledge for backup adjuncts.

TRAUMA & ABDOMINAL PROTOCOLS

- **Rule-Outs:** Mandated pregnancy rule-outs in trans men; testicular torsion rule-outs in trans women.
- **Physical Trauma Scans:** Specific instructions for checking priapism without removing tucking items in pre-operative females.

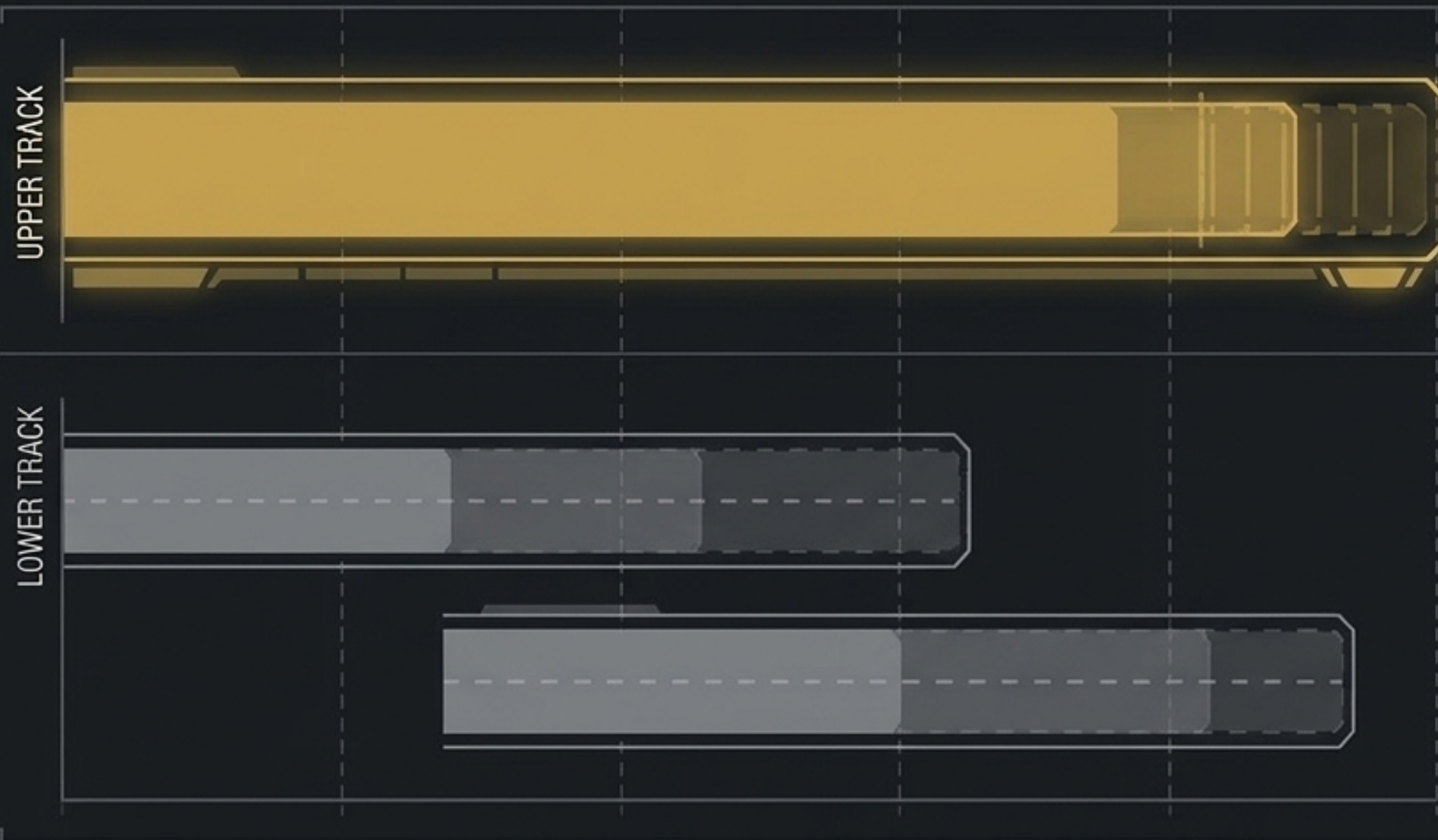


CARDIAC & DIAGNOSTIC PROTOCOLS

- **Cornell Voltage Criteria (LVH/STEMI):** R wave in AvL + S wave in V3.
- **Thresholds:** 20mm for Assigned Female at Birth (AFAB); 28mm for Assigned Male at Birth (AMAB).
- **Directive:** Use female setting for intersex patients.

THE E17 RIGID PROTOCOL

CODE: CPEX-xM9-E17-v01

MATERIAL: Corrugated / Rigid Box

SCAN VOLUME: 11 counts (High)

ROLE: Standardized control group.

THE FTP FLEXIBLE PROTOCOL

CODE: CPEX-xM8_R-FTP-v01

MATERIAL: Flexible poly-mailer / Non-rigid bag

SCAN VOLUME: 3 counts (Low/Anomalous)

ROLE: Targeted alternative packaging test.

LOGISTICAL VARIANCE DETECTED: Flexible test protocol (FTP) correlates directly with specific physical locker drop evidence in Sector OR.

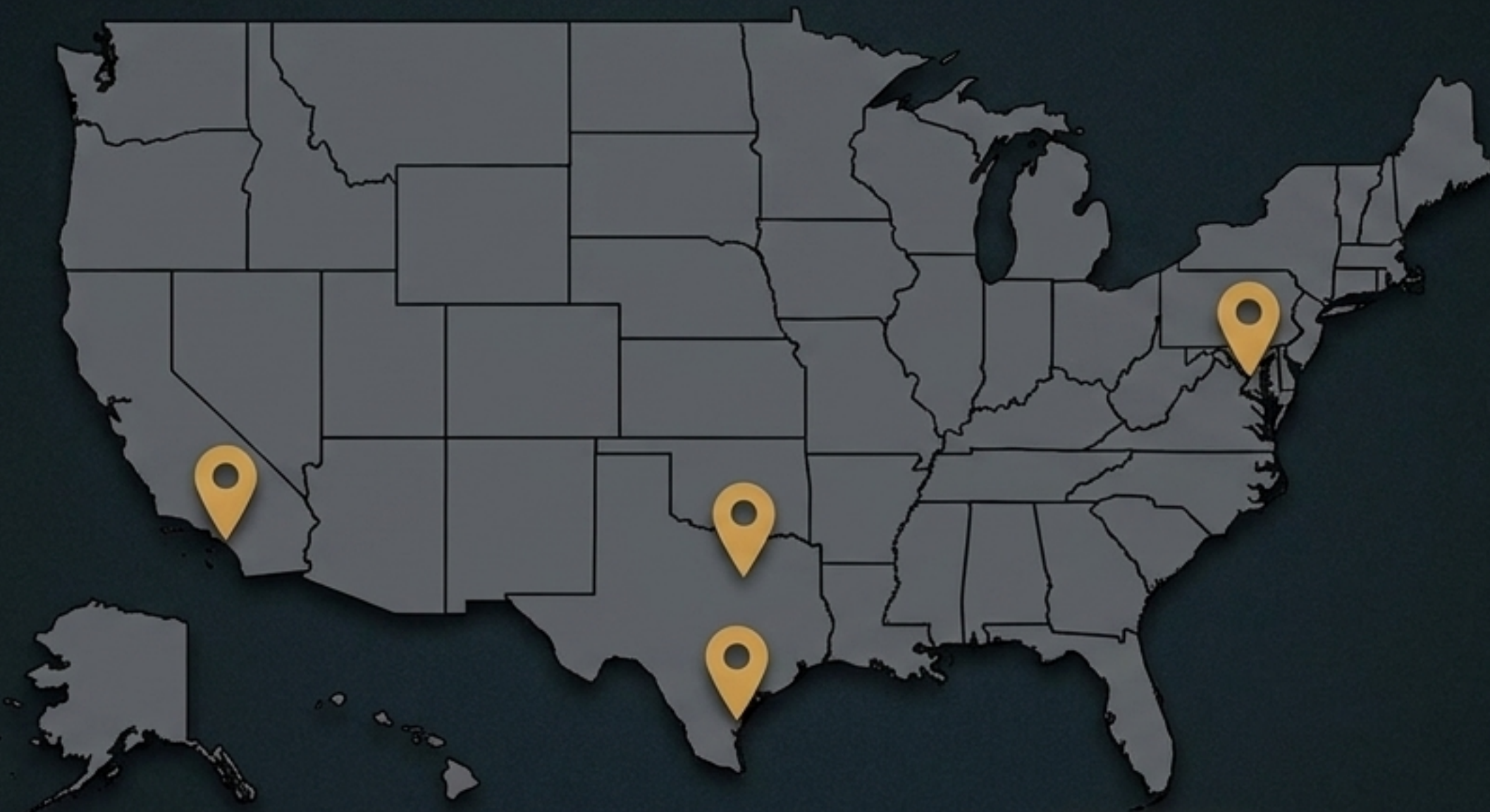

The NPI Anomaly: The 'Robert Vela' Entity



NPI records are designed to serve as unique identifiers. However, database extraction a fractured identity—multiple active providers utilizing the exact name 'Robert Vela,' spanning disparate geographic locations, enumeration dates, and medical taxonomies.

[**OBJECTIVE:** Map network nodes. Identify locational overlaps. Isolate primary vs. secondary identities.]
