My suggestion: Ask the reunion host hotel for a second smaller hospitality room for ADULTS ONLY. Now that alcohol *and* marijuana are legal in many states, new ways must be found to accommodate those who choose to indulge. On the other hand, since children of all ages attend the reunion, activities that make some parents uncomfortable should not be encouraged.

One way to cover costs for the Adults Only room would be to charge a fee to those who intend to indulge. It can cover the cost if you cannot negotiate a second comped room. Keep in mind: hotels are willing to negotiate depending on the size and length of your reunion. Be armed with your projection for the number of room nights for your reunion and be specific about what you want.

You might also consider an ADULTS ONLY time in the hospitality room that everybody knows about in advance.
