Kitchen Update

A Message from Diana Barker, Co-President of Board of Directors

Redmond Senior Center will start the kitchen remodel in the Spring of 2023.

Dear RSC Members, Volunteers, and Friends: I'm sure you've heard the great news that Deschutes County and the City of Redmond have each made sizable contributions so that we can remodel our kitchen and bring it up to date. This will allow our kitchen staff to be more creative and reach out into the community with our meal program.

Some of the money is coming from the Federal government, so there are a LOT of regulations about how it will be spent. After over a year and a half of inching our way through the process required, we're getting very close to the finish line - which will actually be the starting line for us.

I'm estimating that sometime between April 15 and May 1, construction will begin. There are many variables, but I'm hoping everything will be all put back together within 60 days.....although I'm probably being over optimistic. This is a MAJOR remodel - the kitchen will actually be completely dismantled and useless for our day to day use during this period of time. We are finalizing arrangements to be able to cook offsite for Meals on Wheels and congregate lunches.

We will try to establish a relationship with the contractors early on to have them accommodate us as much as possible - but it needs to be a priority to get them in and finished as quickly as possible. We don't want to get in their way any more than necessary.


