Pastor Waylon Tyrone Knight

Rev. Waylon Knight is the son of Mrs. Mary Knight and the late Mr. Otis Knight. A native of Dublin, Georgia, he is a devoted member of Central Baptist Church, where Rev. Ellis A. Carswell serves as pastor. Over the years, Rev. Knight has faithfully served in numerous roles within the church, including choir member, teen Sunday School teacher, and administrative assistant to the pastor. In March 1996, he was ordained as a deacon. He was later licensed to preach the gospel on February 28, 2010, delivering his initial sermon titled "Issues" from Matthew 9:20.

Rev. Knight has been actively involved in both local and state conventions of the General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia. He has served as an instructor for youth and laymen's classes in the 1st Rehoboth Association. Notably, he also served as President and Director of the General Missionary Baptist Youth Convention of Georgia, becoming the longest-serving leader in the organization's history.

Educationally, Rev. Knight holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology from Georgia College in Milledgeville, Georgia, a Master of Science degree in School Guidance and Counseling from Fort Valley State University, and an Educational Specialist degree in Educational Leadership from Cambridge College. He has also completed coursework toward a doctorate in School Administration at the University of Southern Mississippi. Professionally, he currently serves as Assistant Principal at Lamar County Middle School.

On December 20, 2013, Rev. Knight was called to serve as the 11th pastor of West Mount Sinai Baptist Church and was officially installed on Sunday, February 16, 2014. His inaugural sermon, titled "Begin the Year with God: Lose the Weight," was taken from Hebrews 12:1–4.

Since his arrival at West Mount Sinai, Rev. Knight has led numerous initiatives and accomplishments that have contributed to the spiritual growth and edification of God's kingdom.




