JOHN PSARIS FUNERAL

On August 26, 2024, Chariots of Honor attended the funeral of John Psaris, who was a WWII veteran and served in the United States Army Air Corps from 1943 to 1945. Sgt. Psaris was a dedicated flight engineer on Boeing B-17 Flying Fortress, B-25 Mitchell, and B-29 Superfortress bombers, skillfully managing engines, fuel, aircraft maintenance, and even operating the top turret guns.

Last November 2023, Chariots of Honor honored Sgt. Psaris with a special procession for his 100th birthday and military service. And in April 2024, we collaborated with Virginia Delegate David Reid to present a Commending Resolution to Sgt. Psaris for his exceptional service to our country.


YOUNG MARINE (Y/M) MGYSGT JAYLEN
