The resurrection of Jesus isn't just a belief—it's the heartbeat of our hope. As **1 Corinthians 15:20** says, Christ is the firstfruits, meaning His victory over death is a promise of life for us too.

In **John 11:25**, Jesus says: "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die."

That's not just comfort—it's power. When the angel in **Matthew 28:6** said, "He is not here; He has risen," the world changed forever.

Weekly Sermon Reflection



1 Timothy 4:9-16

This past Sunday, Pastor Mark reminded us of something powerful—something we all needed to hear: "Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young." (1 Tim 4:12). That line alone hit me. It's so easy to feel like we're too young to make an impact. Like we have to wait until we're older, more experienced, or more "holy" before we can be taken seriously in our walk with Christ. But Paul shuts that down real quick. God isn't looking for age—He's looking for willing hearts. And when young people say "yes" to God? That's a movement waiting to happen. Paul goes on to say that we should set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, and in purity. That's not a small thing —it's a whole way of life. He's saying, don't just talk the talk, walk it out. Let your life preach before your words even do.

And here's the truth: the young people in the church aren't just the "future"—we are the church right now. The work God is doing through us today is just as powerful as what He will do tomorrow. So we can't be passive. We're being called to live intentionally, to grow our gifts, and to stay bold in our faith.

Pastor's message was a call to all of us—young or old—to stop underestimating what God can do through a faithful heart. Don't wait. Don't hold back. Keep your fire alive. Let your faith speak through your actions, your love shine through your words, and your purity be your strength in a world that tries to drown it out.

We've got something special, and if we keep walking in it—we'll change lives, including our own.
