Help is Needed to Update our Elevator

New Safety Regulations: Last year the Building and Grounds Committee learned that our elevator must meet new safety provisions in the State of Michigan building code for a Door Lock Monitoring system. This system prevents the elevator door from opening unless the cab is in place, avoiding the danger of someone falling into an open elevator shaft. System installation is quite expensive, with bids coming in at approximately \$27,000. We have some funds available in our capital project account, but do not wish to completely drain that account. Therefore, our committee is seeking contributions from the congregation to support the new safety requirements.

Significance of the Elevator: Our older members increasingly rely on the elevator for access to church services and meetings. It is also crucial to the operations of the food pantry. Furthermore, the elevator helps when we host activities and meals in the fellowship hall. Furniture, supplies and equipment frequently move between floors via the elevator. Our elevator has become a basic necessity for church operations, so we need to keep it in working order and in compliance with the building code.

How to Contribute: Checks or cash donations can be dropped off or mailed to the church office or simply placed in the collection plate on Sunday. Please label your contribution "Elevator Update." Donations of any size, large or small, will be greatly appreciated. Assuming the availability of funds, installation of the required safety system is planned for the latter part of 2026. We will schedule the work around services and meetings to minimize disruption of church operations. Thanks for your consideration and support of this important project,


