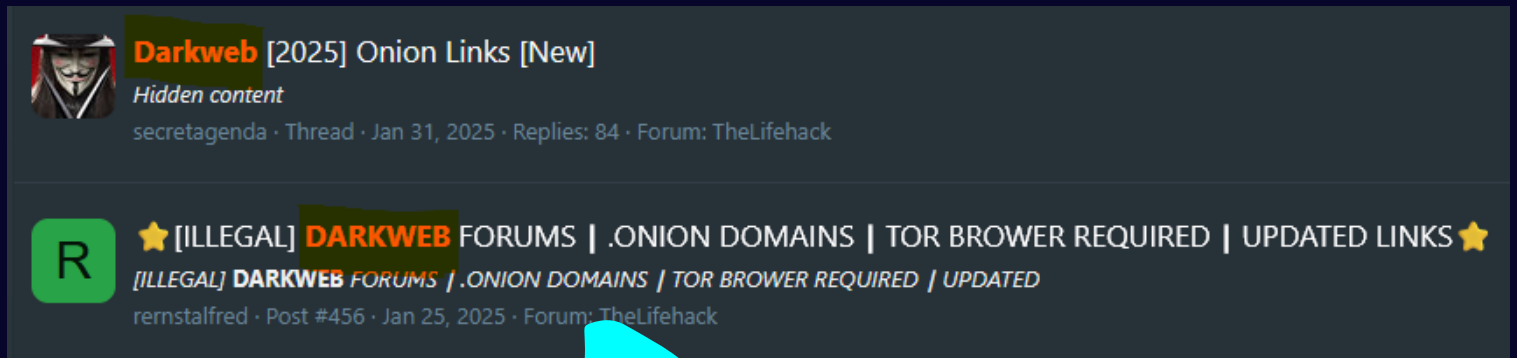
# ***DID YOU KNOW?***

**Most people think finding dark web forums is about knowing the right onion links.**

**But in reality? It's much more than onion links only, it's about comprehensive research, identifying chatter and discussions online too.**



Let's imagine you want to find discussions or chatter in an existing forum about other hidden links, new forums, or marketplaces.



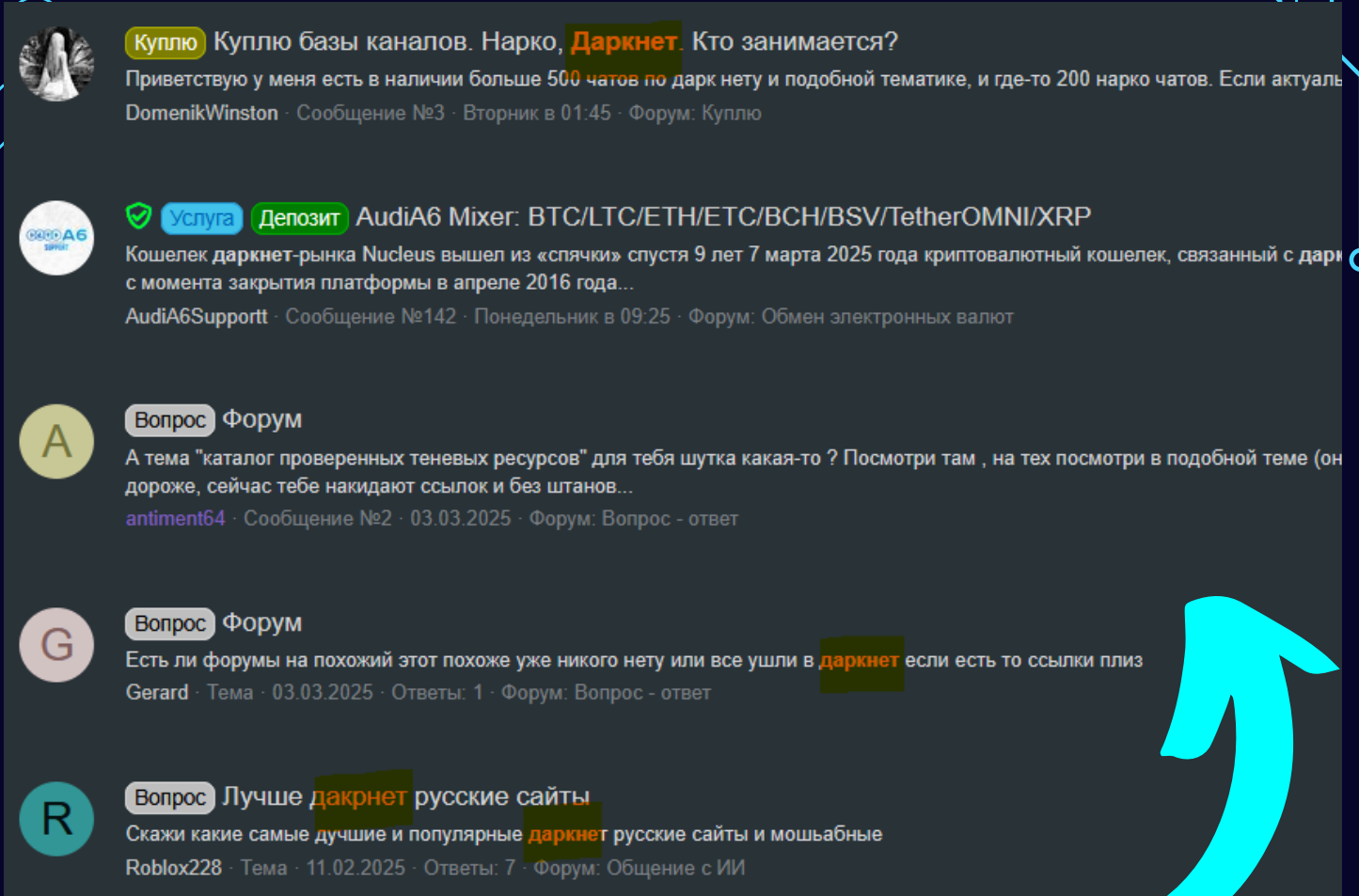
### Example 1:

✓ English: "dark web" / "deep web" / "hidden network"

One of the first things you need to do is identify the type of source you're looking for:

- Dark web or clear web? Are these discussions happening on open internet forums or hidden Tor sites?
- What kind of resource? Are you looking for markets, forums, chat platforms, or leaks?





### Example 2:

✓ Russian forums:

"даркнет" / "тёмная сеть"

Other variations:

"дарквеб" (phonetic Russian spelling), "darknet leaks", "dark forums", "Onion"



Once you know where and what you're searching for, the next step is expanding your keyword strategy.

🔍 **Here's the mistake most people make:** They search for only one version of a keyword. For example, if you want to find mentions of new dark web forums, you might search "dark web" or "darknet"—but that's not enough.



# WHY IT WORKS

Because different users refer to the same thing in different ways.

Try variations based on language, slang, and alternative spellings to maximize results and minimize blind spots.

✓ Russian forums might use "даркнет", "тёмная сеть", or phonetic spellings like "дарквеб".

✓ English terms include "dark web", "deep web", "hidden network", or even "dark forums".

✓ Other communities may use nicknames or abbreviations that are region-specific.

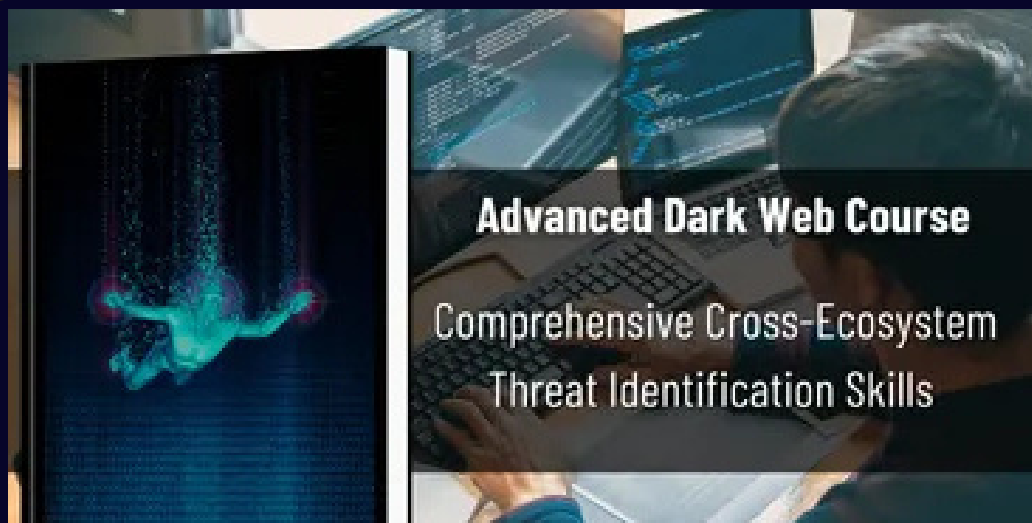
◆ Expanding your keyword search = More leads, more sources, and better intelligence.
