IBM History

The Computing-Tabulating-Recording Company, the precursor to IBM, was founded on June 16, 1911. At its beginning, it was a merger of three manufacturing businesses, a product of the times orchestrated by the financier, Charles Flint. From these humble beginnings sprang the company that Thomas Watson Sr. would mold into a global force in technology, management and culture.

In 1911, biplanes dotted the air and Ford Model Ts appeared in the streets. Forward-thinking people wired their homes for electricity and installed their first telephones. In a Belfast shipyard, workers were finishing the hull of the biggest passenger ship ever, the *Titanic*. The booming US economy was creating a new hunger for information. There was a need to keep track, to understand and to inform.

Into that milieu stepped financier Charles Ranlett Flint. He worked out of an office on Broad Street, just off New York's Wall Street, and invested in shipbuilding, munitions, rubber, starch and the production of caramel. By the early 1900s, Flint had become friends with Theodore Roosevelt, William McKinley, Orville Wright, Andrew Carnegie and other giants of politics and business.

Starting in 1900, Flint attempted to build a number of trusts by merging several small companies to create one dominant player.


One of these trusts was in time clocks—the kind factory workers would punch on the way in and out of work. The clocks helped employers keep track of hours worked and hourly wages. Flint took a number of companies that made recording time clocks, including the time recording business of Bundy Manufacturing in Binghamton, NY, rolled all the companies into one and called it International Time Recording Co. (ITR).

"I had the leisure to turn to a field which has since interested me more than any other one—that is, the consolidation of corporations, the forming of what used to be known as 'trusts.' I have been called 'the father of trusts,' although sometimes I think I have been more nearly in the relation of godfather."

Carl Biesen had a 33 year IBM Career. In 1987 he was working in mechanical integration in building 5. He served in the US Army prior to joining IBM.

Bob De Noris worked several jobs at IBM and advanced to the position of lab technician in waste water treatment. He retired after serving 30 years with the company.

Lynn Heesch had a 34 year IBM career in test engineering and product test. In retirement he was living in Roseville.

Len Procker was an industrial engineer who had a number of senior level positions in IBM and ROLM plant management. He began his IBM career in New York before transferring to San Jose. He had responsibility for 3370/75 HDA manufacturing in building 50. He went to ROLM in the 1980's, then returned to Cottle Road where 1987 he was the assistant plant manager.

Frank Rose was a financial analyst who rose to the level of division controller during his 35 year IBM career. He also taught during this time and was an Adjunct Professor at Santa Clara University for over 35 years.

Magical China a Wondrous Adventure

Experience the mysteries of this ancient culture and immerse yourself in its amazing breathtaking country
May 2020 - 16 days (exact date tbd)

Fly first to Beijing and spend two nights exploring the Forbidden City the imperial place for China from the Ming Dynasty to the end of the Qing Dynasty, a period of 500 years, climb the Great Wall of China and explore the Summer Palace, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Begin your day with a tai chi lesson as we sail the dramatic Xiling Gorge the longest section of the Three Gorges. Discover the state-of-the-art site; The Three Gorges Dam. Next day we will enjoy a remote ride in Pea Boats up the Shennv Stream. Return to our ship as we sail the Wu Gorge with its 12 forest-covered peaks. On to the dramatic cliffs that surround the Qutang Gorge. We will arrive at Shibaozhai (Precious Stone Fortress) with its 9 story red pagoda, at the top a picture perfect view of the river and surrounding countryside. Disembark in the mountain city of Chongqing and travel to Chengdu. The teahouse culture and leisurely lifestyle makes this city so captivating. In Chengdu we will visit the Giant Panda Breeding Research Base. On to Shanghai. We will take the super-fast Maglev train into central Shanghai and that evening be amazed at a Chinese acrobatics show. The next day we will explore Old Town, visit the magnificent Shanghai Museum. Explore the "Bund" which runs along the Huangpu River. You will have the opportunity of POST NIGHT addition to Hong Kong with its awe-inspiring skyline. Explore the famous Stanley Market and seaside village bazaar, visit Aberdeen Fishing Village. On to Macau the "Vegas of China". We are Still finalizing price for the basic trip and the Post Trip. Should have final costs available by February 2019. Estimate pricing for the basic 16 day tour should be around \$5500. CULTURAL TREASURES OF..... JAPAN

October 6-19, 2019

Our tour begins in the amazing city of Tokyo. While here we will visit the Imperial Palace, Niju Bridge and Sakurada Gardens. Our climb of the famous Tokyo tower will give us a amazing view of the city from high above. Throughout this tour we will explore ancient and modern Japanese Culture firsthand. Now on to the lakeside resort of Hakone, renowned for its hot springs. Take a ride on the Hakone Ropeway, an aerial cable car, for breathtaking views of Mt. Fuji. Next we cruise the deep blue waters of Lake Ashi, with epic mountains views. Today we journey to Takayama, where visit Matsumoto Castle. Next, step back in time in the rural Edo-period town of Takayama, nestled in the Japanese Alps. We will visit a 200-year-old sake brewery and later, a 600 year old open air market along the Miyagawa River. On our travels today to Kanazawa, we visit Shirakawa-go, with its gassho-zukuri-style houses with their thatched-rooftops. Our next stay is in Kyoto where we find more than 2000 temple and shrines. We Kinkakuji, the Golden Pavilion, a zen temple with two floors that are completely covered in gold leaf. We will also visit the Gion district, with its narrow lanes of teahouses. We now travel to Kyoto where we board the Shinkansen bullet train for Hiroshima. On this adventure we take a ferry to Miyajima Island to see the iconic Torii gate and the Itsukushima Shrine that appears to float on water. Now we are on the bullet train back to Kyoto. Today we tour Nijo Castle and later we get a lesson in the art of Japanese stenciling. We end our tour with a special kaiseki farewell dinner and Geisha show.

The cost of this amazing 14 Day tour is 6399.00 which includes hotel, air, air taxes, included tours, transfers and our roundtrip flight, out of SFO.
