We processed 250 referrals in Qtr 2 (April-June), a 20% growth from previous quarter. See pg 3 for more referral data.

FAMILY STORY - SUBMITTED BY STEARNS PHN DEZIRAE

Mom was a pregnant teen referred by a local community clinic. During our first visit together, mom's top priority was getting medical insurance so she could establish prenatal care. I assisted her in completing the application and calling a local OB clinic to schedule her first appointments. As I continued to meet with mom, we talked about other resources available – WIC, Elevate pregnancy resource center, Milestones, food shelves, SNAP/Cash Assistance – to name a few, in addition to our home visiting curriculum components. Mom also set a goal for herself to continue with her high school education. She decided the best way to do this was to enroll at an ALC. This transition went well for her.

A month before her due date, mom moved across county lines into Sherburne County. Thanks to our First Steps collaborative and funding, I was able to continue working with mom across county lines. Mom was grateful to not have to transition to a different nurse during a time of so many other transitions in her life. Mom delivered a healthy baby and things were going very well at home and school.

Near her 6 week postpartum check-up, mom discovered she was pregnant again. With this pregnancy she reached out right away to her clinic to establish early prenatal care. She delivered her second child and transitioned home as a young mother of two.

She modified her education goal after conversations with her Career Solutions worker and decided to pursue her GED. She recently attended a career fair and sat in on a session about becoming a Registered Nurse. Mom said she feels called to work in labor and delivery after her experience of becoming a teen parent. She wants to help other young moms in their pregnancy and parenting journeys find the support they need and not feel judged along the way.



World Breastfeeding Week was

We often hear about the benefits of breastfeeding for baby. Babies that are breastfed have a reduced risk of ear infections, diarrhea, SIDS, obesity, Type 1 and 2 diabetes, asthma and leukemia. Did you know that breastfeeding is beneficial for the parent as well?

Parents who breastfeed have a reduced risk for:

- bregst cancer
- · ovarian cancer
- · type 2 diabetes
- postpartym depression

The current recommendation from the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends exclusive breastfeeding for about the first six months. They also support continued breastfeeding after solid foods are introduced as long as you and your baby desire, for 2 years or beyond.



we know the longer q parent breastfeeds the more benefits for both parent and baby.

To help support breastfeeding, workplace protections for parents were recently expanded requiring nursing and lactating employees to receive paid break time to express milk at work.



Minnesota has very strong laws protecting families.

Minnesota law requires employers to provide breastfeeding parents with reasonable break time to express milk and a private room or other location for milk expression, other than a bathroom or toilet stall, with access to an electrical outlet and in close proximity to the employee's workspace.
