

✓ PASTOR'S MESSAGE A

SEARCHING FOR THE TRUTH

When we talk about values, we often do not realize that most of the values that we live by today are rooted in the Bible: family, pride, dignity, integrity, kindness, and many others. They are also the natural consequences of us being created in the image and likeness of God. This is a key to understanding for who we are.

We can be an average person, living our daily lives, working, studying, consuming, spending, traveling, and so on. We can be one of the bad ones. However, my message is not about good and bad people. My message is about the differences between being average vs. higher, "elevated" people. Is it enough to be the first one, an average person, someone who lives exclusively for himself? Someone who lives for themselves can be lawful and harm no one. But again, is that enough? The reality is that most people fall into this category, and that is the reason sometimes evil prevails: people indifference, they don't care if something is not touching them personally. There is another category of people: those who say that they are doing good things, serving good causes and others, but the real motivation for their good deeds is their ego. Such people look for recognition and use their so-called service to gain something, like more income, a higher position, or connections. These are the sad realities that we cannot ignore; actually, we face them almost every day.

Thank God there is another reality, and that is the reality of goodness, which comes from God – a factor that people sometimes do not recognize. As long as people are doing good work with sincere intentions of serving others, even if they do not recognize or believe in God, their pure intentions and good deeds are still pleasing to God. Any goodness comes from God and is aimed at God. The issue is whether we are living for only ourselves or for others. We know Jesus' genius words: "Love your neighbor as yourself." He did not say do not love yourself. In fact, he said the opposite: love yourself. I know that you love yourself, and I have no problem with that, but here is the commitment:

love others as much as you love yourself. In reality, Jesus is saying something radical and difficult for us to comprehend. It is a different way of saying something else He is known to have said: "Treat others the same way you want them to treat you." This means, for instance, that if you are ready to fight for yourself until the end, then you have to do the same for someone else as well. We know that not everyone is capable of such behavior, but those who are capable are the ones who keep the balance in the issue of good and evil. They are the ones who do not allow evil to prevail completely. Today's North Korea is a clear example of a territory where there is almost complete dominance of evil. The Irish British stateman and political philosopher Edmund Burke said, "The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing." This is a key phrase to help us understand history. No matter how bad things are, there will always be good and brave people, heroes who will make a difference. These are the people who are inspired by high ideas of justice and freedom, people who have dignity and integrity. These people are inspired by God, and the Holy Spirit is within them. Some may recognize that and some not, but it does not matter; God talks and acts through such people.

However, it is not necessary that the question of choice between being an actively good person or being indifferent is connected only to global issues. All of us may face this in our everyday lives. The dilemma is what to do when we know what the truth is, but we may not want to say it because expressing the truth will conflict with the interests of people who have money or/and power. I believe everyone faces such challenges. What do we do in this case? Do we dare to say the truth, or say nothing and let it slip away? Thankfully, there are people who will. We know them, and although they suffer, in the end, such people gain more respect. Sometimes they pay a high price, like losing their jobs or positions of power. Even if they end up with nothing in this world, we know that they will be rewarded in eternal life: "Blessed are those who are persecuted

because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." - *Matthew 5:10*.

The question is, who are we in this crucial issue of living exclusively for ourselves and consequently being indifferent to others, or being proactive in approaching the truth, being outspoken, and showing sensitivity to others' needs. If we are not playing with God, then the second choice is a must.

Arax Chakoudian 1928 - 2025

ARAX CHARKOUDIAN OBITUARY

Arax Charkoudian passed away peacefully on January 9, 2025, in Springfield, MA. Born on August 26, 1928, in Springfield to the late Nishan and Azniv (Sanjian) Charkoudian, Arax lived a life defined by passion, service, and tribute to her Armenian-American heritage.

Arax was deeply independent and adventurous at a time when choices were limited for women. With a master's in education, Arax initially taught history all over the Northeast US, and taught English in Izmir, Turkey on a Fulbright scholarship. She later owned a greenhouse on the Connecticut River, growing chrysanthemums under half an acre of glass, and selling flowers all over New England.

Arax was a force for good, she served her community with dedication and steadfastness. As board chair of St. Gregory Armenian Apostolic Church, her leadership and organizational skills left a lasting impact.

She contributed significantly to Springfield's downtown neighborhood and led historic walking tours for the Springfield Museums. As a young adult Arax was an active member of Springfield's Sports Car Club driving zippy European cars like the Morris Minor, and later was active with the Smiths Ferry Women's Club, and Springfield's Metro Center Association.

Arax is predeceased by her parents and her sisters, Arppie Charkoudian and Kenar Charkoudian. She is survived by her brother Levon Charkoudian of Newton, MA; her niece Karoun Charkoudian of Springfield, MA; her nephew Deron Charkoudian and wife Meghan of New York, NY; her niece Lorig Charkoudian of Takoma Park, MD; her niece Nisha Simmons and husband John of Newton, MA; and many beloved grandnieces and grandnephews.
