Hard to believe, we know, but it's true; by the end of this month, we'll be in the Season of Advent!

Before we get too far into our discussion about November, we have to acknowledge what a great month October was! A fun and successful pasty-making event brought several Westminster folks together for chopping, rolling, filling, and baking nearly 600 tasty pasties. We were sold out by Friday of "pasty week," so we hope you got yours before they were all gone! Then on October 25th, we participated in a "Trunk or Treat" Halloween celebration up at Mike Lynch Ford; over 300 kids came to visit the various open "trunks" (OK, they were really open hatches, but whatever) in their Halloween finery. Hello dear friends!


