## **TOBY THE CHURCH DOG December 2025**

Specifically, we recognize the gifts of hope, peace, joy, and love; gifts that I endeavor to share with my loved ones year round. People around me hope that I will give them a kiss on the nose; and golly, how I can deliver that gift with speed and accuracy! Some folks don't even know that they need peace in their lives until they hear the beauty of my verbal stylings and marvel at my vocal chops! Joy; why I bring joy to others wherever I go!
