Nikki McNatt earned the AAA 2011 Scholarship award for her dedication and promotion of the Appaloosa horse and her community service to the Arizona Appaloosa Association. The AAA Board of Directors selected Nikki based on her essay detailing what her Appaloosa means to her and how her club involvement has added to her life.

In her essay, Nikki shared the unique relationship she has with her 15 year old Appaloosa mare, Hershey's Special Kid, a.k.a., Scooter. Nikki described the first time she saw Scooter as a young filly. Her relationship with the filly did not start off as one of mutual admiration. Undaunted, Nikki learned to ride Scooter, eventually showing the mare in various events such as Western Pleasure, Showmanship and Hunter Under Saddle, moving on to barrels, poles, drill team, rodeo events and team sorting. Over time, Nikki and Scooter established a bond that is a pleasure to watch at rodeo, show or gymkhana events. Nikki recently accomplished a 1st place at the Maricopa County 4-H show in team sorting, out of

20+ teams. On top of her personal riding accomplishments, Nikki also performs community service for the Arizona Appaloosa Association running gates at shows, helping with AAA trail riding events, and teaching classes at her 4-H group. In November, Nikki gave a 4-H clinic on preparing a horse for carrying a flag.







Frank was an early support of the Arizona Appaloosa club, hosting the very first show in Prescott, Arizona. This very first show gathered together 33 Appaloosas!

The photo of Lucky Dott was not included in the original article. The AAA newsletter editor has taken license to add it here so everyone could see the sire of the foals shown. Lucky Dott was a half brother to Quanah.

On the next page, is the eulogy of Mabel Woodward printed in the March 1976 Appaloosa News. Mabel went on to be a Director of the ApHC. Again, the editor is impressed with the sheer tenacity of the individuals that founded our club.

ARIZONA APPALOOSA SHOW



Following is a report of what a small group started down here in Arizona. Some three years ago three men wanted to see the Appaloosa Breed of horse get some notice and so George Phippen, Jim Goodwine, and Harold Niday bought three Appaloosas. They have been in parades, rodeo entries for parades, one exhibition and now their own All-Appaloosa Horse Show. Phippen and Niday showed in the 12th National last June.

The Phippens have moved to Colorado, so cannot be active with us; the Goodwines moved to Wickenburg, so are still close enough; the Nidays still live in Prescott.

The Calizona Club have been nice to invite us in; but the distance out to California is to great for many folks in the northern part of Arizona and it seemed good to have a group organized centering around Tucson, Phoenix and Prescott.

In behalf of all owners and showers of horses at the First All-Appaloosa Horse Show, Friday, Sept. 18, a sincere "Thank-

You" is given for all interest, help and advertising. This cooperation helped to make our show a success and, we hope, a credit to the Yavapai County Fair.

May we share some facts and figures: 33 horses (incl. 19 studs) participated in 64 entries including 8 Halter and 4 Gymkhana events. They came from far and near - 1 stallion (already sold to a Phoenix breeder) from Texas; another from Gallup, N. M.; horses from Phoenix, Scottsdale, Wickenburg, Mayer, Cottonwood, Chino and Prescott. 43 ribbons and 4 trophies were presented.

Mabel Woodward Dies At 79

Mabel Strickland Woodward, a world champion rodeo performer, actress and member of the Cowboy Hall of Fame has died at the age of 79. She was also a former national director of the Appaloosa Horse Club.

Mrs. Woodward died Jan. 3 in a Phoenix hospital.

Mrs. Woodward, who lived in Buckeye, Ariz., the past 27 years, began a career of trick riding, calf roping and bronc riding as a 13-year-old school girl in her home town of Walla Walla, Wash.

She began her 25-year rodeo career in 1916. Six years later she won the all-around trophy at the Cheyenne, Wyo. rodeo.

Her movie career included appearances with Bing Crosby in "Rhythm on the Range" and several other westerns with Yakima Canutt.

On their ranch, the Woodwards raised Appaloosa horses.

She was inducted into the Cowboy Hall of Fame ten years ago.

(The following tribute to Mabel Strickland Woodward was written by W.M. Hutchinson).


It is given to very few people to become legends while they still live. When this happens, there are good reasons for it . . . reasons that are strong enough to overcome the natural human urge to treat lightly the accomplishments of competitors. In the case of Mabel Woodward, who contested under the name of Mabel Strickland, these reasons are beyond question.

She was the prettiest, most daring, most feminine contestant ever to enter a rodeo arena. More than this, she was a great lady and a gallant competitor.

Mabel's specialty was trick riding – drags, stands, all the standard stunts, plus her own feat of crawling completely under and around her mount while at a full gallop. She could rope better than a lot of the male contestants, and could put up a better-than-average bronc ride when the show demanded it.

One of her greatest crowd pleasers was jumping her horse over a parked

automobile, and, lest you have forgotten, cars were higher then than the four-wheeled water-bugs we use today.

She worked in Hollywood for many years – doubling for the stars who were not as pretty as was she nor not half so ladylike, and starring in her own serial. Wherever she went, whatever she did, she was surrounded by an aura of feminine daintiness and absolute integrity.




