- You have met NDIS Accees.Before your first meeting
- Before your first meeting ensure you have given some thought to your goals and supports you will require to achieve those goals.
- Collate supporting documents ie. Allied Health, Medical or Psychologist reports.
- Look at putting together a Carer Impact Statement.

This process takes into account multiple factors and can potentially not yield the outcomes you were hoping for. It is important to know that there is a clear process you can follow in the event that the funding you have received is not sufficient or appropriate.

NDIS Plan Does not reflect your needs

What is missing?

- Make sure that you have a good understanding of the funding in your plan and what you can use it for.
- Identify what additional funding you will require to achieve your goals.
- Ensure that you have reports and/or statements which will support your funding needs.
- If required, seek out the support of an Advocate who can support you through this process.

Internal Review of a Decision

- Complete an Application for a Review of a Reviewable Decision within 3 months of your plan start.
- Outline why you want the decision reviewed and how it has affected you.
- Be sure to provide any additional information and evidence.

Still dissatisfied?

- If you are unhappy with the NDIS review decision you can apply for an Administrative Appeals Tribunal (AAT) independent review.
- You have 28 days to apply for an AAT review, from the date NDIA has issued their review decision.
- You cannot ask the AAT to review a decision until the NDIA has completed its reviewew process.
