

Betty Bottoni worked in production control, in the disk pack control center.

Warren Christopherson was one of the first employees hired at the then new IBM lab at 99 Notre Dame in 1952. He worked on RAMAC and later assignments included small systems technology and the Los Gatos lab. He had served in the military during world War II.

Dan Cicairos was a chemist in the lab and in manufacturing during his 30 year IBM career. He had previously served in the US Navy.

Mike De Santis had a 35 year IBM career in engineering and sales, working directly with customers.

Dick Field was a buyer and a purchasing manager in manufacturing. He had a 35 year IBM career after having served in the US Army.

Bob Huddleston joined IBM in New York as a programmer, then transferred to Palo Alto in the 1970's, where he worked in IMS software development. He retired in 2000 from Santa Teresa/Silicon Valley lab.

Dino Kubiak was a manager in the disk area.

Gloria LeBleu worked in the disk area in building 004.

Ron Lindsay had a 30 year career in Raleigh and was living in San Jose in his retirement.

Bill McDonnal began his 37 year IBM career as a salesman, sales manager and sales executive but was called to San Jose to lead the BART fare transaction facility effort, then in difficulty, and which became a success under his leadership. He later led direct access storage product development, and finally development at ROLM. He had served in the US Navy late in World War II.

DeWayn Meek worked in production control and later in facilities planning and engineering.

Fred Oehm had a 37 year career as a field service engineer, beginning in the DC area, later moving here to work on various aspects of field engineering support for the products of IBM San Jose. He had previously served in the US Army Air Corps.

Claire Rankin had a 37 year career with IBM in San Jose. She was a programmer and one of her assignments was in systems support for IBM Global Storage.

Ken Schreiner began his 33 year IBM career in 1951 when he joined the IBM research lab in Yorktown Heights, where he was a director of logic design. In 1961 he transferred to the Los Gatos lab where he was a project manager in advanced information retrieval technology until his retirement in 1984. Prior to joining IBM, beginning in 1942, he held a staff position at MIT working to develop radar technologies then needed in World War II.

George Stephens was a design engineer in electronics in the lab. One of his projects was the 3370/75 program, NFP. He had previously served in the US Navy as a radio operator on a P3 airplane during the early days of the Vietnam war.

Larry Sullivan began his IBM programming career in Poughkeepsie in the early 1970's. He transferred to Tucson and worked on the first release of DBRC (Data Base Recovery Control) bringing it to the Santa Teresa/Silicon Valley lab in the late 1970's. He remained at STL/SVL, specializing in IMS, for the remainder of his IBM career.

Robert Taylor worked at South 10th Street for about 10 years before transferring to the Cotle Road site where he worked in maintenance in building 5 and later was a maintenance supervisor in building 7. He was proud to be a second generation IBMer.

ONCE every 10 YEARS **OBERAMMERGUA – ‘PASSION PLAY’** **w/SWITZERLAND and the Alpine Countries tour**

We start our tour in the Vienna and visit the Schoenbrunn Palace, and the impressive St. Stephens Cathedral. We will take a picturesque cruise down the Danube and visit the Milk Abbey. We then continue to Salzburg to enjoy an amazing Mozart Dinner concert at the centuries old St. Peters Restaurant. We now head for Oberammergau with a stop in Munich where we visit the town square and see the world famous Glockenspiel. Later we arrive in the quaint village of Oberammergau. The next day we witness the famous Passion Play that dates back to 1643 and is performed every 10 years. The next day our journey takes us to King Ludwigs Neuschwanstein Castle as we head for our overnight stay in the Black Forest, known for artists that create authentic Cuckoo Clocks, Hummels and wood carvings. Now we are off to the lovely mountain village of Zermatt. On our way we will visit the most photographed castle in the world, Chateau de Chillon, located on the lovely lake Geneva. We will take a train through the Alps to arrive at Zermatt. As we leave the Alpine village of Zermatt, we take a train through the lovely Grimsel Pass as we head for the “Swiss Paradise on the lake” Lucerne. In Lucerne you will have time to shop, take pictures, walk the famous bridge and visit Lucerne’s old town. Tonight you will enjoy a farewell dinner featuring local specialties as we toast our memorable trip.

The cost of this 13 day tour, including AIR, is 6,999.00, double occupancy.
